

just for God to destroy Man for our rebellion. Yet, because God is love, He sent His Son, Jesus, to be born in the likeness of sinful flesh and to offer up His perfect life as an atonement for sin. Jesus "entered once for all into the holy places, not by the means of the blood of goats and calves but by the means of His own blood, thus securing an eternal redemption" (Heb. 9:12). The blood of Jesus makes a way for sinful man to be reconciled to a holy, perfect, just, and righteous God.

The letter to the Hebrews speaks volumes about this topic and I recommend you to read the whole book, particularly chapters 8-10. It tells us that most of what we read of in the Old Testament were shadows. The tabernacle, temple, priests, animals, laws, ceremonies, festivals. All of it. They were all a shadow of the Substance, which is Christ Jesus. Christ is the true substance. The law was the shadow of the good things to come. Looking at the shadow gives a glimpse of the true form. Yet, it is not the true substance. It is only a shadow, cast by the true substance. The shadow points to the truth. And if you follow the shadow to the end, you'll find the substance. In this case, the substance is Christ Jesus, who came into the world to save sinners and redeem people for God from every tribe, tongue, nation, and people group. Christ made atonement with His own blood. But why did Jesus die for sins? God is holy, perfect, righteous, and just. Therefore, He cannot allow the guilty to go unpunished. The Scriptures say that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (Rm. 3:23). The Bible teaches plainly that our sin has made us enemies of God. The punishment for sin is death (Rm 6:23) but because God is also love, "God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rm 5:8). God satisfied His justice in the death of Jesus the Christ, making a way for sinners to be made right with God in Christ (Rm. 5:10). The dilemma of how God can be both just and the justifier of the ungodly is resolved in Christ and Jesus' death for sin shows us God's CHARACTER!

JESUS' BLOOD SHED FOR OUR SALVATION

Part 1 Rev. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi

"Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins" Hebrews 9:22

The month of July is dedicated to the precious blood of Jesus that was shed for our salvation. BUT why all this? This is because life is in the blood (Lev. 17:11). In some cultures the shedding of blood has a negative connotation. Especially if we're not talking about blood shed due to injury. Shedding blood is thought of as cultish. Superstitious. This, however, was not the case in the time and culture of the Israelites. The Israelites and surrounding nations were familiar with blood sacrifices.

We recall why this incident of Jesus' shedding of his blood came about. Man was created by God. Then, Man rebelled against God, transgressing His commandments, living as if He has no law to live by. It would have been
