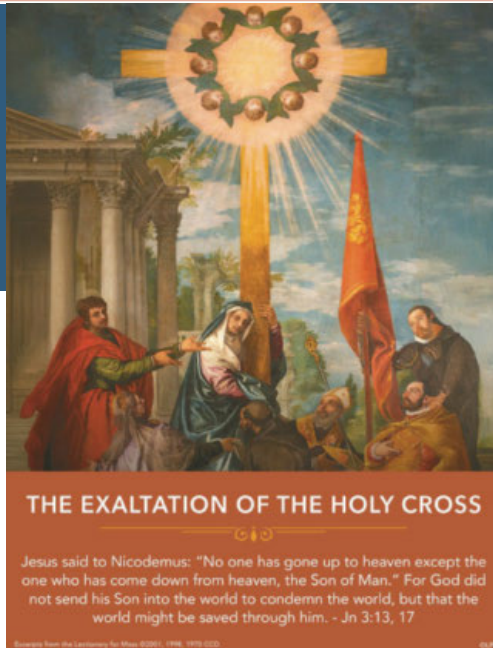

## LITURGICAL NOTES

Greetings and blessings on this weekend as we celebrate the Exaltation of the Holy Cross.

In 326AD, while on pilgrimage to Jerusalem, Saint Helena, the mother of Emperor Constantine, discovered the True Cross upon which our Lord gave His life. The Holy Cross was exalted for public veneration in 335, marking its central significance in the Christian faith. For centuries, Catholics and the Orthodox Church have celebrated this feast day on or around September 14th.

This feast celebrates The Holy Cross because it is the central symbol of our faith. However, the Cross is much more than a symbol. It is a reminder of God's love and mercy. God loves us so much that He sent his only begotten son to be crucified on the Cross for our sins. The Cross is a sign of love and hope, even though it was an instrument of death. By celebrating this feast, we honor the victory Jesus won for us through His death and resurrection.

This is a great time to reflect on what the Cross means to you in your own life.

# FROM THE LITURGY COORDINATOR



## The Mass

### Part IV

This week and next week we will focus on the third of the four parts of the Mass, **“The Liturgy of the Eucharist”**.

During Sunday Mass, the Liturgy of the Eucharist begins with the preparation of the gifts and preparing the altar. A part of preparing the gifts is to collect monetary gifts to support the Church and the care of the poor. While we await the collection and the gifts, those gathered are encouraged to sing with the choir as we rejoice and prepare our hearts in gratefulness and thankfulness. Also, while we await the gifts to be brought forward, the minister or altar servers prepare the Altar for the consecration of the bread and wine to become the body and blood of our Lord. Once the Altar is ready, and the gifts are received. The Priest (also called the Celebrant) blesses and praises God for these gifts and places them on the altar.

After the altar is prepared and everything is blessed, the Eucharistic Prayer begins. This prayer of thanksgiving is the heart of our Liturgy of the Eucharist. In this prayer, the celebrant acts *in persona Christi*, in the person of Christ as head of his body,

the Church. He gathers not only the bread and the wine, but the substance of our lives and joins them to Christ's perfect sacrifice, offering all to the Father.

After a brief introductory dialogue, the celebrant begins the Preface. If you listen closely to the Preface, you will hear all the wonderful actions of God, both throughout history and in our lives today, giving thanks to God for all things. The Preface concludes with the *Sanctus* “Holy Holy Holy” in which we participate in the song of the angels giving praise to the Father in heaven (cf. Is 6:3).

The next major part of the Eucharistic Prayer is the *epiclesis*. In the *epiclesis*, the celebrant asks the our Father to send the His Holy Spirit on the gifts of bread and wine so that, through the power of the Holy Spirit, they may become the Body and Blood of Christ. This part of the prayer recalls the action of Jesus Christ on the night before his death, what we know as Holy Thursday. Jesus gathered his disciples for a last meal, took the simple bread and wine, blessed them, and gave them to his friends as his Body and Blood.

The Eucharistic Prayer continues with the *anamnesis*, literally, the “not forgetting.” The people proclaim the memorial acclamation, recalling the saving death and resurrection of the Lord. The prayer continues as the celebrant recalls the saving actions of God in Christ.

The next part of the prayer is the offering. In this part of the prayer, the priest joins the offering of this Mass to the perfect sacrifice that Jesus made on the cross. The priest also prays that the Holy Spirit may come upon the faithful and by receiving the body and blood of Christ, they themselves may become a living offering to God.

The Eucharistic Prayer concludes with the Final Doxology. The celebrant makes the prayer “Through Him, with Him, and in Him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit...” and presents it to God the Father. The assembly responds with the Great Amen, a joyous affirmation of our faith and participation in this great sacrifice of praise.

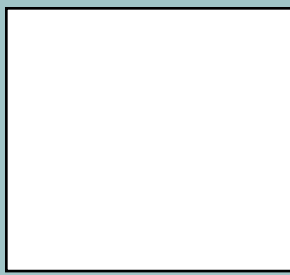



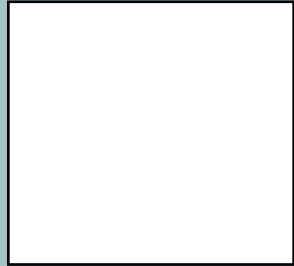
