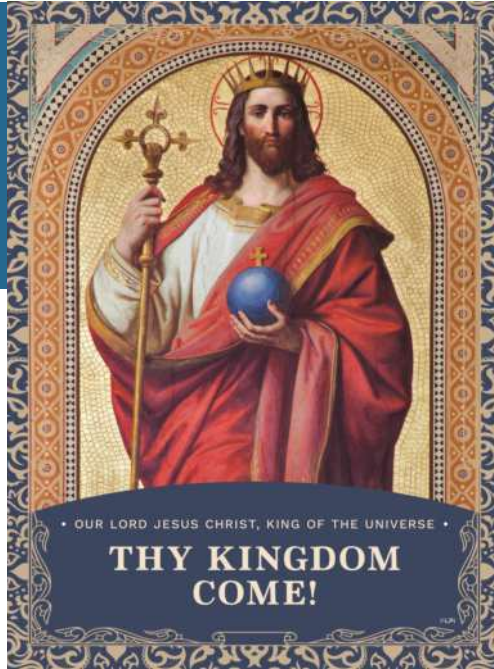

Adopt-A-Meal:

"Sharing Food, Faith, and Friendship"

Every Thursday, our soup kitchen opens its doors downtown to anyone who needs a meal—whether they come by bus, on foot, or with a friend who brings them along. Guests enjoy a hot, home-cooked lunch—perhaps a slice of quiche, a pasta-and-bean salad, fresh greens, and bread—plus soup, dessert, milk or water, and a bagged lunch to take for later.

Many guests express deep gratitude—not only for the food, but for the prayer and friendship that come with it. It's not uncommon for someone to ask, "Will you pray with me?" and find comfort in that shared moment of faith.

This ministry is made possible by your generosity—and now your gift goes twice as far.

A parishioner has pledged to match every donation up to \$15,000, so each dollar you give this month will be doubled to provide twice as many meals.

Our goal is to raise \$5,000 in matched gifts—providing several weeks of Thursday meals for our neighbors in need:

- \$1,000 → doubled to \$2,000 — Sponsors two full Thursday meals for about 90 guests each
- \$200 → doubled to \$400 — Provides 40 home-cooked lunches, covering a large table of guests
- \$20 → doubled to \$40 — Adopts two meals for neighbors in need

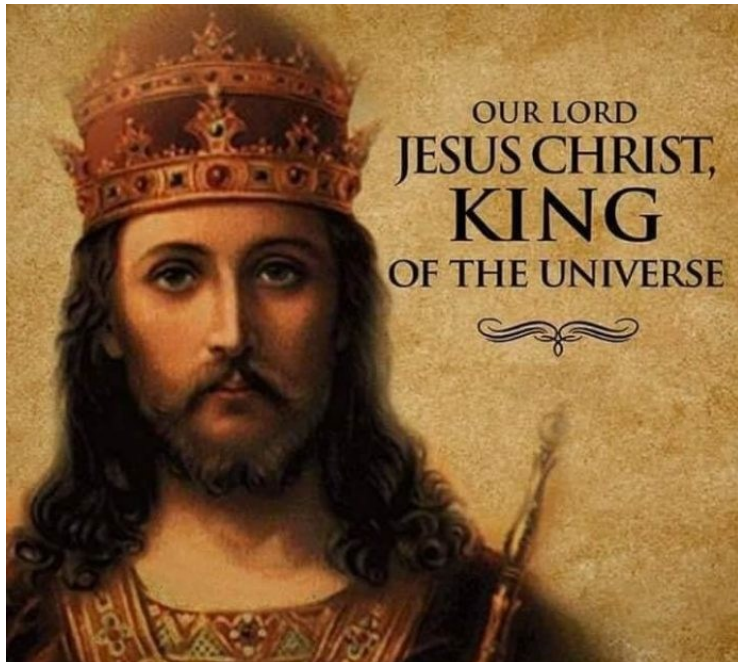

FROM THE LITURGY COORDINATOR



Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe “Christ the King”

On the last Sunday of each liturgical year, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, or Christ the King. This day is usually the Sunday before Thanksgiving.

In 1925, Pope Pius XI instituted this feast in his encyclical *Quas primas* (“In the first”). He instituted this Feast Day to respond to the growing secularism and atheism world. Pope Pius XI intended it to influence nations as well as individuals. Pope Pius XI argued that peace comes when societies recognize Christ’s authority. He did not do it to impose the faith but to help the faithful live their faith authentically. For instance, his emphasis on the dignity of all people counters injustice. The Catechism (CCC 1929-1933) addresses the importance of the common good, reflecting Christ’s vision. This feast challenges secular systems that reject moral absolutes. It proposes an alternative rooted in divine law. This vision remains a bold statement in today’s world. This solemnity reminds us that while governments come and go, Christ reigns as King forever.

The Church calls us to acknowledge Christ’s kingship with our whole lives. Christ should reign in our minds, in our wills, and more importantly, in our hearts. We make up the body of Christ and as such, He must reign in our bodies. We are to serve as instruments for the interior sanctification of our souls.

The Church acknowledges the reign of Christ, not only privately, but publicly. Unfortunately, today, religious freedom for many people means that we can believe whatever we want in private, but when we enter the public square or the marketplace, we may not speak of anything that relates to our faith. This solemnity encourages us to celebrate and live out our faith in public. Pope Pius XI emphasized that Christ’s reign includes individuals, families, and nations. No area of life is exempt from his lordship.

Celebrating Christ, the King is more than a liturgical event; it is a call to ACTION. We the faithful, are urged to live under Christ’s rule but in practical ways. How do we do this... Well, we follow His commandments and live by example. Our loyalty is to Christ, who takes precedence over all else in our lives. Our example and our witness should take on many forms. Our discipleship shapes our individual lives, our family lives, and our communities. By honoring Christ as king, we, the faithful commit to building his kingdom on earth. This call remains a cornerstone of the feast’s purpose.

The Feast of Christ the King proclaims that Christ’s authority extends over all creation. This universality is a key aspect of Catholic teaching. This message remains relevant in modern times, where secularism often separates religion from societal influence. The Church teaches that acknowledging Christ as king leads to a more just world. This belief is grounded in the conviction that his laws promote human dignity. The feast thus has both personal and communal dimensions.

The Feast also points to the end of time. We the faithful, believe that Christ will return to judge the living and the dead. (Matthew 25:31-46) As such, this feast has an eschatological focus, looking beyond the present. It reminds us of the Faithful, that earthly life is temporary. The Catechism (CCC 1038-1041) teaches that this judgment will reveal the truth of each person’s life. Christ’s kingship will then be fully manifest. This hope shapes how we the faithful live our lives today. This feast of Christ the King bridges the present reality with the eternal promise. It offers assurance of our Lord Jesus’ ultimate victory.

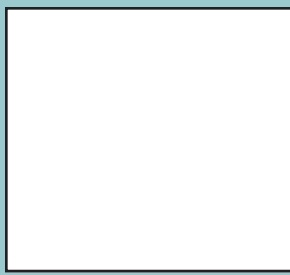
