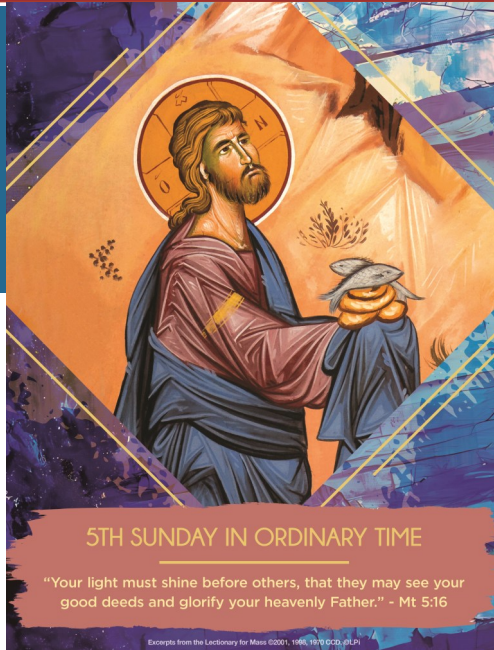

The month of February is dedicated to Holy Family. Please continue to pray for our Holy Comforter Parishioners and our families. Our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV monthly prayer intention is for children with incurable diseases. Let us pray that children suffering from incurable diseases and their families receive the necessary medical care and support, never losing strength and hope.

This week, we have a note from our Music Ministry.

Father Joseph Mary's vision for the music of the parish centers on having increased participation in the congregational singing, for it is through this active participation that we give a worthy offering of praise to the Lord. In particular, the communion hymn has been moved to take place after everybody has received communion. You are encouraged to join actively in singing this hymn, as it is our response of thanksgiving to God for the gift of the Eucharist. Similarly, immediately after the offertory antiphon is sung, we will begin the offertory hymn, which you are encouraged to join in singing, as we present our offerings to God with joy from our hearts.

Many people do not feel comfortable singing, but if the entire congregation participates, the sense of vitality of the Mass is greatly increased, and each person is able to actively give their personal praise to God.

As a related note, the church has recently acquired the rights to use hymns from the St. Michael Hymnal. This should increase the number of more familiar hymns, and expand the range of hymns for various Masses and liturgical seasons.

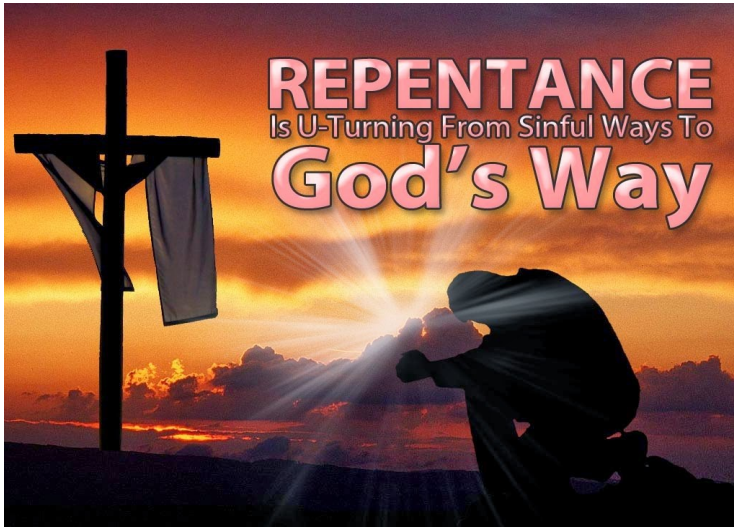

FROM THE PASTOR



Repent and Believe

Part III

“The time has come,” he said. “The kingdom of God has come near. Repent and believe the good news!”(Mk. 1:15).

In his famous psalm of repentance (Psalm 51), David reminds us that God does not delight so much in the outward signs of repentance (which included making a sacrifice), but “the sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise” (Ps.51:17). We are not talking about the shame and condemnation the enemy wants to heap on us, but a godly grief. It is the **COMPUNCTION** of heart, (Derived from the Latin *compungere* ("to pierce"), it is a gift from God that awakens the soul to its need for spiritual change. It is not a paralyzing, "woe-is-me" guilt, but a, "beneficial" wounding that purifies the heart.

We can be in the habit of going through the motions when it comes to repenting, but what I am trying to show is what we must consider to be the most important thing is the condition of our heart in relation to God. Does your repentance look like a heart that has been rent like a garment, broken and contrite as it beats before God? This attitude is missing from most repentance, and it's the very thing God is trying to teach us! It may sound strange, but how do we go about getting a broken heart?

First, we simply need to ask for it. True repentance, like all good things, is a gift of God, as Paul writes: “instructs believers to

gently correct opponents, rather than quarreling, in the hope that God will grant them repentance and knowledge of the truth” (2Tim. 2:25). If we want to obey the command to rend our hearts, we must ask God to grant us true repentance.

We must also be aware of one of the biggest hindrances to obtaining a broken heart: our neglect of the relational aspect of sinning. By this, I mean that we can view sin as a failure of performance rather than a failure of intimacy. The only grief we experience is disappointment in our inability to do what is right, and not that we have “despised” the living God: “Why did you despise the word of the LORD by doing what is evil in his eyes? You struck Uriah the Hittite with the sword and took his wife to be your own. You killed him with the sword of the Ammonites”(2Sam. 12:9).

When we sin, I would say we play the part of an adulterer who looks for satisfaction in another, rather than the only One who can satisfy. That is why David said to the Lord, “against you, you alone, have I sinned”(Ps.51:4). David rightly saw his failures in terms of relationship, and as a result his heart was grieved as it can be only when we have sinned against the One we love so much.

All in all, true repentance comes not merely by understanding the relational aspect of sin, but by understanding the nature of the One with whom we are in relationship. In other words, the more we see God as glorious and holy, the more we will see sin as something to weep over. Repentance is less about feeling bad over behavior, and more about feeling awe and delight towards God. The more glimpses we have of the glory of God, the more we mourn for scorning that glory. In the end, God's plan for us is that we will be holy as he is holy)(1Peter 1:16). He will surely do it! In the meantime, he desires brokenhearted people who have learned to mourn over their sin. Who have learned to see the awesomeness of the mercy of God and the misery we experience so that we can genuinely sing the **MAGNIFICAT**

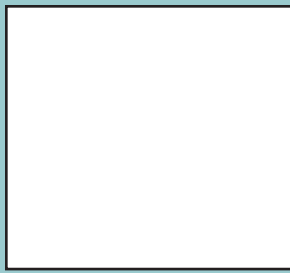

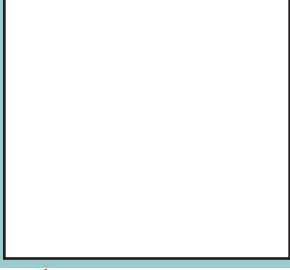
