Leadership and Teaching Authority of the Church

There are three levels of administration and teaching for the Church.

1. The Magisterium is the teaching authority of the Church. Members of the Magisterium are every bishop of the Church.
2. Curia. These are the heads of the offices of the Church, such as the Office of Propagation of the Faith or Divine Worship. They are the cardinals who curate, or care for and lead these offices. The Curia, along with all the cardinals of the Church have one other specific job and that is to elect a pope.
3. Pope. The Pope is the CEO of the Church; the Head of State.

Entonces hizo un látigo de cordeles y los echó del templo, con todo y sus ovejas y bueyes; a los cambistas les volcó las mesas y les tiró al suelo las monedas; y a los que vendían palomas les dijo: "Quiten todo de aquí y no conviertan en un mercado la casa de mi Padre".

En ese momento, sus discípulos se acordaron de lo que estaba escrito: El celo de tu casa me devora.

The Transfiguration of the Lord. Jesus reveals to Peter, James and John that he is more than just a human among them with a new message. Today, He reveals His divinity. The Greek word for transfiguration is metamorphosis. A complete change from something to something else. Today's transfiguration is not just a look in Jesus' eye. He is revealed as God, something completely different than His appeared humanity.

Jesus appears with Moses and Elijah. Why? Because Jesus has come to fulfill the Law and the Prophets. Moses represents the Law and Elijah represents all of the prophets who foretold the coming of the Messiah.

Nothing is an accident in the Bible. The Transfiguration of Jesus is a fulfillment of the Old Testament. But where is this prophecy? Where is it hidden in the Old Testament as it is revealed to us today in the Gospel?

Although, Mark doesn't tell us in today's Gospel, the Evangelist Matthew tells us that Jesus ascends the mountain after six days. We generally refer to the mountain as Mt. Tabor, but in reality, the Gospels never offer a name for exact place for the Transfiguration.

We may also think of Moses' ascent on Mt. Sinai as a singular moment. Moses actually went up on the mountain 8 times. On the sixth ascent, in Exodus 24:16, the Cloud, which is the presence of God, appears for 6 days and on the 7th, Moses enters to speak directly to God.

Jesus takes three men with him; Peter, James and John. In Exodus 24:1, we are told that Moses, also in the 6th ascent, takes along 40 elders. We don't know their names, but in addition, Moses brings along three specifically named men; Aaron, Moses' brother, who has been acclaimed as High Priest for the Jews and Aaron's sons, Nadab and Abihu, both of whom would follow in the priestly service of their father. For Jesus, Peter will become the first pope, the first CEO of the Catholic Church and James and John are brothers who will follow Jesus and Peter in the work of spreading the Kingdom of God.

We are told that after Moses encounters God, his face shone bright; his appearance is transfigured. However, this radiance is provided to Moses by God. When Jesus is transfigured, His radiance is provided from his own power. Jesus is God.

A cloud appears over Jesus and from the cloud, God roclaims Jesus as His Son and tells us to listen to Him. When God breaks through to us in some reality, in this case by speech, we call it a theophany. God provides a theophany to Moses when He speaks to Moses from the cloud. God remains with the Jews as a part of this great cloud standing as a pillar of fire by night and the cloud by day. The Israelites know God is truly with them. The pillars lead the Israelites through the dessert. Our pillar of fire stands lit constantly to show us the presence of God within our tabernacle; the tabernacle lamp.

But what does all of this mean? Moses led the Israelites from physical slavery out of Egypt, through the desert to the Promised land. From there, Joshua spearheads the movement to the final destination of the Exodus; Jerusalem. There, on Mt. Zion, the Temple held the Tabernacle God told Moses to build which is a particular presence of God on Earth. The Exodus is over and the Israelites establish the center of their nation, the center of their worship. Jesus is now a new Moses, however, a greater Moses, because this time, our Exodus will not end on earth. He is leading us in an Exodus not from physical slavery, but the slavery of sin and our final destination is Paradise; back to the God Who loves us; Who made us. Jesus leads us and we all follow him through this valley of tears, this desert, back to the Garden, the end of our wandering. Moses led the Israelites through their personal valley of tears; their desert. And just as the Israelites fought, suffered and endured to reach their end; Jesus shows us the way to our ultimate end will also be through endurance, and suffering. If Jesus, God, suffered, we will also suffer, but because of Christ's suffering, the road to our new Exodus is open. He shows us that our suffering has value. He has unlocked the gates of Paradise, which was shut up by the original sin of Adam.

Finally, Jesus tells Peter, James and John to keep the Transfiguration quiet. If people knew that Jesus was, in reality, God at the out start, the concept of the need for the crucifixion could be misunderstood or even negated since God could change everything by His mere will. But God decided to save the world through Jesus' suffering. We don't know why, but God decides, not us. Jesus shows us the way to the end of our pilgrimage will be through the cross.

The Exodus of the Jews was tough. Ours is too. Be prepared for the tough roads we will all have to travel. And even though we humans often seek the reward without the work; the glory without the cost. God choose the means of salvation to fit His plans, not ours. Christ tells us first the cross, then the crown; first Lent and then Easter.

Why were there 10 plagues administered by God to the Egyptians to let the Israelites go?

They mirrored the 10 gods of Egypt to demonstrate that the God of the Israelites was the definitive God over all others.

- 1) Water to blood against Hapi, of the Nile.
- 2) Frogs against Heket, fertility god who had a frog's head.
- 3) Gnats from the dust against Geb, the earth god.
- 4) Flies against Khepri, god of rebirth and creation having the head of a fly.
- 5) Death of cattle against Hathor, god of protection having a cow's head.
- 6) Boils against Isis, the healing god.
- 7) Hail and lightning against the sky god, Nut.
- 8) Locusts against Seth, the god of storms and sundry disasters.
- 9) Darkness against Ra, the sun god.
- 10) Death of the firstborn against pharaoh, who was seen as a god


