Sacrament of Matrimony

Of the seven sacraments (Lt. sacra = holy, signum= signs), there are two sacraments of service, or rather how we serve God in our service to the Lord.

Every sacrament has two signs: one outward and one inward. The outward sign for marriage is the vows spoken, the "I dos" and "I will" while the inward sign is Jesus intimately tying the two souls together.

All the other six sacraments are conferred by a priest, deacon or bishop, but the Sacrament of Matrimony is given to each other by the spouses themselves. The celebrant is merely a witness for the Church.

In our individual person, we represent Christ to the world. By taking on flesh (Incarnation), Christ redeemed our flesh. When we see another human, we see another Christ (Alter Christus).

But we are meant to live in community. Even God Himself, lives in a community of the Trinity; The Father, Son and Holy Spirit. All three are God while each is a separate entity. We can describe the Trinity as a communion of love: the Lover, the Beloved and the Love uniting the others. As husband and wife, we have a reflection of the Trinity in our lives. One is the lover, the other receives the love (the beloved) and love itself ties the two together.

And so in the Sacrament of Matrimony, we reflect Christ in our own personhood and the Trinity as the two are united as one.

FATHER JERRY'S HOMILY 12/12/21

What must I do?

In the Gospel for today, John the Baptist is proclaiming the Kingdom is near and his ultimate priority to prepare for that coming is to repent. Even Jesus, in His first public words says it, "The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Whenever we hear an authoritative and clear call to repent, we all take notice. A cry from a believable and authentic person moves us because in our bones, the very center of our lives, we all know we have failed to keep up with the commission we receive in our Baptism; to proclaim the good news and also to love our neighbor as ourselves.

Those listening to the message of the Baptist today get the message to repent and the question is proposed, "what must I do?"

John is the end of a long line of prophets. Read any of the prophets; Joel, Isaiah, and others and you will find that their basic call is for justice, perhaps expressed most profoundly by Micah when he says, ".....do justice....love goodness.....walk humbly with your God."

Well, we know about penance; the making up for what we have done. We receive penance during the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We can be forgiven, but the penalty is still there, so we do penance to make up for the transgression. I wreck your car, you forgive me, but I still have to do the penance to provide for your deserved justice of repairing or replacing your car.

There it is; deserved justice. If you want peace, work for justice because true peace is not just the absence of war, but the justice provided for each individual's dignity.

Tangibly, we can see this in many ways but it can be boiled down to one thought: if you have more than you need, help those who are in need. And we can see it every day. Those who see the job we are tired of as a way to lift themselves up. That car that we are tired of becomes the transportation some does not have in order to get to work or the doctor. On and on it goes.

After we provide for ourselves, and our family, we either desire more for ourselves or justice for those who are deserving.

I cannot over stress the biblical principal of tithing. The principal helps you and it helps others. God will not be out done in giving.

Within the framework of to "Love God, Love Others and Make Disciples", each one of us has to ask the question of ourselves. What must I do?
