



Saint of the Week


The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."

WORD on FAITH

"Reason is a fine thing. But remember - there are other ways to live." Annie Lighthart, *The Verge*

I have been thinking about reason lately and how some personal dilemmas do not respond well to rational analysis. Sometimes trying to weigh pros and cons makes the solution more elusive; critically looking at the many aspect of a particular issue seems to make the waters murkier.

I have been wondering if I should try relying on intuition more frequently. One of my fears about intuition is that I may simply choose the path of least resistance (my favorite path) and call it an intuitive response to the problem that has me feeling conflicted and trapped. I prefer the notion of discernment - seeking guidance from a spiritual source, then being willing to trust that a resolution to my dilemma or problem will present itself at some point. This approach requires patience, not my strongest suit.

Discernment does not take reason out of the process; it does suggests that relying solely on reason is limiting my resources. God can speak to me through many portals - dreams, other people, nature, reason, intuition. Being open to the many ways in which God can speak makes rational sense.

May I, like the magi, seek the divine and listen with all my faculties for God's Word. I need all the help I can get to guide me along the Way.


