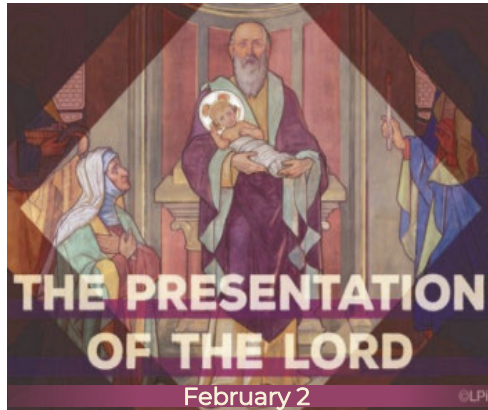


FROM THE PASTOR

As we move into the new year, I provide an update on the property issue at Ss. Simon and Jude. I am truly grateful to those individuals who have donated \$121,150 exclusively to help remedy the issue. To date we are looking at a total cost of nearly \$700,000. Aspects of the work included: survey and planning documents, exploratory excavation, installation of sanitary sewers, manholes, and storm catch basins. The diocese plans to assist with a 50% insurance coverage of the total bill.

Mr. Rob Munz. If you are interested in learning more about the school and its programs, feel free to contact the office at 412-922-4765.

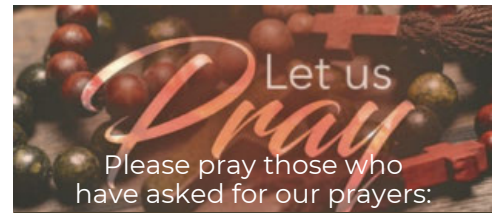

If I speak in human and angelic tongues,
but do not have love, I am a resounding gong or a clashing cymbal. And if I have the gift of prophecy,
and comprehend all mysteries and all knowledge;
if I have all faith so as to move mountains,
but do not have love, I am nothing.
If I give away everything I own,
and if I hand my body over so that I may boast,
but do not have love, I gain nothing.

[Love is patient, love is kind.
It is not jealous, it is not pompous, it is not inflated, it is not rude,
it does not seek its own interests,

At present we see indistinctly, as in a mirror, but then face to face. At present I know partially; then I shall know fully, as I am fully known.

Since the local newspaper reduced its print editions to two days a week, many people have raised concerns about missing the obituaries. Parishioners are often saddened by realizing that another parishioner died only after the funeral has taken place.

This is an unfortunate circumstance, and we recognize that our caring community wants to pray for our deceased members and provide comfort and support to their families. Due to the number of funerals we have and three church buildings, our staff cannot post signs on bulletin boards or doors as was done at some of our churches in the past.

The most efficient way we have to disseminate important information is our parish website. The Parish of St. Raphael the Archangel website has a special section called, "In Memoriam" where the names and usually obituaries for those buried from our parish are posted as soon as we schedule the funeral and have the approval of the family. There are occasional situations when families express a desire for privacy, so there are circumstances when names are not listed.

We realize that there are some parishioners who do not have or use a computer or smart phone. If there is sufficient interest, the Care Ministry office would be willing to support a phone call chain system to notify parishioners without internet access about the funerals in the parish. One volunteer would need to be the point person to receive the initial notification phone call, then get the message out to the other people on the list. If anyone is interested in taking the lead or being on a call list, please contact Laura O'Keeffe, Care Minister, at 412- 857-5356.

May the souls of all our faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

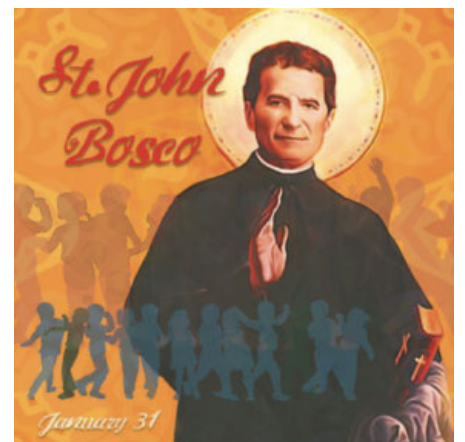

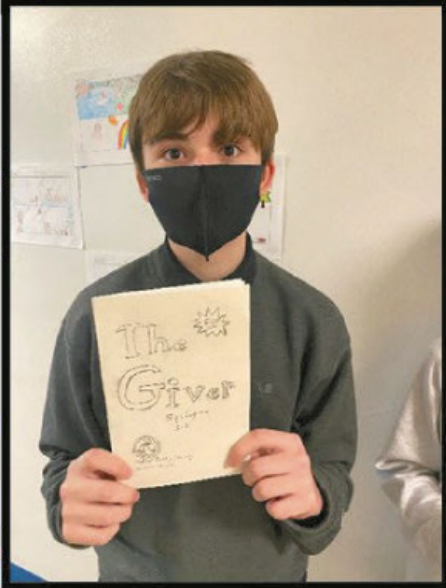
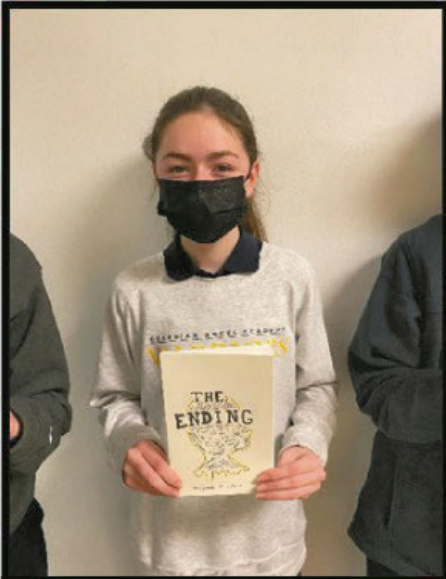
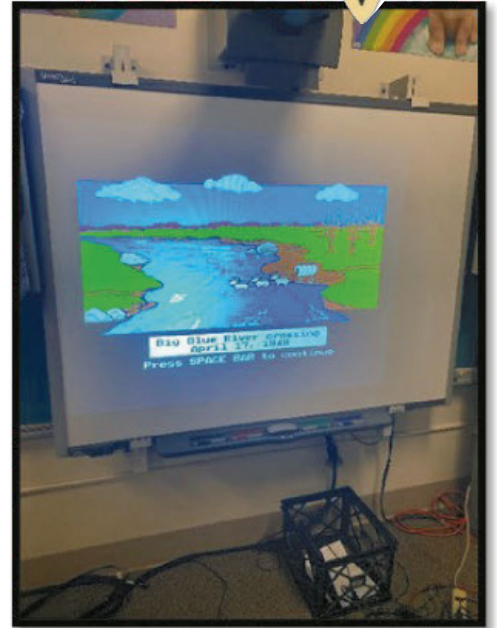


CLASSROOM CHRONICLES

Each week we will highlight the amazing things that are going on in our classrooms at Guardian Angel Academy.

MR. ROY FISCHER'S CLASSROOM

The 7th grade Reading class has finished reading "The Giver". As part of a final project, the students were tasked with creating their own sequel to the book, as The Giver has a very ambiguous ending. Students wrote their own original endings and drew their own book covers as well. We stapled them into small books. Students were then able to read their peer's new short stories and write reviews on their classmate's work. The 7th grade's imagination brought us new experiences and offered us a new view of the original text of "The Giver".



The 8th grade Social Studies class is just finishing off a chapter on the Wild West. To help the students experience the life of a settler heading West, we played an old video game: The Oregon Trail! Using an online video game emulator, students were able to play the 1985 game on their Chromebooks in class. Even though it was an old game, the students were able to find not only enjoyment in playing the classic staple of all computer rooms of the 1990's, but were also able to draw conclusions about hardships and life in the West. After playing the game, students were then tasked with writing a reflection about their experiences.

We are big college football fans and enjoy going to Pitt games (or watching them on TV if it's too cold). We also enjoy trying new restaurants and spending time with family and friends.



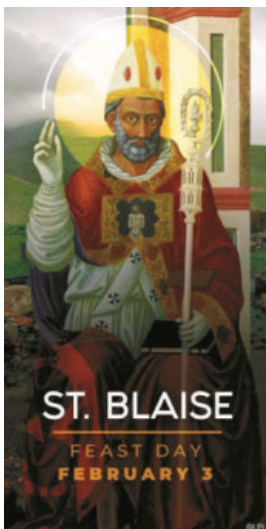


Typically news from our St Vincent de Paul Conference focuses on the profiles of our friends in need, their stories, and how we are able to help them due to your generosity, but that's the end of the narrative. This time we'll chronicle the beginning and middle of the narrative. People can call our Help Line 24-7 and leave a message with their contact info. Conference members take turns as "operators" and pass that information on to the membership, thus seeking someone to take the case. Ideally, two members will make a home visit to meet the person in need, and fully assess his/her situation. However, many times during the pandemic these visits were limited. Interviewing and then assessing one's needs can take one hour to several hours for follow-up details, before reporting back to our

conference with a summary and recommendation of how to proceed. At Christmas time there was a particularly dramatic story that deserves retelling.

A couple called, desperately in need of housing, because they were living in their van and almost out of money. After a job loss due to Covid, they left a nearby county to answer an online ad for a rental. They paid considerable money, signed a lease, and moved into their new apartment unaware of a scam. Two days later the real owner of the property appeared, evicted them, and locked all their belongings in the apartment! When the temperatures plunged they called St Vincent de Paul and we provided nearby lodging for a few days over Christmas. With the help from our Conference, they found a HUD property and headed to Bellevue for an interview and application process on December 27. When their van broke down en route, and fearful that they would miss their interview, they called us again. The driver had tools and the skills to replace the broken fan belt, but no money for parts. Our devoted

member then drove them to a NAPA store to buy the necessary parts. After a successful repair, and just to be sure there would not be another highway breakdown, our Vincentian followed them back to the hotel and then drove them to the HUD apartment to complete the application process. In total counterpoint to their recent luck, they emerged from the interview all smiles with an approval in hand and the opportunity to move in immediately. Just one more assistance from St. Vincent de Paul and this case would be closed; they needed a bed, some bedding and clothes, which were available from the St Vincent de Paul Store. So a happy ending and challenges far beyond the ordinary, but an example of how extreme some cases can be - and we are blessed to be able to help. Thank you again for the financial help to do so.



St. Blaise | February 3

You may be familiar with the annual "blessing of throats" that many parishes in the United States use to commemorate the beloved bishop and martyr. St. Blaise lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. Due to religious persecution, he was forced to flee and hide in a cave in the back country in order to save his life.

History has it that one day a group of hunters stumbled upon where St. Blaise was living. They found the bishop kneeling in prayer, surrounded by wolves, lions, and bears that he had tamed. The legend has it that as the hunters dragged Blaise off to prison, a mother came with her young son who had a fish bone lodged in his throat. At Blaise's command, the child was able to cough up the bone and thus lived.

Today we remember the saint on his feast day by saying the following prayer:

Through the intercession of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, may God deliver you from ailments of the throat and from every other evil. In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. ©LPi
