MISSION COOPERATION SUNDAY

One of the ways the Catholic Church is deeply inspirational is through her missionary work. For millennia, the Church has sent forth innumerable Catholic missionaries to bring relief to the poor. We serve women, children, and men of all races and religions. The Church pursues the poor and serves them because poverty is painful. There is no other litmus test.

This year, Missionary Cooperation Sunday is the weekend of June 4 and 5. As with the past couple of years, because of restrictions we will not host a missionary but instead will hear a homily letter written by a missionary.

Our parish this year is supporting the Diocese of Lexington that contains ten of the poorest counties in the United States. Their service to this region for decades has helped create a gradual change from the once predominantly anti-Catholic prejudice to a region grateful for their Christian service. Since employment opportunities are limited, most households require the help of others to meet their basic needs for food, shelter, and medicine.

Realizing that it has been a difficult few years for all of us, we can only imagine how difficult it has been for people of Appalachia who must depend on others for basic needs. Please be as generous as possible through prayer and financial support in helping to offer some of those needs to the people of the Diocese of Lexington.




PENITENTIAL ACT

FIRST READING | ACTS 15: 1-2, 22-29

Some who had come down from Judea were instructing the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the Mosaic practice, you cannot be saved." Because there arose no little dissension and debate by Paul and Barnabas with them, it was decided that Paul, Barnabas, and some of the others should go up to Jerusalem to the apostles and elders about this question.

The apostles and elders, in agreement with the whole church, decided to choose representatives and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. The ones chosen were Judas, who was called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers. This is the letter delivered by them:

"The apostles and the elders, your brothers, to the brothers in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia of Gentile origin: greetings.

Since we have heard that some of our number who went out without any mandate from us have upset you with their teachings and disturbed your peace of mind, we have with one accord decided to choose representatives and to send them to you along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have dedicated their lives to the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. So we are sending Judas and Silas who will also convey this same message by word of mouth: 'It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities, namely, to abstain from meat sacrificed to idols, from blood, from meats of strangled animals, and from unlawful marriage. If you keep free of these, you will be doing what is right. Farewell."

In Pittsburgh, we often complain that we have many cloudy, rainy days. We yearn for more days with sunshine and blue skies. People often comment that when they see the sun, they just feel better. Our second reading today tells us that in Heaven, God's light is enough, and the lamp is the Lamb of God, Jesus Christ. Every Christian receives the Light of Christ at Baptism. We receive Jesus into ourselves every time we receive Holy Communion and receive his mercy every time we receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

No matter what the weather or other external circumstances are like, we are blessed to have the light and peace of Christ within us. The more we give gratitude to God and participate in the Sacraments, the more energized we will be for whatever we face, and the more we will be able to make the Light of Christ visible to others.

The twofood booths that need a chairman are the Irish Booth and Funnel Cakes. For these booths we provide most of the supplies to run them and any assistance you need to run the booth. Your responsibility is to prepare and serve the food, get volunteers to help, and clean up at the end of each night.

We were very pleased with the outpouring of volunteers from all of our neighborhoods last year. We hope your experiences bring you back to volunteer again this year, and that you will encourage your families and friends to volunteer also.

We need MANY volunteers to make the festival a success. Please volunteer to help, even if you are only available for an hour or so. We need help setting everything up.

We start setting up on Saturday, July 9 at 8:00 a.m. at the Ss. Simon and Jude school parking lot.

That day we set up all the booths, roofs, shelves and begin running the electrical wiring. It looks impressive by the end of the day but that is only the beginning! The rest of the week we continue the electric connections; put up the tents; get deliveries of supplies, food, and prizes; inventory and arrange everything; put tables, chairs and any other items needed into the booths; put up netting and gutters where needed; and put up the speakers on the lot. In addition, there are many more things that are done that I have not included.

So – we can use your help in the evenings and during the day any time that week.

DID YOU KNOW?

You may have noticed in our parish Mass intentions that there is always an intention listed among the weekend Masses for the "People of the Parish." This peculiar intention sometimes leads to some questions — who keeps requesting this mysterious Mass? Are we so low on Mass intention requests that we have to resort to something generic? In fact, the answers to these questions lie in theology, long-standing tradition, and Church law. As you know, Catholics are encouraged to offer a stipend and request that a Mass be celebrated at their parish for a specific intention. These intentions can be offered for any noble purpose, whether that be the remembrance of a departed loved one, for someone undergoing a medical procedure, for an anniversary or birthday... vou name it. But Church law actually mandates that parish priests offer certain Masses for their parishioners as a whole. (The Latin term for these Masses "for the people" is pro populo.) The reason for this connects fundamentally to why parishes and priests exist at all — the salvation of souls. Praying for the faithful is the most basic means of spiritual assistance, and offering the sacrifice of the Mass is the Church's highest form of worship. Therefore, Canon 534.1 of the Code of Canon Law requires the pastor of every parish to say a Mass pro populo on every Sunday and holy day of obligation. The pastor may also delegate this responsibility to another priest serving in the parish for a legitimate cause. (Such as the complexities of serving three worship sites!) Behind all of this ecclesiastical legalese is a truth that I hope you find both consoling and profound: the fact that your priests and deacons are always praying for you. And we do that even when we aren't bound to do so by canon law! For example, you may be familiar with the Divine Office, or the Breviary — the collection of prayers, hymns, psalms, and readings which is said every day by bishops, priests, and deacons. When priests and deacons are ordained, the bishop elicits from them this promise: "Are you resolved to maintain and deepen a spirit of prayer appropriate to your way of life and, in keeping with what is required of you, to celebrate faithfully the Liturgy of the Hours for the Church and for the whole world?" Each one of your clergy answered yes to that question, and living it out is both an honor and a joy.
