

#### ANNIVERSARY BLESSINGS

Next weekend is the last weekend of the month. We will have a blessing after all Masses for couples who received the Sacrament of Matrimony during the month of July. If your Anniversary falls in July, please remain in church and a priest or deacon will bless you as soon as he is finished greeting the people. No appointment or reservation is needed.

#### Is your Marriage Recognized by the Church?

Catholic Church law ordinarily requires baptized Roman Catholics to marry before a priest or deacon. Unless they received a "dispensation from canonical form," Catholics who exchange vows in the presence of ministers from other religious traditions or civil officials are not considered validly married in the eyes of the Catholic Church.

If you were married outside of the Catholic Church and would like to have your marriage validated, please contact Fr. Grecco. It may be easier than you think! Fr. Grecco (or Fr. Alek) will be happy to answer any questions.

The crowds of people who came to have a great time were not disappointed. The weather was fantastic, the crowds had a great time eating and enjoying the games and Sky Divers.



#### PENITENTIAL RITE / KYRIE


I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters,




#### Grandparent's Prayer

#### Ramble and Rosary:

Monday, July 25 is the Feast of St. James the Apostle. Many Christian pilgrims have experienced the spirituality of walking by traveling 500 miles on foot to the tomb of St. James in Spain on the Camino de Santiago. One pilgrim, Jane Blanchard wrote, "As I walked the Camino and opened my heart to the possibilities, to the wonders of nature, and to the child within me, I was filled with peace and joy." 

#### SS. SIMON AND JUDE CHURCH RENOVATION

#### From Fr. Grecco:

Prior to the "On Mission" changes, the former Ss. Simon & Jude parishioners contributed to the "Church Alive" campaign with the expectation that a portion of the monies collected would be directed to possible renovations of the SSJ church building. The diocese placed a moratorium on any renovations back in late 2018 with the hope that the new pastor would move ahead with his predecessor's plans if he chose to do so. 2018-2019 were years of trying to make sense of what was expected of us as a new faith community; 2020, because of the virus, saw any plans to renovate as improbable. Now, having our bearings and "dodging many unexpected financial bullets" after 1 ½ years as a new parish we will move ahead.

The monies in the "Deposit & Loan" account with the Diocese presently total \$ 642,639.69. We will not spend beyond that allotted funding. Not a cent of that money has been used for any other purposes, in fact, it has just gained interest as we awaited use of it. (Remember I posed the possibility of using some of the money for the drastic financial issue that was the damage on the SSJ fields. Because of the assistance of the diocesan insurance and the generous donations toward that problem, we DID NOT move ahead with any requests to repurpose any of that renovation money.)

With the permission of the bishop, we will move ahead with the plans, in part, to renovate Ss. Simon & Jude Church. The extensive planning was spearheaded by Joe Woznicki years ago. We are in possession of Joe's plans and these have been submitted to the FJ Busse Company. Because of possible supply-chain issues, as well as the increase in costs since the original plans were developed, it is impossible to make all of the originally planned changes. Additionally, it is necessary to indicate that we must spend the money for the purposes set forth in the case statement. If this money was not in hand and had not been collected for the purpose of renovation, we would NOT be renovating at this time. This work DOES NOT indicate that any building is "safe" from future closure IF that becomes necessary. Each of our properties is important to the present circumstance, but if attendance or finances become issues, then we will have to address the future use of the properties.

#### The bids for work include:

- Demolition of existing ceiling tile and lighting
- Replacement of acoustic tile
- Painting of existing ceiling grid and aisle pillars
- Replacement of existing lighting with LED dimmable fixtures
- Installation of stone material on front, free-standing wall and baptistery area; with painting over faux marble decoration and other walls
- Installation of wood-look ceramic floor tile in the sanctuary with an extension of the altar pedestal
- · Removal of aisle carpeting and installation of LVT flooring to complement the wooden pews

Contracted cost for this work: \$386,023

Local volunteers will undertake a simple renovation of the Men's Room, also.

Beginning August 22, Ss. Simon & Jude Church will be closed for the planned renovations. Anticipated work time-line will take us to November. The Mass schedule will be altered slightly and <u>TEMPORARILY</u>. <u>We will eventually return to the Saturday evening as it has been for the past three years</u>.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

"Where is that in the Bible?"

Maybe you've heard this question before, or even asked it yourself. In conversation with Protestant friends, relatives, and acquaintances, this is a question I'm asked all the time. Our Catholic faith is one with many doctrines, practices, and traditions that do not stem directly from the pages of Holy Scripture — at least not in a way that is explicit. On top of that, there are many issues and ideas in our modern world that are never directly tackled by the Bible. So how do we Catholics deal with these questions?

First and foremost we have to understand what lies behind the question itself. Central to the Protestant reformation was the doctrine of sola scriptura — "Scripture alone" as the sole infallible source of authority for Christian faith and practice. The Catholic faith obviously reverences Sacred Scripture and holds it up as the foundation of our faith. But it is not the only source of God's revelation. And Scripture itself never claims to be the only standard or guideline for Christians to follow.

If you'd like some Scriptural "proof" of that claim, take these two verses. The Gospel of John concludes with this resonant statement: "There are also many other things that Jesus did, but if these were to be described individually, I do not think the whole world would contain the books that would be written" (Jn 21:25). So Jesus did and taught many things that

were not written in the Gospels; instead, the Apostles handed them on to the Church by means of tradition. And Saint Paul, writing to the Thessalonians, urges them to "stand firm and hold fast to the traditions that you were taught, either by an oral statement or by a letter of ours" (2 Thes 2:15). Not every truth of the faith is contained in the "letters" of Scripture.

As the Catechism puts it, "the Christian faith is not a 'religion of the book" (CCC 108). Jesus Christ did not put a pen to paper and write the New Testament; in fact, he wrote nothing at all, as far as we know. Nor did the Old Testament drop down out of heaven in one piece. What Jesus did do is found a Church — a community of believers, guided by the Holy Spirit, which transmits the Word of God in its completeness, to the present day.

Nowhere is this more obvious than in the history of the Bible itself. What we call "the Bible" is in fact a collection of seventy-three books written in different times and places by different people, or groups of people. As Saint Paul wrote, all of Scripture is "inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Tim 3:16). But it was the Church who, guided by the Holy Spirit, debated and discerned what constitutes Scripture to begin with.

How precisely did that happen? It was the result of Catholic bishops meeting in Church councils — a process that went on for centuries. As a result, there were many

generations of Christians who lived and died before there was anything that could be called a Bible as we know it today. Given that complex history, the next time someone asks where something is in the Bible, you might ask them, "But where did the Bible come from in the first place?"

Catholics recognize that both Scripture and Tradition form a single deposit of faith. The two are intimately united. As Vatican II put it, "Sacred Scripture is the word of God inasmuch as it is consigned to writing under the inspiration of the divine Spirit, while Sacred Tradition takes the word of God entrusted by Christ the Lord and the Holy Spirit to the Apostles, and hands it on to their successors... Consequently it is not from Sacred Scripture alone that the Church draws her certainty about everything which has been revealed" (Dei Verbum 9).

There's a difference between the "big T" Tradition of the Church and the "little t" traditions that make up the external expressions of faith. Not every novena, cultural tradition, or liturgical gesture is on the same level as the teaching of Christ in the Gospels or the well-defined dogmas of faith, like the doctrine of the Holy Trinity — but as long as even these little traditions help to build up the body of Christ and are not opposed to the Word of God which has been revealed to us and handed down to us by the Apostles, they are good and holy things which help us towards salvation.






