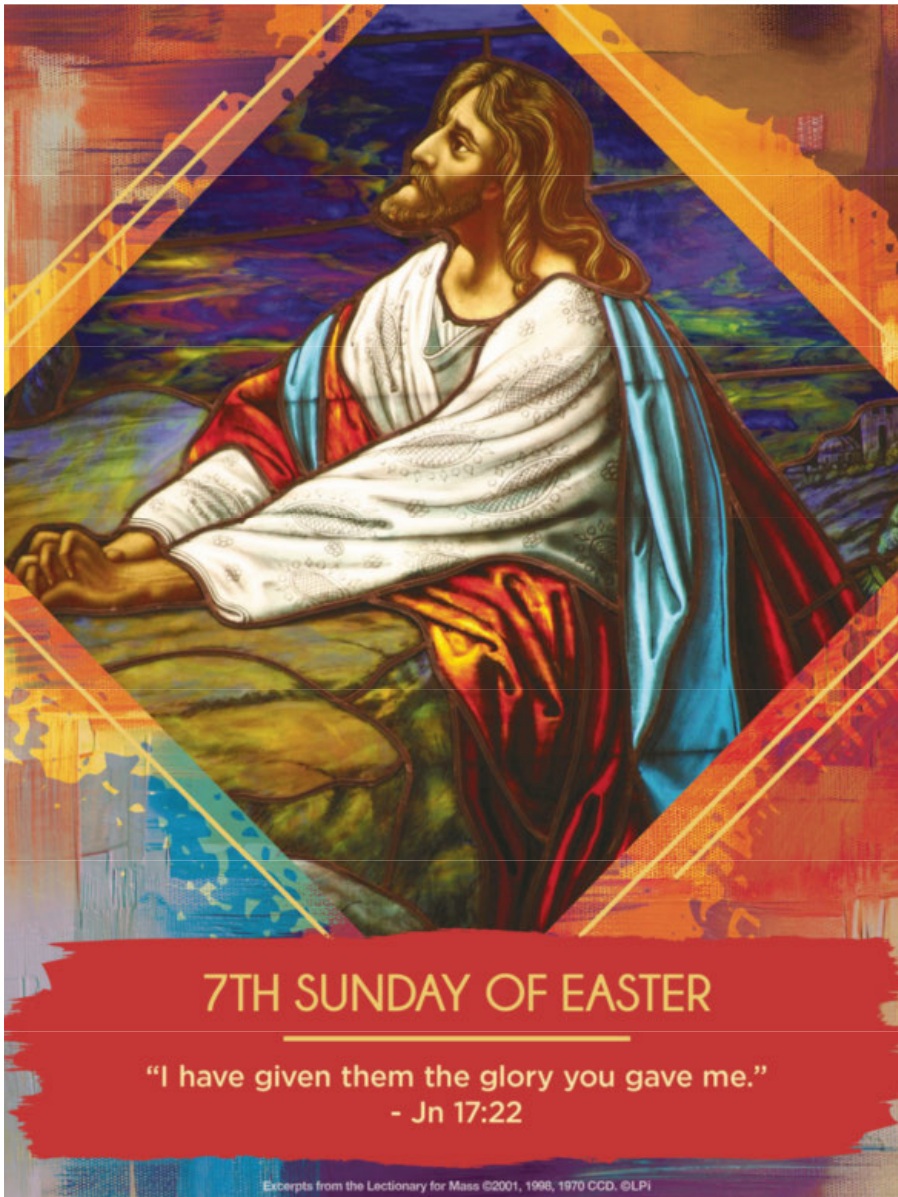

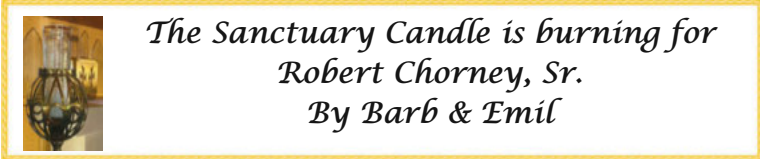
BAPTISM: Classes are required. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

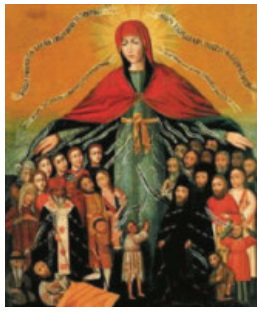

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

A Blessed Seventh Sunday/Week of Easter to you! I don't know about you, but to me it feels that our Easter Season has flown by. No worries though, as our Risen Lord is always with us. Further, how have you been doing this Easter Season? Have you been able to take time in Daily Prayer, perhaps by my suggestion of taking the Resurrection Gospels and praying over them and asking the Lord where he needs to Resurrect you? Have you been keeping some good Prayer habits that were begun at Lent? Whatever this time has been for you, there is still this final week until Pentecost to continue to let the Lord reveal himself to you in a new way. You may remember me saying this before, but this stretch of days is where we get the term 'novena'; because it is in the days between Ascension and Pentecost, that the Disciples were instructed to pray for nine days in preparation for the Holy Spirit to fill them and descend upon them. That is why we pray the "Novena to the Holy Spirit" during these days as the most ancient prayer. It can be found on our website to help you. Further, this is why the Easter Season is such a great time to continue/start/renew our commitment to prayer. It does not have to be anything spectacular, but begin somewhere with a devotion, Scripture, and the Mass and let them guide you to find some more time to talk to the Lord. This is how we can discover (and rediscover) the Glory of the Lord that he talked about in this weekend's Gospel. *And a challenge for us all: join me in praying the Novena to the Holy Spirit daily as we pray for each other!*

Speaking of Pentecost, **please take a timeslot as a family or an individual to be with our Lord in our All Night Adoration Vigil next Saturday, June 4-Sunday, June 5.** There are many ½ hour time slots still available. It is a great way (and challenge) to spend time with the Lord. You do not have to be a parishioner to sign up as all are welcome by going to our website, clicking "Come Adore Jesus Christ" and picking the time of your choosing. You can also sign up for a time the same way for our **First Friday Adoration** as well! There will also be someone at the doors this weekend to assist you in signing up if you do not have a computer or need assistance. As always, you can also call the parish office as well.

Thank you to everyone who took time to visit with us as we venerated the Relics of Padre Pio. It is an intriguing joy to have Relics of the Saints, especially of our time, among us as they remind us that heaven is attainable. Thank you to Irene for organizing this and to the Catholic Foundation for sponsoring part of this event. Also, did you know that every Altar has a Relic placed in it? I am not sure who is in our Altar, but I am trying to find that out.

Two more events to coming up in June that I hope you can support:

It is truly a joyous weekend as the Lord has blessed us with three new Priests for the Diocese! I hope that you were able to catch some of the livestream from the Mass this past Friday. Ordinations are a great reminder that we all play a role in the Kingdom of God and that the Lord calls us (and maybe you) to be a co-worker in the vineyard. Never shy away from encouraging a vocation as there may be a young man you know that would make a great Priest. Tell them that and pray for them to know God's Will! Please pray for more vocations to the Priesthood, Diaconate, Religious Life, and more holy marriages as we need these vocations to help each other!

As we are in the home stretch of the Easter Season, we also pause as a Nation this Memorial Day weekend to Remember and say Thank you to all who gave the ultimate sacrifice so that we can live in the greatest country in the World. This weekend is more than the unofficial start of summer, but a time to remember the gifts we have as a Nation, and the gifts given to us in the dignity of our lives. Traditionally, Memorial Day is also a time to visit a cemetery. As you pass a Cemetery this weekend say a quick prayer for those who are resting there; as well as those who mourn them; and for the souls in Purgatory that need our Prayers. This is also a great time to give you some information regarding our cemetery as we are in need of more land. If you know of any available land in the vicinity, please let me know by contacting the Office by phone or email. Also, take time to thank the Lord for the gift of our land and nation; and thank a Veteran for their service. **I also hope you can join me for Mass at 8:30 a.m. on Monday at the Cemetery (if Rain: At Church; the location change will be sent out via Myparish App if needed).** This Mass is scheduled intentionally for you to start the day with the Lord, before the business of picnics and gatherings (yes, they are important too) start. Please join us and bring a lawn chair.
