# A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Why? Because the Holy Trinity is how we know God. How? Through Relationship. God the Father gives us life; God the Son sustains our life by his presence and is the manifestation of the Love of God; God the Holy Spirit animates our life by guiding us. Yes, last weekend we emphasized the coming of the Holy Spirit (third Person of the Trinity), but that is because we, like the early Disciples, have received the love of God the Father through the presence of the Son. The Holy Spirit keeps us connected to that love wherever we go in life. That is why it is so important to be present in a Personal and Communal Relationship with God in the Trinity. We need both relationships as they help us to understand and grasp the importance of the Trinity as three persons in one God. If you want to know the Father, go to the Son and Spirit; if you want to know the Son, go to the Father and Spirit; if you want to know the Spirit, go to the Father and Son. I promise I am not trying to speak in riddles, but we cannot complicate our faith. When we realize that our Faith and its very gift to us is about relationship, then we begin to understand its role in our lives. We may not always get our questions answered, but the relationship helps us to be in touch with the One who will in its time.

A hearty congratulations to all Graduates from College, Highschool, Junior High, Elementary. We are thankful for your witness and are proud of you. Continue to reach for your goals and know the Lord is with you every step of the way.

Please join us as we take part in the Corpus Christi Procession at the Cathedral next Sunday at 1pm. This is one of four simultaneous Eucharistic Processions happening throughout the Diocese. This is launching our part of the National Initiative by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops on Eucharistic Revival. I am looking forward to this as it will help us to give honor and understand the "Source and Summit" of our Faith. 
