

FAQ: Why is now such a critical time in the Church in the United States to have a

We are excited to witness what God has in store for his Church in the U.S. through the National Eucharistic Revival! Our world is in desperate need of the love of God.

Geopolitical crises, social unrest, increased polarization, and the need for recovery and renewal from the pandemic have created the opportunity to "open wide the doors to Christ" through Eucharistic Revival.

The difficulties and challenges over the last few years have shed lights on the Church's need for healing, unity, formation, and conversion. More than 30 percent of Catholics have not returned to the pews post-pandemic, and recent data reveals that the majority of Mass-going Catholics do not believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist. The past decade has also seen the rise of the "nones" among the millennial generation, with more than 40 percent now self-identifying as "unaffiliated" with any religion. Many young Catholics find the faith to be irrelevant to the meaning of their lives and challenges.

In the midst of these challenging times, we must increase our ability to provide to those inside the Church and to the world a credible witness of the difference Jesus Christ makes in the life of every individual. As the people of God, we must be reminded that the Eucharist truly is the living God, Jesus, with us, "always, until the end of the age," (Mt 28:20).

As we set out to meet the needs of the world and culture around us with the love of Christ, we must first take time to experience our own Eucharistic Revival with a renewed encounter and love for Jesus in the Eucharist, "for the life of the world" (Jn 6:51). **Now is the time!** (*Taken from www.eucharisticrevival.org.*)

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

A blessed Independence Day Weekend to you! What a gift to live in this land. Having hope and pride in one's homeland is what helps us to stay connected and know that we have a place that helps us grow in community. I hope that you join me in prayer to almighty God thanking Him for the Gifts He has given us in our land, our time, and our history. A nation, I believe, can only grow stronger when we are a nation in prayer. Don't be afraid to pray for our country, her leaders, and citizens as we celebrate this weekend.

I also think it is providential that as we celebrate our independence as a nation that we hear the Gospel Account on this 14th Sunday of Ordinary Time that tells us that Jesus sent believers into the land so that others may know Him. The call of the Gospel is never easy, but with (and in Christ through Prayer) it is possible. Why? Because He was and is loving truth. Many times, in our lives those places and people closest to us may not understand or grasp why we hope in Jesus. We can only do as Jesus did and what He calls us to do: love (even when it may cost us.) That too, is seen in our own nation's history of standing against tyranny and oppression. May we also find hope and solace in Jesus that when it is hard to speak and live the truth with those closest to us, that they may see His love in our witness.

Bishop Persico has given the permission for the Diocese to modify two more liturgical procedures considering the COVID 19 Pandemic: The Gift Procession and the Sign of Peace. We brought back the Gift Procession last weekend.

Regarding the Gift Procession: First, the Gift Procession symbolizes us bringing our gifts (including the gift of our lives) and placing them on the Altar. This is a time to remember to ask the Lord's blessings upon us individually and together as He makes holy our lives through the Eucharist borne from the Altar. Second, you will always notice that the gifts brought forward from the faithful (bread and wine) will always have the lid/cap on them to ensure minimal contact.

Regarding the Sign of Peace: First, throughout history there has always been a form of the sign of peace at some point in the Holy Mass. Most recently, since the Second Vatican Council, the Sign of Peace has taken place before the Lamb of God Prayer and after the Our Father Prayer as both prayers remind us of the unity and peace that the Eucharist gives us individually and communally. Second, even though there has always been a form/gesture of the sign of peace, this also means it can be expressed in many ways. I know there may be sensitivities regarding physical touch considering the continued concern around the pandemic. This is a reminder that the sign of peace can be a wave, head nod, the physical word of peace be with you. Although the physical form is now permitted in our diocese, please respect each other's sensitivities; if you turn to someone with a hand outstretched and they prefer not to return the gesture of peace physically, please respect that. Third, the Sign of Peace is right before we receive Holy Communion. This is not a free-for-all time that we wave to each other across the church and/or leave our pews, etc.; but we are invited to use this brief time to bring peace to those immediately around us. Please respect the dignity of this moment for those around us and who we are about to receive in Holy Communion. Again, we are all in this together as we continue to return to normalcy, open, and renew our communal prayer life.

The Month of July is full of summer fun. Please help us by signing your children (and their friends) up for Vacation Bible School. You can see more information on our website/in this bulletin. Also, please see the Cactus at the Main Entrance that has items that you can donate to make this a successful event. Your help is appreciated. Also, join us for our Parish Family Picnic at the end of the Month. Again, see the information in the bulletin/website. Members of your family are also welcomed to join us and remember the Picnic is Free. The Waldameer tickets that you can purchase can be used for that day or another day throughout the summer. The purchase of the tickets helps to defray our costs but ensure that all of us can have a grand time at the picnic, bingo, Mass, and the park. Again, whatever is your choosing.

Again, I hope that you can enjoy this weekend and remember its meaning. Please join us in the Cemetery at 8:30 a.m. on Monday, July 4th for our Independence Day Mass. This Mass will also be livestreamed. I hope that you have a safe and blessed Independence Day Weekend and remember the gift of our faith and pray in thanksgiving for our Country. Below is part of the "Prayer for the Nation" by the first Bishop of the United States, John Carroll, that I think is fitting for us to reflect on:

"We recommend likewise, to your unbounded mercy, all our brethren and fellow citizens throughout the United States, that they may be blessed in the knowledge and sanctified in the observance of your most holy law; that they may be preserved in union, and in that peace which the world cannot give; and after enjoying the blessings of this life, be admitted to those which are eternal."






