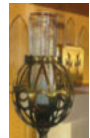
BAPTISM: Classes are required. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

Wow! This summer is sure going fast! It's hard to believe that we're just 10 weeks away from the start of our Youth Faith Formation. It is not too late to return the registration packets that were given at the end of last year or mailed last month. If you have not received a packet or are new to the parish, please contact me or the office to receive this information.

As we look ahead, we are in need of some more volunteers. We are seeking Catechists, Hall Monitors, Substitutes, Retreat Aids, Chaperones, people to assist with Children's Liturgy of the Word at 10:30 a.m. Masses, and people who may be willing to lead small groups for all ages. In addition to living the faith, you must be willing to obtain your Safe Environment Credentials to serve in ministry with children. If you have any interest or would like more information, please contact me.

Please note, the Diocese is gradually moving Confirmation back to 9th Grade. This is resulting in that this coming Faith Formation year, students in both 10th & 11th Grade are eligible to receive this Sacrament. If you have a 10th or 11th Grader who has not been part of our Faith Formation Program, please contact me about this preparation process.

Finally, we will be starting up our OCIA (Order of Christian Initiation for Adults — formerly Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults.) If you have not received Baptism, First Communion, and/or Confirmation, or are interested in coming into the Catholic Church, please contact me.

FAQ: What is the intended fruit of the National Eucharistic Revival?

Grounded in prayer and seeking the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the National Eucharistic Revival has four primary goals:

1. To provide a more profound encounter with Jesus Christ in the Sunday liturgy as a point of unity among all Catholics, and through this powerful encounter, find personal healing and courage to take the Gospel to a world in need of authentic love – the love of Christ found in the Eucharist.
2. To spark personal conversions through the joyful discovery of a relationship with Christ by encountering the love of God present in Jesus in the Eucharist.
3. To elevate the truth and practices of our Catholic faith through the rediscovery of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Church and of who we are as a people of God.
4. To form, inspire, and launch missionary disciples, filled with love of God and neighbor that comes from an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist, to the margins of the Church and the world.

By virtue of our baptism, we are all called to be missionaries. Like the Apostles, we are encouraged to reach out to our brothers and sisters in faith, love and sacrifice, both around the world and here at home.
