



A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

It is hard to believe that it is already halfway through July, but no worries, there is still plenty of Summer to enjoy. With that being said, isn't that how life is sometimes? We get so busy and forget to slow down. This weekend's Gospel, however, reminds us that we need to do exactly that so that we can see Jesus in everything and everyone. While there is plenty of opportunities to be Martha, we need and must also be Mary. I think that this can be a blessing also of the summer months. Although there are many things that we need to do, we can also use the beautiful weather to slow down and recognize His presence through prayer and "sit at His feet." Take time to come to Daily Mass/Daily Prayer/Scripture/Rosary and other Devotions/ as well as a few minutes to talk to Him in your own words daily as this will help us to not let the busy-ness of life carry us, but His Grace to sustain us! There is always time to start over and "sit at His feet".

This weekend is also a great reminder of a tool that we have at our fingertips: FORMED. We often think of Advent and Lent as a time to begin something spiritually. But the summer is a great opportunity to slow down and spiritually re-set. All you have to do is use your smartphone, tablet, computer, etc., and create a free account to access many videos, reflections, etc., available to help you grow in the spiritual life. Perhaps you can take time on your front porch, patio, after mowing the lawn, etc., and peruse through this great resource. Our Parish Council as a team is also utilizing one of its tools to help us as well. Please, though, take time to use this tool, share it with family and friends, and make it part of your spiritual life. It is a great way to "sit at the feet of the master" in our busy world.

Another great way to "sit at His feet" is to go on Retreat. The diocese offers two great opportunities to do so on a regular basis: Cursillo (https://eriecursillo.org/) and Divine Mercy Encounter (www.divinemercyencounter.com). While Cursillo is for adults, DME is for anyone ages 16 years or older. Both offer a time to step back in prayer, fellowship, and fun to know the Lord, His Church and the Christian Life better. Please consider doing one as they are offered multiple times per year and it is a great way to jump start our spiritual life! I also take one day per three months to devote to prayer to sneak off to a church, retreat house etc. If that suggestion helps you, please let me know and I can give you some direction to do so!

I hope to see you at the Picnic next weekend. Remember, 10:30 a.m. Mass will be at Waldameer (and will begin a few minutes later in case anyone shows up at the Church and wants to join us there). Please join us for the free picnic and fellowship. Of course, you will have the opportunity to use the park, but there will also be bingo, kids activities, as well at the Pavilion. Please take time out of your schedule to spend with your parish family and have some fun doing so! Again, RSVP is not necessary but helpful in the food count so please let us know if we can count you in (again, if your plans change and you are able to join us, just show up). Remember, your extended family is welcome as well!

A few other items:

- 1. We continue to work on our Cemetery Plans. Again, if you know of any land open, please let me know.
- 2. We are also grateful for training six new Altar Servers. I am excited for them to join me in being close to the action. When you think of it, please also thank them as well as our Readers, Extraordinary Ministers, and Ushers for all they do to help us in worship so that we can "sit at the feet of the Master."
- 3. We are excited for Joe Preston to be joining Chandler at the Seminary. We also are hopeful for more vocations. Again, please continue to pray for them as well as other young men to be open to this call. Remember, joining the seminary is only saying that you are open to the call and want to know the Lord's Call in your life and you do not sign on the "dotted line" yet. Seminary is a great place to listen, grow, and pray and "Sit at His Feet", so please pray for more vocations to the Priesthood!
- 4. Some of us have asked of Deacon Ron's whereabouts. Below is what was published in the bulletin on the weekend of June 18/19:

"You will notice a slight change on the Altar as beginning July 1 for the next six months, Deacon Ron will be taking a Leave of Absence from Active Ministry to tend to family needs. We are thankful for his years of service, and hope to have him <u>assisting at</u> Mass after the New Year. Don't worry though, you will definitely see him in church.
