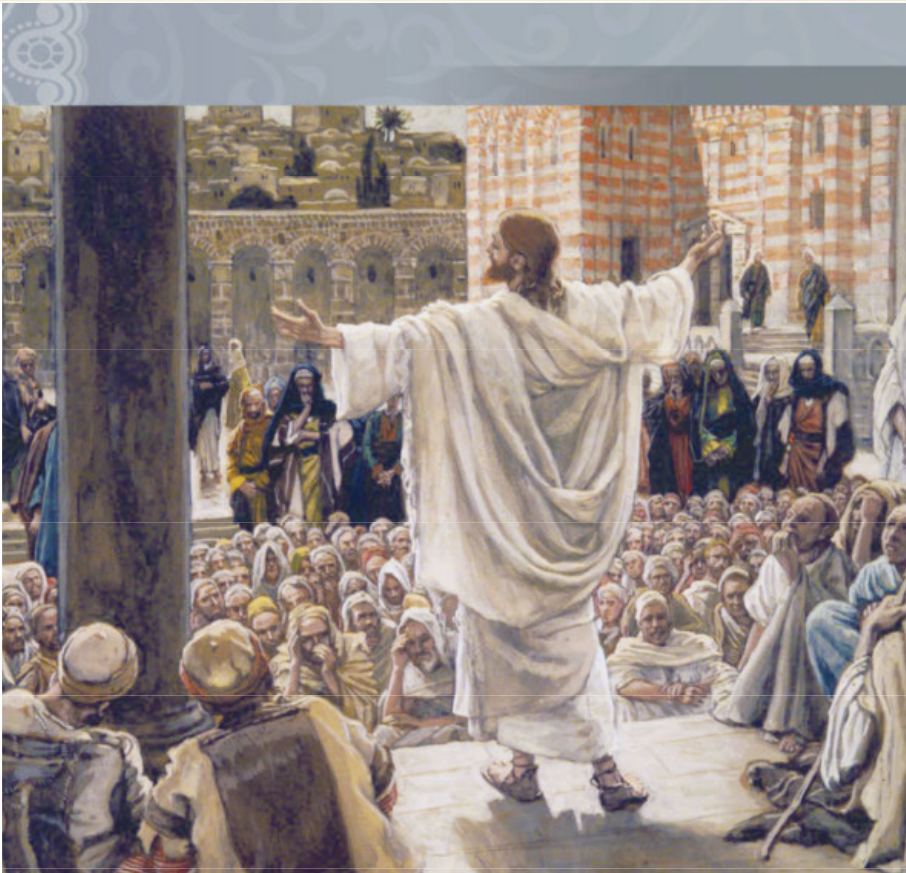

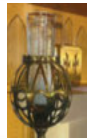
BAPTISM: Classes are required. Call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

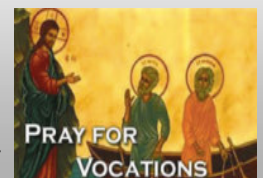
Traveling Chalice Program

Sunday, September 11 — First Reconciliation Parent Meeting at 9:00 a.m. (2nd Grade Parents)

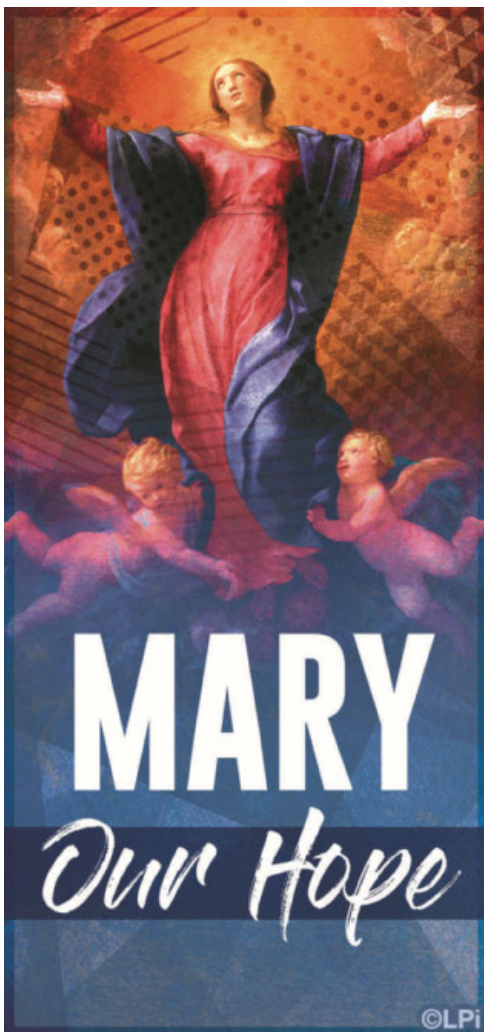
— **First Holy Communion Parent Meeting after 10:30 a.m. Mass** (3rd Grade Parents)

Question:

Why does Mary have so many feast days and names?

Answer:

Christians first began celebrating feast days in honor of Mary, the Mother of Jesus, in the fifth century. That celebration (originally called the Feast of the Dormition and now known by Roman Catholics as the Solemnity of the Assumption) was celebrated on August 15. Very soon, however, other special days dedicated to Mary began to appear in Jerusalem, Rome, and other major cities of the Christian world. These days of feasting became important parts of the life of the community. But, more importantly, each of these unique celebrations became an opportunity to focus on a different facet of the Christian faith, as believers focused their attention on specific events or mysteries of the lives of Mary and her Son.

Over the centuries, some of these celebrations became universal (such as the Assumption on August 15, the Immaculate Conception on December 8, and the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on January 1). Other celebrations were more closely tied to certain religious orders (such as the Carmelites celebration of “Our Lady of Mount Carmel” on July 16 or the Servite Friars feast of the “Seven Sorrows of Mary,” which is now celebrated as the Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows on September 15).

In more recent times, Marian apparitions (like Guadalupe, Lourdes, and Fatima) have inspired special liturgical celebrations. Pope Francis has added two new celebrations of Mary to the Church’s calendar: The Memorial of Mary, Mother of the Church (on the Monday after Pentecost) and the Commemoration of Our Lady of Loreto (on December 10). The various titles of Mary (like those we find in the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary) help us to reflect on different aspects of Mary’s faith and the ways that the Holy Spirit is at work in her and through her, especially as the Mother of Jesus.

In the end, whatever the event or mystery being celebrated in a particular liturgy or the title of Mary being used, we are invited to always see Mary in connection with the saving work of her Son. She is, of course, a patroness and protector for every Christian, but she is also a model of discipleship and contemplation: “Having entered deeply into the history of salvation, Mary, in a way, unites in her person and re-echoes the most important doctrines of the faith: and when she is the subject of preaching and worship she prompts the faithful to come to her Son, to his sacrifice and to the love of the Father” (*Lumen Gentium*, 65). ©LPi

A NOTE FROM OUR PASTOR

We continue to hear from the Letter to the Hebrews as our Second Reading. This weekend we are reminded that we are “surrounded by a cloud of witnesses.” What a comforting thought. But it is more than a thought as it is reality for we have been called to be in relationship. We understand our relationship with God as Faith. Faith is what helps make sense of our worldview. Our relationship with God also is meant to be lived with one another by our actions. Sometime our actions to stand for truth takes courage. That is why Jesus challenges us in this weekend’s Gospel to live in him. That will not always be easy, but it is always possible because of Faith.

Although August 15 falls on a Monday, which in America, lifts the obligation to attend Mass that day, it is still the Holyday of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Please join us for Mass at 7:30 a.m. or 6:00 p.m. to pray in thanksgiving that Mary’s Intercession is there for you and me.

As promised a few weeks back, this weekend is a fellowship weekend to get to know our Seminarians. Please take time to introduce yourself to them. (Also, please take time to introduce yourself to anyone you may not know....don’t always presume we remember each other). Also, there are many ways that we will support our Seminarians through Prayer and Action. However, please take them with you in your heart and do something to help them spiritually or otherwise as well.

We can help them through Prayer by:

1. Joining the “31 Club” by signing up on the parish website or contact the office. You choose the date to pray for vocations, and possibly offering a form of sacrifice (e.g. fasting).
2. Signing up for the Traveling Chalice Program, (i.e. take a specified chalice home for a week). I hope that all of us can sign up for one weekend, especially through the school year as a reminder to pray for them.
3. Offer a personal prayer time at home during the week.
4. Attend Adoration. We will be offering the Second Thursday of the Month for their intentions as well as for more Vocations. We will also be honoring this in various ways through our First Friday adorations as well.
5. Offer a time of Fasting (and/or another form of penance).
6. Offer a Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet.

We can help them through Action by:

1. Sending an email or letter. We will be publishing their contact information in the bulletin later this month.
2. Drop off a cookie or two at the Seminary. (self explanatory).
3. Invite them for Lunch or Dinner.
4. Give them a call.
5. Say hello to them when you see them in public and perhaps re-introduce yourself.

Again, these are just some ways that we will remember them as a parish, but I hope that you take time to creatively support as well. Also, we are thankful for a REEF Grant we received last year that is allowing us to supply our parish with various resources to help in discerning God’s Call in your life. Feel free to take a look at some of the books in the Gathering Space, and take one that interest you home to read. We recognize that Vocations begin at Baptism, but are nurtured in the family and parish community.

I am thankful to Monica and Steve Dvoranchik for sharing time with us regarding NFP. Their knowledge helps us to grow in the vast knowledge of how we can walk with each other regardless of Vocation.

We also are grateful that you are joining us this weekend as we bless all Students and Teachers as they venture into a new school year and enjoy some fellowship with each other.

Speaking of Fellowship, we are grateful to our Hospitality Ministry for helping us in these monthly endeavors. Please, please, please take time with each other after Mass to get to know someone you have not met or have not seen in a while as this is a great way to reach each other where we are at.

Have a great week and remember we are never alone as we are “surrounded by a cloud of witnesses”.
