## January 10, 2021—Baptism of the Lord

**Reading I: Isaiah 55:1-11 (Please note: Today's alternative readings may differ from print.)**

Thus says the LORD:  
All you who are thirsty,  
come to the water!  
You who have no money,  
come, receive grain and eat;  
come, without paying and without cost,  
drink wine and milk!  
Why spend your money for what is not  
bread,  
your wages for what fails to satisfy?  
Heed me, and you shall eat well,  
you shall delight in rich fare.  
Come to me heedfully,  
listen, that you may have life.  
I will renew with you the everlasting  
covenant,  
the benefits assured to David.  
As I made him a witness to the peoples,  
a leader and commander of nations,  
so shall you summon a nation you knew  
not,  
and nations that knew you not shall run to  
you,  
because of the LORD, your God,  
the Holy One of Israel, who has glorified  
you.

Seek the LORD while he may be found,  
call him while he is near.  
Let the scoundrel forsake his way,  
and the wicked man his thoughts;  
let him turn to the LORD for mercy;  
to our God, who is generous in forgiving.  
For my thoughts are not your thoughts,

## *From the Desk of Father Nick*



Since before we rang in the new year of 2021, I've had a song stuck in my head. It's called "1921" and it's from The Who's 1969 rock opera "Tommy." While the musical is pretty strange overall, this particular song has lyrics that I find quite hopeful and thoughtful as we begin this new year. The lyrics state:

*I've got a feeling twenty-one  
is going to be a good year.  
Especially if you and me  
see it in together.*

I don't think The Who had a religious context in mind when writing these words, nor could they ever have imagined that in the year 2021 people throughout the world would be looking for a reason to hope and a fresh start after a challenging year gone by. Nonetheless, the lyrics provide for us some inspiration as we set out to make the most of the next 51 or so weeks.

First, as we read the words, "I've got a feeling twenty-one is going to be a good year," we are reminded that an optimistic attitude goes a long way. It doesn't mean that we are naïve to the difficulties that we may face, nor does it mean that we always see the glass as half full or look through rose-colored glasses. An optimistic outlook, however, does lighten our minds and hearts and assists us as we trust in God and his will for us. With optimism we are more often than not hopeful that God is in control and that he will lead us forward in life and closer to him in love.

Second, the words, "especially if you and me see it in together," are a reminder of the importance of the support of a community in helping to make our life's journey fruitful. One thing the year gone by has consistently reminded us is that we live not only for ourselves and our own well-being, but for the well-being of those around us, both neighbor and stranger alike. This helps to give purpose to our actions as we work to build up the Body of Christ in the Church.

And this community of faith doesn't solely exist among our brothers and sisters, but together with Christ our Lord, as well. We come to realize that we can do nothing without Jesus and together with him all things are possible. As we celebrate Jesus' baptism in the Jordan this weekend, we reflect upon the fact that our own baptism gives us a share in his life so that we never walk our journey alone. With this knowledge, I have a feeling that 2021 is going to be a very good year as you and I, together with Christ our Lord, encounter the joys and challenges of life and grow in faith and trust each day.

Reflection:

## The Baptism of the Lord

"You are my beloved son. In whom I am well pleased." Jesus is formally and publicly declared the beloved Son of God after His baptism. Jesus knows it and becomes empowered by it. Can we the baptized hear it, see it and experience it?

The Baptism of the Lord inaugurates not only the joy of God-become-man, but also the human dignity that God has bestowed on all the baptized and humanity. Though we humans are fragile and prone to mistakes, we are so lovable and valuable that even God becomes human. His name is Emmanuel which means God is with us.

A quick review of our recent Christmas celebrations attests to these realities:

First, Jesus accepts birth into human families to sanctify our homes. Then, Mary is not just the mother of Jesus, the carrier of the covenant-ark, but also the Mother of God. On the feast of Epiphany, all mankind, the Jews and the gentiles, Catholics and others, are universally and inclusively embraced and lavishly showered with God's love. No one is left out or behind. The more we reflect on the liturgical celebrations, the more we recognize that humans are gradually elevated.

The baptism of the Lord is the highest expression of God's love for mankind. In it, God the Father reaffirmed to Jesus and the public that, "You are My beloved son. In whom I am well pleased."


Years ago, St. Athanasius observed: "The Son of God became man so that we might become God." In other words, God becomes human so that humans can become divine.


We humans will never become God. If it were, it would be idolatrous or blasphemous. Yet we are much more than purely human. We are the members of God's family by which all the baptized men and women are dignified as His sons and daughters. Baptism is much more than a ritual purifying our original sin or its impact. It is the reaffirmation of human-divine relationship by which, as Jesus was affectionately proclaimed the Son of God. So, too, are we baptized men and women, sons and daughters of God.

Jesus is sinless and does not need to be baptized. Yet, through His baptism we are invited to experience with Him life and love in God's family. The feast invites us to hear with our own ears and experience in our own lives that we are specially chosen sons and daughters of God.
