## From the Desk of Father Nick



Recently, our Parish Pastoral and Finance Councils met to draft a pastoral plan for Christ Our Savior Parish. Every parish in the diocese is required to have a pastoral plan that helps to guide the parish through the next 3 to 5 years. The plan sets goals under the categories of Eucharist, Evangelization, Catechesis, Formation, and Stewardship that we can measure and evaluate during this timeframe. Much of our conversation focused on unity since Christ Our Savior is a recently merged parish. While the COVID pandemic continues to prevent us from hosting a variety of events and conversations that can build up our community, our goal setting is looking ahead to the day when we can physically gather and work and pray for this unity that we seek. The Pastoral Council will have one last opportunity to review the pastoral plan at our next meeting and then we will publish the plan in the bulletin for everyone to review and respond to.

There are a number of items from the Pastoral Council that I can share with you that have recently been approved. First, the Pastoral Council has created a Parish Mission Statement that sets the foundation for all we are about as a parish community. It states:

*We, the members of Christ Our Savior Parish, guided by the Holy Spirit, are dedicated to forming a community which focuses on bringing God's love to the world through sacraments, prayer, and service. We welcome, support, and attend to the whole well-being of each person from conception to death, without judgment.*

We look forward to working together to embody this mission in all we say and do.

The Pastoral Council also suggested that we offer some devotions each month so that we can gather as one to pray for different intentions in our community and to give thanks to God for all that he is working in our midst.

On the 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of the month, we will gather at 6:30 p.m. for the patriotic rosary, followed by Holy Mass at 7:00 p.m. Confessions will also be available beginning at 6:00 p.m.

On the 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesday of the month, we will gather at 6:00 p.m. for Eucharistic Adoration. Confessions will also be available during this time.

The location of these devotions will change each month and both devotions will be held at the same church in the same month.

March 3<sup>rd</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> will be at Saint Peter Church.

April 7<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> will be at Saint Boniface Church.

May 5<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> will be at Saint Cyril Church.

In order to help publicize these devotions and other activities in the parish we will publish a monthly calendar in the bulletin.

Finally, I want to draw your attention to the schedule of Lenten activities in this week's bulletin. It includes the schedule for Ash Wednesday, Stations of the Cross, Confessions, and other Lenten enrichment opportunities. While we look forward to having more opportunities for prayer and penance in Lents to come, I hope that these opportunities will help to make this Lent fruitful.

## Healing Touch

Jesus heals the sick mother-in-law of Peter by grasping her hand. She is healed and waits on them. Without Jesus' healing touch, she could not have served the meal, could she? As He had served her, so she in turn served Him and His disciples. They are hungry not just for food, but also for mutual support. Touching and being touched are important nourishment for human beings, aren't they? As we humans need food

for our bodies, so we need human touch for our wellbeing.

Throughout His public ministry, the physical touch of Jesus was extended and offered to needy people many times. From the restoration of sight to the blind man, new life to the dead girl of a widow, clean health to the Samaritan leper, hearing to the deaf and sight to the blind, to the laying of hands on the sick and the blessing on the children, Jesus' tangible touches have been the prevalent means of carrying out His healing ministry. His hands become the human vehicles carrying and transporting God's grace of divine healing.

The touch of Jesus is more than physical or bodily. He also touches the lives of the people by His kindness, understanding and compassion. Before reaching them by hands, he already had "pity on" or touched them by heart. The sick and needy also long for His touch.

Whether we are sick or not, His touch is to remind us that the divine mercy is approachable to and available for those who are in need. His touch is for healing, nurturing and comforting, not for exploitation, abuse or misuse.

The pandemic has limited and eliminated our physical contact and interpersonal interaction. Sexual scandals and exploitations have made us very cautious and suspicious of touching or hugging, which should be. Yet, should physical contacts be avoided at all costs? What are their liabilities versus the assets and benefits? Which one outweighs the other?

Many wonder if we can be normal or healthy humans without touching or being touched.

A lot of people also lament that they miss hugs from their children and grandchildren and vice versa. Some struggle with touchless situations when their family members who become infected with the Covid virus are dying alone and are not allowed to hold their hands before death! Virtual greetings, hand shaking and visual embracing via social outlets and networks may fill the emotional gaps for the time being, but they cannot substitute the real physical healing touch that Jesus offered to His people.




