March 14, 2021—4th Sunday of Lent

Reading I: 2 Chr 36: 14-16, 19-23

In those days, all the princes of Judah, the priests, and the people added infidelity to infidelity, practicing all the abominations of the nations and polluting the LORD's temple which he had consecrated in Jerusalem. Early and often did the LORD, the God of their fathers, send his messengers to them, for he had compassion on his people and his dwelling place. But they mocked the messengers of God, despised his warnings, and scoffed at his prophets, until the anger of the LORD against his people was so inflamed that there was no remedy. Their enemies burnt the house of God, tore down the walls of Jerusalem, set all its palaces afire, and destroyed all its precious objects. Those who escaped the sword were carried captive to Babylon, where they became servants of the king of the Chaldeans and his sons

until the kingdom of the Persians came to power. All this was to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah: "Until the land has retrieved its lost sabbaths, during all the time it lies waste it shall have rest while seventy years are fulfilled." In the first year of Cyrus, king of Persia, in order to fulfill the word of the LORD spoken by Jeremiah, the LORD inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: "Thus says Cyrus, king of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the LORD, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of his people, let him go up, and may his God be with him!"

From the Desk of Father Nick

This Friday is one of my favorite celebrations of the year. No, it's not Saint Patrick's Day. It's not even Easter or Christmas. March 19th, the feast day of Saint Joseph is a special day for me, as well as for the Church. Saint Joseph is the patron saint of the universal Church (the Church throughout the world). Just as God entrusted Mary and Jesus to Saint Joseph to guide them and keep them safe, so too does Saint Joseph work to guide and keep us, God's faithful people, safe as we journey through life. He is also the patron saint of a happy death because, as pious tradition states, he died in the arms of Jesus and Mary. A happy death does not mean that it is free from pain or suffering, but a death that we are prepared for, in the state of grace and ready to meet the Lord. In addition, Saint Joseph is the patron of immigrants, workers, fathers, travelers and employment. His intercession has been and continues to be powerful for the Church and for individuals who seek the help of one who was so close to the Lord in this life.

So why is Saint Joseph such an important intercessor for me? Because, just as he loved and protected his foster-son, Jesus, as if he were his own, so too he loves us and wants to see the best for us. This is a very powerful example to me as a priest. While priests have no children of their own, they are called upon as father to love our spiritual children as if they were our own so that they might vividly encounter the tender love of God in their lives. I ask his help each and every day so that my love may reflect the love of God to others.

Pope Francis declared this year as the Year of Saint Joseph in order to draw greater attention to this wonderful saint and foster deeper devotion to him and his powerful intercession. No matter your need or desire, trust that Saint Joseph is ready and willing to provide for you as he takes your prayers to God, our loving Father. This brief prayer is a favorite of mine. I hope it helps you ask for his help confident that he will ensure you are always taken care of.

O glorious St. Joseph, faithful follower of Jesus Christ, to you we raise our hearts and hands to implore your powerful intercession in obtaining from the heart of Jesus all the helps and graces necessary for our spiritual and temporal welfare, particularly for the grace of a happy death and the special favor we now request (mention your request). O guardian of the Word Incarnate, we feel animated with confidence that your prayers on our behalf will be graciously heard before the throne of God. O glorious St. Joseph, through the love you bear to Jesus Christ and for the glory of His name, hear our prayers and obtain our petitions. Amen.

Reflection

“For God so loved the world that He gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.”

Jesus’ timeless teaching and preaching continue to be the emblematic message for our Christian life and faith practice. The Gospel of St. John simply declares this obvious reality that has sometimes been forgotten or misunderstood.



God does not spare even His own Son for the sake of our salvation. Nothing can prevent God from loving us the sinners. No one should question or be doubtful about this reality and its teaching. God’s love toward sinners challenges us to believe in Him so that we have life eternal. Without believing it, we hurt ourselves. Believing means trusting in God’s love and being guided by His radical love.

This narrative is contextualized in the conversation between Jesus and Nicodemus, a leading Jewish leader and intellectual who comes to see Jesus at night-time. The contrasts of symbolism of light vs darkness, life vs death, divine initiative vs human response, and sinfulness vs salvation become intense. Had Nicodemus been in darkness too long to experience God’s love? He is courageous and determined to meet Jesus, isn’t he? Why not during daytime instead of night-time? What happens if others see his meeting with Jesus?

Whether we are in the same shoes as Nicodemus or not, he seems to invite us to walk with him out of the darkness of our bad habits, ignorance or misunderstanding to meet Jesus Himself. Jesus accommodates our busy schedule and life situations. A real light cannot be experienced until we walk out of darkness into the true light. Jesus is the true light by which the true and eternal life can be seen and we are enlightened. We come to know Him when we encounter Him.

If we are sinners, we need to know that we are not alone. God loves sinners. God is not interested in condemning or punishing us. God, like our parents, is “addicted” to loving His children, His sons and daughters.

Lent also encourages us to re-experience and “see” the love of God in the sacrificial death of His Son. All the Lenten disciplines, fasting, praying or almsgiving that we have embraced should lead us to the true knowledge and experience of the unselfish love of God. He comes to save us so that we can have eternal life.



Lenten Scripture Study with Father DiNardo

The season of Lent is a special liturgical season in which we focus our eyes on Jerusalem and the holy mountain of Easter. Through the theme of repentance, we celebrate the Paschal Mystery, the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus and our redemption. During this Lenten season, we listen more attentively to the Word of God and prepare ourselves to renew personal commitment to Christ and His Church made at our baptism. During this Lenten season, Father DiNardo will offer the study of the Passion and Resurrection Narratives found in the Gospels. Explore the Passion and Resurrection narratives in your personal preparation for Holy Week and Easter. The scripture study class will take place on **Monday evenings from 6:30 PM to 7:30 PM through March 29, 2021.** You are invited to Saint Boniface Church for the scripture class or by **Zoom**. c. 389–461 Feast Day—March 17. The patron saint of Ireland, Patrick was born in Roman Britain. He describes his life and ministry, including his work to convert the Irish people, in his short autobiography and testimony, *Confessions*. Kidnapped at age 16 by Irish raiders and sold into slavery in Ireland, his time spent in captivity transformed him spiritually. He was a lonely shepherd for six years before escaping and returning home. After returning home, his dream of converting the Irish from pagan belief propelled him to priestly studies in Gaul (now France). In about 432, Pope Celestine I consecrated him as a bishop and sent him to Ireland. For nearly 30 years, he preached tirelessly, made countless converts, founded monasteries, and established the primatial see at Armagh in modern-day Northern Ireland. Toward the end of his life, he made a 40-day retreat on Croagh Patrick mountain in present-day County Mayo. That gave rise to the pilgrimages that are made on the mountain to this day. Stories that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the Trinity and drove snakes from the island are unconfirmed legend.

new or gently used sheets (all sizes **except** King)




