

## *From the Desk of Father Nick*



This 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter is called “Good Shepherd Sunday” because the Gospel story always depicts Jesus as the Good Shepherd who tends to his flock and lays down his life for his sheep. It’s such a comforting image for us as we imagine Jesus carrying the sheep on his shoulders. Of course, we are his sheep and Christ is there to care for us no matter why we need his attention and concern.

Recently, there was a video going around on social media that highlights how the Christ the Shepherd is so good to us even when the sheep don’t always get it. The video starts with a sheep stuck in a ditch and boy trying to free the sheep. After some maneuvering and pulling the boy is able to the sheep unstuck. The sheep begins running off and takes a flying leap, only to get stuck in the same ditch again. Search “sheep jumps back into ditch” on YouTube if you want to see the video.

The video has an amusing aspect to it yet, it also does a great job at highlighting how we can fall back into the same traps that the Good Shepherd frees us from through his tender care and merciful love. Christ the Good Shepherd is so patient with us no matter how long it takes us to learn how to get out of and stay out of the ditches of our lives. While the video is only 30 seconds and ends once the sheep lands back in the ditch, I can only imagine that the boy goes and retrieves the sheep again, just as the Good Shepherd never gives up on us.

As we reflect this Sunday on the love of Jesus as he shepherds his people, the Church also gives thanks for our shepherds here on earth and prays for an increase of good shepherds as we mark this World Day of Prayer for Vocations. The purpose of the World Day of Prayer for Vocations is to publicly fulfill the Lord's instruction to, “pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers into his harvest” (Matthew 9:38; Lk 10:2). While the Church should be constantly offering prayers for this intention, this day affirms the primacy of faith and grace in all that concerns vocations to the priesthood and to the consecrated life. While appreciating all vocations, the Church concentrates its attention this day on vocations to the ordained ministries (priesthood and diaconate), consecrated life in all its forms, secular institutes in their diversity of services and membership, and to the missionary life.

Here at Christ Our Savior Parish we will soon be working to form a Vocations Council that will develop ways by which we can pray for an increase of vocations in our parish, as well as how we as a parish can promote happy, holy, and healthy vocations to the priesthood, consecrated life, marriage, and the single life. Please consider getting involved in the Vocations Council and keep a watch out for information in the bulletin about the first development meetings in the coming weeks.

May the Lord continue to reveal to us his love as our Good Shepherd as he provides shepherds here on earth to lead us in faith, hope, and love.

## Reflection



**Good Shepherd** is one of the best titles Jesus has embraced for His ministry in leading and caring for His flock. As a good shepherd, He lays down His life for His sheep. They trust and know each other. Pope Francis has characterized the “good shepherds” as the ones who smell like the sheep. The good shepherd is available, accessible and approachable to his flock. They live and die for each other. These

pivotal “AAA” qualities permeate the public ministry of Jesus.

**A**vailability: Timelessly and willingly, He is there for His flock. His name is “Emmanuel.” In front of the flock, behind them or mingling in their midst, He is there! He leads by following His sheep.

**A**ccessibility: He is accessible to all races, nationalities, people, rich/poor, young/old, man/woman, religions, and all faith affiliations. His platform is quite open and inclusive! All-and-non-denominational groups are welcome in His open arms.

**A**pproachability: His easily approachable attitude opens Himself to all. Nighttime or daytime, no time is a bad time or inconvenient! No topics are off limits! He is the man for all seasons! The wellbeing and welfare of His flock are His utmost concerns.

“The Lord is my shepherd, there is nothing I shall want.” What else do I need?

Our hats are off to the parents who have heroically been shepherding their families and children during this year of pandemic! Many young “sandwich” couples are also now responsible for bringing up their own children and for the care of their aging parents. Quietly and gently, they are double parenting.

Shepherding, like parenting, is much more than a job or even career. A call to commitment, written in human hearts, it is a lifelong pledge. No job description is adequate.


My personal gratitude is to those who have been there for me, my vocation and priestly life. As a parish priest, I have been called to “shepherd”. Whether or not I have been up to the task, many people have “shepherded” me lovingly: My parents, family, friends, colleagues and the parishioners who have been the members of my “flock.” You mean a lot to me though I am not sure if I mean anything to you or not.


