We have staples such as canned goods, cereals, pastas, and fresh fruits, vegetables, and breads courtesy of the St Vincent de Paul "Spark of Hope". Most of all the people need your prayers and financial support. Please realize that while the appeal is not in person the need is greater than ever. ## *From the Desk of Father Nick*



As a country, we pause this weekend to mark our annual Memorial Day. How unfortunate it is that some see this as no more than a day off at the start of the work week. Memorial Day gives us a profound opportunity to remember those who have gone before us, especially those who have died in service and protection of our country. As people of faith, a “memorial” day highlights the beautiful bond of love that God creates between us, his children, as we encounter each other throughout our lives. How great it is to realize that we can have such a profound effect on each other that we can’t help but be inspired by the witness and example of someone even after they are gone. In the Byzantine Catholic Church when a funeral or memorial liturgy is celebrated, the congregation proclaims, “may their memory be eternal,” recognizing the duty of those who remain to never forget those who have died and always commend them to God so that even from heaven they can continue to seek our good.

Yet, our national Memorial Day goes a step farther. To think of the thousands upon thousands who lost their lives in order that we might enjoy safety and freedom as American citizens. ## The Three-River City and the Trinity

As the beauty of the three rivers shapes the city of Pittsburgh, so the Holy Trinity forms our Catholic Christian faith.

The mystery of the Holy Trinity, like the majestic body of the Allegheny, Monongahela, and Ohio rivers beautifying the landscape of the city and its people with their elegant formation and curves, reveals God's love and mercy harmoniously to His

people in the three divine persons of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The flowing water of grace, the trinitarian blessings lavishly permeate all aspects of our human lives. Whether in creating us humans, in redeeming us sinners or in sanctifying us believers, the trinitarian God continues to love humankind regardless of whether we know it or not.

The Holy Trinity is a mystery which should compel us to form a proper attitude and mind set about it. This mystery is not a problem to conquer, a dilemma to control, a trouble to eliminate, a difficulty to solve or an obstacle to avoid. The mystery of Holy Trinity, like seductive love or attractive beauty, is not to be demystified or to be uncovered by human intellect. Its mysterious integrity and elegance should fascinate our sense of wonder, intensify our awe, motivate our curiosity and draw us into it.

Whether the three rivers are properly respected and treated or not, they have faithfully served the environment and all the people day and night, all four seasons, year after year since their unknown origin. They never complain or become vocal. In the name of human civilization, the skyscrapers, dams, highways, bridges, and many man-made structures were built on and around them. Sewage, toxic chemical outlets and other abuses or misuses have threatened their original purity and dignity. Yet the three rivers have silently refined themselves and diligently offered many untold services to the local areas: Sports, activities, transportation, entertainment, fishing, kayaking, the economy, farming, amenities and other conveniences.

Their eloquence and heroic beauty manifest and unite themselves at the POINT. Their magnificent unity not only stands for the unselfish unity-oriented togetherness of each river, but also symbolizes the greatness of their tangible aesthetics by rendering a panoramic view for the city and its surrounding area. Although the waters can be individually traced back from each of the rivers: the Allegheny, Monongahela and Ohio, their waters become one at the Point. Why not four or five rivers? Why in Pittsburgh? How old are they or will they last? Why one God and three persons? Good questions or not? No one knows! The Holy Trinity, like the three rivers of gentle love, is a mystery! Beautiful and elegant!

Mystery is much more than a subject for our human intellect or an object for our academic pursuit. It is the beauty for our lives and our joy. Its beholders can easily miss the point if they are distracted and pre-occupied by something else.

Thus, the celebration of the Holy Trinity seems to invite us all to immerse ourselves or jump into the three-river water of divine mercy and enjoy it. Whether in the morning or late evening, or in bad times or good, it is always refreshing to be there. The trinitarian grace, like a river, is there for us. Savor the mystery of the Holy Trinity!

To the Catholic Pittsburghers, we owe the existence of our own city to the three rivers and the gratitude of our faith to the Trinity!
