

Upon seeing the big crowd who follows Him, “Jesus’ heart was moved because they are like sheep without a shepherd”. The heart of the good shepherd is shaped by the sight of the flock and prompts Him to care for them. Jesus and His disciples even have their planned times for meal, prayer and rest interrupted.

Thus, the heart of being a good shepherd is to have a shepherding heart; watching and caring for his flock and their welfare. What constitutes a good shepherd is much more than having sets of intellectual keenness, brilliant mind, well-organized administrative skills, and fund-raising talents. The shepherd’s heart willingly puts aside everything to prioritize the care for His flock. Whether it is convenient or not, the urgency or immediacy of the sheep takes precedence. Many pastoral flexibilities and creativeness prompted by and done during the Covid 19 pandemic have served as good examples for such shepherding qualities. The livelihood and vitality of the flock mold the shepherds’ heart. A shepherd’s time and life are for the flock.

“It is not what you see or hear that matters, but how you respond to it matters”. We have seen and heard a lot, haven’t we? Bad, good, ugly, beautiful...etc. Have we been moved by such sights? How we respond to it will make us or break us as shepherding men and women.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta and her community often treasured their communal time before the Blessed Sacrament each day, not only to refresh themselves, but also to rejuvenate themselves after a long-day service. No one should interfere or interrupt her in such precious sacred times. Yet, while deeply praying before the Eucharist, she was informed about a poor man who was going to die soon and asking for help. Her focus was disrupted and her devoted time was “interrupted”. She got out to tend the dying man. Whether her use of time can be considered productive and efficient or not, her shepherding heart prompts her to embrace all such “inconveniences” and disrupts her own planned schedule. The willingness to embrace interference or interruptions seems to be a good signature for a good shepherd.

Prophet Jeremiah had harsh words to professional shepherds who misused their leadership and influence to divide their flocks. He warned them not to treat shepherding work as a bureaucratic job. Shepherding is not a nine to five job, but a calling and vocation.

We are not sure if Mother Teresa is a good shepherd or not, but certainly she has a shepherding heart.

Mary Magdalene 1221-1274 Feast Date: July 15

Mary, from Magdala in Galilee, was a disciple of Jesus who used her resources, or wealth, to help support him and his followers. The Gospel of Luke identifies Mary as the woman from whom Jesus cast out seven demons. The Gospels record that she was present at his crucifixion and burial. In all four Gospels, Mary was the first witness to the Resurrection and carried that news to the others. Because of this, St. Augustine called her “*apostola apostolorum*,” the apostle to the apostles. On June 3, 2016, Pope Francis raised her liturgical observance from a memorial to a feast—the same rank as the observances accorded to the apostles.

Christina the Astonishing 1150–1224



Feast Day: July 24

Born at Brusthem, Belgium, Christina had a seizure at age 21 that was thought to have killed her. At the Mass being said for her, she suddenly flew to the top of the church, later saying she had been to hell, purgatory, and heaven, and was allowed to return to earth to pray for suffering souls. This was one of the incredible events attributed to this poor, likely schizophrenic mystic, called “Christina Mirabilis,” who reportedly flew to treetops and rooftops to avoid smelling other people. She spent her last years in Saint Catherine Convent in Saint-Trond, and is a patron saint of psychiatrists, psychologists and those suffering mental illness.
