## *From the Desk of Father Nick*


Recently, Bishop Zubik informed us that the obligation to attend Holy Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation would be reinstated effective Sunday, August 15, 2021, the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. I know this is a welcome sign to many that we are returning to “normal” while what we hope is the worst of the COVID-19 pandemic behind us. I am grateful to all of you, whether you have been attending Mass throughout the months of the pandemic or have returned in recent months after being vaccinated and as restrictions have eased. It is clear that you do not attend Mass simply because it is the fulfillment of some duty, but because you are strengthened as you receive the Eucharist and share in the communal life of faith as the Body of Christ, the Church. As your faith is enlivened as you share in the celebration of the Eucharist at Holy Mass, I encourage you to invite others to come and participate with us, as well. Whether someone has been away for a few months because of the pandemic or for a few years because of some other influence in their life, there’s no time like the present to share your witness of faith with them and ask them to come and worship with you so that their heart might be strengthened. Finally, as a reminder, while the obligation to attend Holy Mass is being restored, you are never required to attend Holy Mass if it is going to put you or others at risk in terms of health or safety. If you are sick with a cold or the flu, please stay home so that others might not become sick. And as the winter months approach (unfortunately), please do not put yourself at risk if the roads are impassable. Loving God above all does not mean taking unnecessary chances.



## The Living Bread is the Bread of Life

As we listen to the discourse on the Bread of Life, Jesus reminds us that on the journey of life, despite its twists and turns, He continues to accompany us. No matter what, He cares for us; nourishes us with Heavenly food as He once fed the Israelites in the desert.

The Bread of Life is much more than food for our physical bodies. It is the Living Bread for our eternal life. When the hungry crowd looks for Him because they had been fed by Him previously, Jesus says to them: "Do not work for food that perishes, but for the food that endures for eternal life". By no means does it imply that the food for our body should be looked down upon or

undermined. Jesus, rather, reminds us that we should not become so preoccupied with earthly food that we forget and undervalue the Living Bread for our journey toward God's home. Our earthly food should not prevent us from longing for the heavenly banquet. Whether we eat to live or live to eat, eating wrong food or with wrong attitude can cause more trouble than blessings.

In the first reading of Exodus when the Israelites murmured and grumbled against God because of their hunger in the land of wilderness, Moses listened to their cry. God provided them with manna. Yet they were still not happy because these desert foods were not as tasteful and delicious as the ones they had eaten in Egypt. They did not realize that while they had enjoyed "good" food in Egypt, they were in the land of slavery where they had no freedom and access to their God. Should the pleasures of these bodily foods make them numb or indifferent to the real food of freedom that only God can give? Can we be really free without God?

The Bread of Life also exemplifies the selfless food that Jesus Himself is identified with. He is the life-giving bread, unselfishly broken and offered to the faithful. Once we consume and are nourished with such an unselfish diet, we are challenged to become unselfish with one another. We cannot genuinely receive Jesus, the Bread of Life, without becoming the food of life for one another. Food for our belly provides temporary satisfaction. Yet, receiving Jesus Himself, the food of life and for life, makes us not only radically unselfish, but also less greedy and more fulfilled. Greed, like a bottomless container, is insatiable and can never be filled to capacity.

May Jesus, the Living Bread and the Bread of Life, continue to nourish His church, strengthen her members and bring us all into eternal life.



### Saint John Vianney

**1786-1859—Feast Day: August 4**

Born near Lyon, France, this farmer's son studied for the priesthood for many years, and eventually was ordained more for his devoutness and good will than for other qualities. But he became a model parish priest in Arsen-Dombes, where he served for 40 years. He was devoted to his parishioners, and became famous for rigorous preaching and insights in the confessional. The Cure of Ars, as he was known, spent up to 18 hours a day hearing the confessions of pilgrims who sought him out. He is the patron of parish priests.
