



## *From the Desk of Father Nick*

### **TASTE AND SEE THE GOODNESS OF THE LORD**

In the responsorial psalm today we pray, “taste and see the goodness of the Lord.” Our thoughts may naturally focus on the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of Jesus by which we are fed when we come to Mass. While the small morsel we receive in Holy Communion may not seem like enough to provide sustenance and strength, it is the food that nourishes our heart and soul to receive the gifts of God that we might be fulfilled to faithfully follow the path to heaven. However, these words don’t only apply to the Eucharist. We get a taste of God’s goodness and love in everything and everyone he has created and provided for us to know the ways he is at work for us.

My favorite way to get a taste of the goodness of God is to enjoy the beauty of creation. Whether sitting along the shore of the ocean or a lake, hiking through the hills or forest, or spending time in the backyard or garden on a summer day. Moments like these are opportunities to consume all of the wonderful things that God has made for our pleasure and benefit. We can be reminded how generous God is to us as we witness the vastness of the seas, the heights of the mountains, and the endless varieties of flowers and produce. In many ways, we can’t comprehend the immense beauty of creation as, in a similar way, we can’t comprehend the infinite power of God’s love and goodness in our lives.

The challenge for us as we taste and see the goodness of the Lord in so many ways is to allow others to come to know God’s goodness through us. May our generosity allow the love of Jesus to overflow through us who, as one of God’s amazing creations, reveal his heart to others.



## THE BREAD OF LIFE FOR OUR JOURNEY

**On the verge of desperation, the Lord is already there!**

“This is enough, O LORD! Take my life...” Eliah asks God to end his miserable life after his successful intercession to

eliminate many pagan prophets and escape from persecutions. He does not want to put up with the hardship anymore. “He lay down and fell asleep under the broom tree, but then an angel touched him and ordered him to get up and eat.” Two times, he was ordered to eat hearth cake and drink water. Strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.

Like Eliah, we have experienced such desperate or hungry-thirsty situations, haven't we? Such a vulnerable life can easily become boring and meaningless! As volunteers or workers in our church, we are often misunderstood or criticized. Our good ideas, accomplishments and success are unacknowledged, underappreciated or ignored. We feel mistreated and abandoned not only by our colleagues and the people we serve, but also by God. If so, please talk to God. He is near and dear and always ready to hear our frank and sincere feelings.

As Eliah needs food for his journey to the Mount of God, so we, the faithful, are also in need of the Bread of Life for our faith journey. The cake and a jug of water provided by the angel of God is much more than mere physical food for Eliah's hungry belly. It is even more than mental motivation to uplift or cheer him up during his lowest moments. His journey of forty days is much longer than the one-day trip that he had anticipated. Whether Eliah behaves as a child-like or childish man, the Lord is always with him.

I am honored and humbled, but also poignant and helpless, to listen to some candid expressions of folks who are bed-ridden with long-time illness such as: “Father, when is it my turn?” or “when am I allowed to die?” I do not know how to respond to their struggles and suffering. Like Eliah, are they prolonging life or delaying death? Is it scandalous or taboo to ask such questions?

As the Living Bread, Jesus does not necessarily take away our problems or make our life easier, rather, He strengthens us at the vulnerable moments of our journey back to God. How long/short, physical/mental, simple/complicated, or personal/relational is our life journey? Only God knows! There is not a short cut to God's home. Our earthly life is a part of our eternal life in which Jesus continues to be the Living Bread of our journey. His birth, public ministry, suffering and death are the testimony for the meaning of life and the pathway to the house of God the Father. Jesus means what He says and He says what He means. Jesus means what He does and He does what He means. He is there for us, not only as the Life-Giving Bread, but also our companion for the journey.

Jesus is the reason d'être for our life, for our very existence and being. Without Him, life is hopeless. But with Him, life is hopeful: We not only survive; we thrive!


