



From the Desk of Father Nick



Today the Church throughout the world celebrates the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. There are many unique graces that we attribute to our Blessed Mother Mary. These graces are particular gifts God gave to her in order to prepare her to be the mother of His Son. For instance, in December we celebrate the Immaculate Conception of Mary, honoring her as being conceived without the stain of original sin and keeping her free from sin throughout her life. When the archangel Gabriel comes with the message from God asking Mary to be the Mother of God, the angel greets her as “full of grace.” To be full of grace means that there is no room for anything evil, hence, she is free from sin. And while Mary could have said “no” to the request of God because of the gift of free will, her heart is so pure and loving that she says “yes” without hesitation and brings Christ into the world.

The celebration of the Assumption is the culmination of our belief in the unstained goodness of the Blessed Mother. To be free from sin throughout her life, to carry the child Jesus in her womb, to witness the public ministry, passion, and death of Jesus, and to have all of the children of God entrusted to her care as our mother allows her a share in the fullness of God’s glory in heaven. While we will need to await the resurrection of the body on the last day before we can see God face to face, Mary shared in that privilege from the moment of her death so that she might love us and intercede for us as our heavenly Mother.

As we celebrate this wonderful Feast day, let us give thanks to God for the wonderful gift of Mary our Mother. May she continue to intercede for us and may we continue to experience the love that pours forth from her Immaculate Heart.

Joyful Mary!

The Assumption of Mary celebrates the elevation or the taking up of Mary into heaven. Her final home or destiny there invites us to map out our earthly pilgrimage and navigate our journey so that we may reach the same destination with Her in the future. Her path is to reach out with joy.

Throughout Mary's life, She is constantly on the way or on the move. From following her husband Joseph for data census before giving birth to Jesus, escaping with Her family to Egypt from Herod's persecution, taking Jesus to the temple and finding Him again there, then going to the wedding at Cana, accompanying Her son in various situations and walking with Him on the way to Calvary, to holding of Her son's body when it is taken down from the cross... Mary is on the road. Finally, with her presence with disciples in the Upper Room at Pentecost, Mary's activities express the liveliness of her faith. Mary is animated. Never stagnant, boring and coercive, her faith is a living expression of her joy.

Mary's Magnificat echoes her gratitude to God so joyfully that she could not contain her happiness within herself. She goes out in haste and shares the good news with her cousin, Elizabeth. Her joy becomes so contagious that those whom she meets can immediately feel it. Elizabeth shares her enthusiasm and says, "Who am I that the mother of my Lord comes to see me?" Even the baby in Elizabeth's womb can feel it too. Mary's satisfaction is fulfilled by her experience of being in love with God. Her joy is anchored in God, Her savior, not in something else or someone else. Her happiness is to share, not to keep it for Herself.

Without being rooted "in God," our joy can easily become selfish, superficial or egoistic.

This Solemnity of the Assumption of Mary into heaven marks the restoration of the Sunday obligation to attend Mass in person. "Watching" Mass via social outlets or having a free weekend is no longer a norm, isn't it? We wonder what meaning this message of obligatory Mass attendance implies. Are we, the faithful, forced to go to celebrate the Eucharist feast? Where is room for our human freedom, free will or discernment in our practice of faith? That being said, let us ask Mary: Was she obligated to carry baby Jesus in Her womb, to visit Her cousin Elizabeth, to marry Joseph and to embrace other sacrifices? Is there any responsible freedom without sacrifice?

The Assumption of Mary seems to invite us to uplift our worship and practice our faith above minimal requirements. We are also urged to exercise our own good judgment as to if, where, and how you attend Mass. Rather being blindly bound merely by duty and obligation, Mary reaches out freely and is "on the move" and "on the way" to carry out the will of God joyfully. From Her freedom of heart for the common good, social responsibility and communal-personal conscientiousness, she serves God and others. May we follow Mary's unselfish way and embrace Her joyful and positive attitude.


