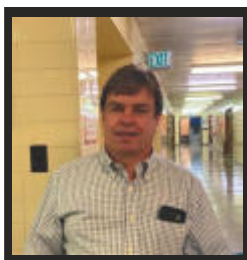
CCD ON THURSDAY EVENINGS FROM 6:00—7:15 pm

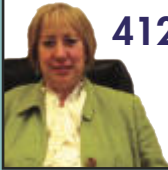

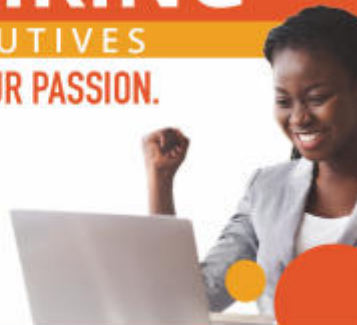
