

# LETTER FROM THE PASTOR | REV. JOHN J. DETISCH



Because of very early bulletin-printingdeadlines, this is my first opportunity to wish you a very Happy New Year! I pray that 2022 will bring us all much-needed peace,

after a very stressful two years. Let US control the atmosphere in and around our lives, and not the other way around. The pandemic is still here, and we will all continue to deal with it. But, let us make our own atmospheres to be filled with peace, joy, fun, and rest. PUSH BACK on the stress. Again, do yourselves a favor: stop watching the news! Catch the headlines, stay informed, and turn the channel to your favorite mindless, comedy station!

Today is the celebration of the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, bringing the Christmas Season to a close. With this Feast, it is so important that we keep close to our hearts those promises spoken for us at our own Baptism, and spoken by us at our Confirmation: "Do you reject sin, so as to live in the freedom of God's children?" I DO!! "Do you reject the glamor of evil, and do you refuse to be mastered by sin?" I DO!! "Do you reject Satan, the father of sin and the prince of darkness?" I DO!! Let's take another look at those questions ... as well as our resounding answer ... and compare that to how we have been or are living our lives. If we honestly, and proudly answer "I DO" to those promises, then why is there still sin in our lives?

With the conclusion of the Christmas season on Monday, Tuesday begins the season of Ordinary Time. According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, "Christmas Time and Easter Time highlight the central mysteries of the Paschal Mystery, namely, the incarnation, death on the cross, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus Christ, and the descent of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. The Sundays and weeks of Ordinary Time, on the other hand, take us through the life of Christ. This is the time of conversion. This is living the life of Christ. Ordinary Time is a time for growth and maturation, a time in which the mystery of Christ is called to penetrate ever more deeply into history until all things are finally

caught up in Christ. The goal, toward which all of history is directed, is represented by the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe." Ordinary Time now goes until Shrove Tuesday, March 1st, for the next day is Ash Wednesday, bringing us into the season of Lent. Ordinary Time will then resume on Monday, June 6<sup>th</sup>, the day after the great Feast of Pentecost, which closes the Easter Season.

I believe we had a wonderful Christmas season. (Personally, it is the worst when it falls on a Saturday or a Monday because we go three straight days, and it can be exhausting. Next year, it is on a Sunday, which is great! However, we lose a collection! In 2023, it is on a Monday, and we will have 6 Masses on Christmas Eve!) But, I wanted to thank our whole Pastoral Team here at St. Jude's for all the work they did to make for a beautiful St. Jude Christmas. I know the Music Ministry worked hard for weeks to prepare. They were spectacular, as always! I thought the attendance was really good, with all things considered. I am especially warm-hearted about the good crowd we have at Midnight Mass ... at midnight! That particular celebration just reminds of the sacred beauty of the Christmas night ... or, really, the very early morning of the Incarnation: the quiet ... the cold ... the darkness ... the light of a star. Midnight Mass and the Easter Vigil are my favorite Masses of the year!





#### Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments

#### **Online Gaming**

72% of teens, both male and female (ages 13-17) play video games. More than half of those teens said they have made new friends online. The National Center for Missing & Exploited Children analysis of Cyber Tipline reports has found that gaming platforms are more often used in the online enticement of young boys than any other group of children. It is important for parents to talk to their child about safety in online gaming. Some important guestions to ask are: Have you ever been cyberbullied while gaming? Do you know what information is OK to share about yourself while gaming? Has anyone talked about sex while you were gaming or asked you to send pictures of yourself?
