

LETTER FROM THE PASTOR | **REV. JOHN J. DETISCH**



Well, Sunday is the 23rd day of January in the year 2022. That means that it is 10 year to the day that I began ministry as Pastor of St. Jude the Apostle Church! TEN YEARS

already! And, do you know, that when I come through the doors from the office to the Church each Sunday, there is still a feeling that I am the *new* Pastor! I really can't believe that much time has passed! The truth of this reality set in last Sunday, as I was locking the Church up after Masses. I just stood there for several minutes and was just looking over the Church, and my mind just wandered a bit: I remembered sitting in the pews when I was only 9 years old, and the Church was brand new; wondering how the cross was hanging there like that ... I remembered walking down the center aisle as the new Pastor and not being able to read the words in the music At the same time, we need to pray for ALL of human life book, because the lighting was so bad ... I remembered the 8th grade graduations, and how these kids are now in very successful careers ... I recalled the painful funerals, the wonderful weddings, the tons of baptisms, Bishops Trautman and Persico preaching the Confirmations ... the white chair in the sanctuary with the stole draped over it, waiting for the Papal Conclave to elect a new Pope. I could've stood there all day! Even though my parents were Founding Members, we moved to Our Lady of Peace Church when I was 6 months old because we built a home by McDowell High School. But, my parents never lost their love & devotion to St. Jude's. After 10 years, I now know why! Looking back, I know that the mistakes have been too many to count, and I would probably do a million things different if given the chance. But, I promised to you 10 years ago that I would make the Sunday (Saturday) Mass the center and focus of this parish, and I have truly tried to make that true and real. I think the world and this nation has gone crazy, to be sure. But, I do believe that St. Jude's Parish is a "constant" in our lives: that, no matter what happens outside the walls of our Church, inside of it we can all find the powerful Word of God, a fully prepared homily, and the gift of the Eucharist to be our source of strength and courage, as well as an "anchor", to continue to be disciples in this world. This parish has been such an inspiration to me!

It is a parish that truly has its doors open to everyone! I have no intentions of going anywhere else right now. I don't know what the needs of the Diocese will be for me in the future. But, until then, let's keep this parish strong by continuing to actually BE the courageous and faithful disciples that the Lord Jesus calls us to be ... the courageous and faithful disciples that the surrounding world *needs* us to be.

We are in the middle of the annual "9-Days for Life", which is an annual Novena to pray for the protection of human life. The diocesan newsletter came out Wednesday, which had a great article about it. If you haven't yet, you can sign up for daily prayers and intentions to be sent to your email or texted to your phone. Just go to: https://www.respectlife.org/9-dayssignup. With this weekend marking the 49th anniversary of the signing of Roe vs. Wade, making abortions legal in this country, we realize that it is in the realm of possibility to overturn this. So, prayer is sure needed! ... from the womb to the grave and everything in between ... should be truly considered as God's gift. Human life must be respected. Let's save the judgement of people's lives for God.

By the way, it has come up a bunch of times lately, so let me clear it up! Many people think that "Art's Bakery" on West Ridge Road was my father's, Art Detisch. It was not!! Originally, my father and his partner, Harry Shea, owned Frontier Cake Shop, which is now the right half of Vicary's Insurance in the plaza between Lincoln Avenue and Mohawk Drive. (The left half of Vicary's was the original Frontier Pharmacy!) In 1975, my father went out on his own and opened up "The Art Detisch Bakery" across from St. Julia's Church, which is now a tattoo parlor. Art Evans owned "Art's Grocery", which had a bakery in it. Many years ago, they dropped the grocery to make it just "Art's Bakery". When there was both bakeries, supply companies were constantly confusing the orders, so my brothers and I were always going up their to get our sugar bags and bringing them *their* flour sacks! Once we got back, my brother Bill would go back to sleeping on our flower sacks!

Have a great week! Let's see what the next 10 years brings!


