SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

ou might recall, around this time two years ago, I shared that on 30 September 2019, the liturgical Memorial of Saint Jerome (best known for his translation of the Bible into Latin and for his commentaries on the Gospels) on the inauguration of the 1,600th anniversary of his death, Pope Francis in an Apostolic Letter, "Aperuit Illis," instituted the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time to be the Sunday of the Word of God. He wrote: "May the Sunday of the Word of God help his people grow in religious and intimate familiarity with the sacred Scriptures." He stressed how essential it is for Catholics to familiarize themselves with Christ's written word, highlighting: "a day devoted to the Bible should not be seen as a yearly event but rather a yearlong event." Within the document, he underscores how we "urgently need to grow in our knowledge and love of the Scriptures and of the Risen Lord, who continues to speak his word and to break bread in the community of believers. For this reason," he says, "we need to develop a closer relationship with sacred Scripture; otherwise, our hearts will remain cold and our eyes shut, struck as we are by so many forms of blindness." The relationship between the Risen Lord, the community of believers, and Sacred Scripture, he states, "is essential" to our identity as Christians.

He expressed that with this Apostolic Letter, he wished to respond to many requests he received from the People of God that the entire Church celebrate, in unity of purpose, a Sunday of the Word of God.

"I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God," Francis said, noting: "This Sunday of the Word of God will thus be a fitting part of that time of the year when we are encouraged to strengthen our bonds with the Jewish people and to pray for Christian unity. This is more than a temporal coincidence: the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God has ecumenical value, since the Scriptures point out, for those who listen, is the path to

year process of listening and dialogue. This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal," proposed by Vatican II, is both a gift and a task. Here's a snapshot of what some had to say:

authentic and firm unity." The Holy Father has asked parish communities to find their own ways to mark this Sunday with a certain solemnity. This weekend, once again, we have enshrined the ambo where the near Scriptures are proclaimed, a copy of the Book of the Gospels, opened to the Gospel passage for the day. It is a copy of the Saint John's Bible (formatted for liturgical use): the first completely handwritten and illuminated Bible commissioned by the Benedictine Abbey since the invention of the printing press, over 500 years ago. Work first began in 1998, and it took ten years to complete. Its mission stated: "At the dawn of the twenty-first century, Saint John's Abbey and University seek to ignite the spiritual imagination of believers throughout the world by commissioning a work of art that illuminates the Word of God for a new millennium."

And in honor of this year's celebration, we invite you to join us this Friday, January 28, on the Memorial of St. Thomas Aquinas, Priest and Doctor of the Church (patron of Catholic schools. colleges, universities. of philosophers, theologians, and booksellers) for a viewing of: "The Illuminator and a Bible for the Twenty-first Century." Quoted as being "one of the extraordinary undertakings of our time," the 49-DVD unpacks minute this monumental achievement and

historic undertaking. **Donald Jackson**, world renowned calligrapher and illuminator, in collaboration with artists and theologians, has woven word and image in this once-in-a -millennium project.

The longtime scribe to Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth's Crown office, Jackson used ageold calligraphic techniques to create a modern manuscript: egg yolks, gold, silver, and platinum in the illuminations; goose quills and hand-ground ink on carefully selected calf-skin vellum for the text. The imagery incorporates symbols as diverse as Navajo basket-weaving patterns to microscopic views of today's viruses, even cosmological images inspired by the Hubble Space telescope.

Whether you have a deep reverence for Scripture, are drawn to the precise work of the quill, are an avid art collector, or are fascinated by the making of the Saint John's Bible, we now have the opportunity to experience this project as a parish family.

We are happy to offer two viewing times. Join us in church, this Friday, following the 8:30 AM Daily Mass (**9** AM — **11** AM), or later that evening from **6** PM — **8** PM). Refreshments will be provided in the narthex before each showing. A guick
