# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Last Monday, staff members and I kicked off our **Summer** Fun and Fellowship (see Page 3, and mark your calendars for future events) by meeting up at the Cedar Lee Theater to view "The Wizard of Oz" on the big screen, in honor of what would have been Judy Garland's 100th birthday (June 10, 1922). A friend of mine and one other parishioner, who also brought a friend, joined us. We nearly had the theater to ourselves! Did you happen to make plans at another theater or go at a different time? The MGM filmstrip logo with Leo the Lion roaring in the center, which begins the picture, bears the Latin phrase, "Ars Gratis Artis," "art for art's sake." This serves as a great reminder as to one of the original intentions of motion pictures—to entertain and delight — something worthwhile and done for its own sake. The 1939 light-hearted and wholesome film (which made the Vatican's Best Film list in 1995) was a pleasant distraction from the serious difficulties our nation and the world over are presently enduring.

Not wishing to lose sight of the above reality, the staff and I felt it important and timely to offer an evening with a "town hall meeting" format regarding gun violence, which has yet to cease since the tragedy in Uvalde, Texas. This Wednesday, June 15, at 7 PM, we will gather in the Small Hall in the Banquet Center to learn, discuss, share, and pray. This is an opportunity for respectful dialogue and to offer a platform to process, share, and offer practical actions in response to these atrocities that appear to be unique to our country. I invite you to visit our website www.stnoel.org to view links to various statements on gun violence, including the recent letter from the USCCB to Congress. As a parish family, I would hope to echo the words of Pope Francis: "It is time to say enough to the indiscriminate trafficking of arms. Let us all commit ourselves so that such tragedies can never happen again." I think we can all agree, to do nothing or have no response, is not an answer.

This weekend, as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we are reminded of our profession of faith in a Trinitarian God: one God in Three Persons, existing as an eternal movement of giving and receiving love. Created in that very image, may our words and actions as faith-filled women and men better reflect this reality.


