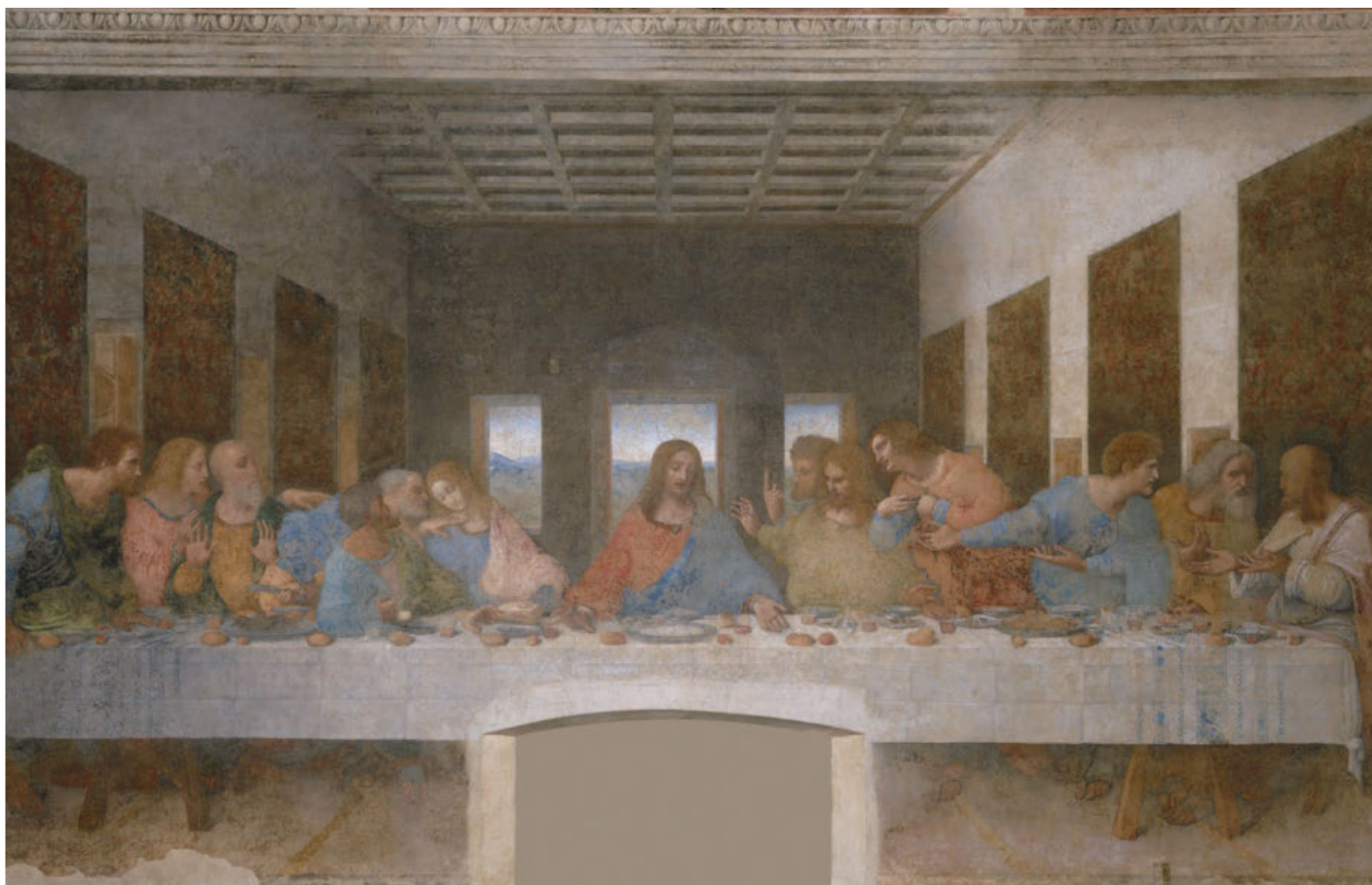

FROM SYNOD ➔ EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Last Saturday, over **250** delegates gathered at the Cleveland Public Auditorium to pray, share, listen, and discern the next steps, following our participation in the Synod at the parish level. This gathering concluded the diocesan phase. Over the past eight months:

- Over **200** facilitators were trained from Oct 2021—Jan 2022
- **118** parishes (**64%**) conducted at least one listening session from Dec 2021—Mar 2022 (**Saint Noel offered 5 in-person sessions, 1 ZOOM meeting, and 1 weekend Mardi Gras doughnut event with informal conversations following Masses**)
- **168** reports have been submitted
- **12,794** people participated in-person
- **610** responded to an on-line questionnaire
- All **10** college campus ministries participated
- Just over **50%** of participants were young people (under the age of **30**); comprised of PSR, Catholic schools, high schools, and young adult groups

The response to the Synod in Cleveland far exceeded anyone's expectations, especially in light of all the challenges parishes faced with timing and the pandemic. A final diocesan synthesis report is underway, which will make its way to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). From there, it will be sent to Rome. The current working document outlines the process followed during last weekend's gathering, and included the top ten priorities and most common themes that emerged during the consultation. We will be sure to share this report, as well as our parish report, in the short time ahead. Following last weekend's gathering, a Eucharistic procession from the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist to the historic St. Peter Church, Cleveland, took place, kicking off what I briefly touched on two weeks ago: the **National Eucharistic Revival**. Over the next three years, every Catholic diocese, parish, school, apostolate, and family is invited to be part of renewing the Church by enkindling a living relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. The Church in the United States, particularly right now, is in need of healing, unity, formation, and sending. The Eucharist as the "source and summit of the Christian life," especially in the context of the Mass, is uniquely capable of being an "efficacious sign of grace" (CCC 1130) to all those ends. This is most fitting to share on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ (Corpus Christi). As we will hear prayed after Communion this weekend: "Grant, O Lord, we pray, that we may delight for all eternity in that share in your divine life, which is foreshadowed in the present age by our reception of your precious Body and Blood."
