

Pastor's Column - December 18-19, 2021 - 4th Sunday of Advent

Dear fellow parishioners, I was in St. Louis, MO, during last week's terrible tornadoes. I am safe, everyone I was with is also. Tornadoes touched down within five miles south of me, one began the terrible trek of destruction. We were at the funeral home when the warnings and sirens went off and were ushered to the most central room with instruments, cell phones, etc. and the first thing I said was – "we're going to pray". Then we proceeded to rehearse the music for the Mass – praising God, praying to Him, I think that kept us safe and no one will change my mind to that.

We need to pray for the victims of the disaster. Lives lost, homes, possessions, "whole lives" of the survivors completely gone. Images don't tell the entirety of the loss. We see homes, properties demolished, but what about other tangible and intangible things that were valuable? Memories? Items held dear that can't be replaced? Identification documents and other important papers? I can't even think of what will have to do to replace such things. In this we give thanks for those who survived and pray for the souls that were lost. As in so many natural disasters, when the shock wears off and the desire of others to help begins to wane... the reality of life sets in maybe with a sense of abandonment.

Realization of what was lost sets in along with despair. Years after such tragedies, people ravaged by the event/s try to rebuild from the devastation to survive and hopefully thrive. But is there still interest in them? Sometimes it is just an anniversary note in the news... then nothing more...

I wonder if the chosen people of God felt like that. The shock wears off and reality sets in and the questions come: "Where is the One who said He would be there for us? *Where is God?*" I can only imagine what the absolute loss and abandonment would feel like.

We must keep interest for the devastated at the fore. Keep praying; maybe make "notes to self" to follow how things are going and how to continue to help. We get caught up in the "new" issues and attention shifts – like some of us with short attention spans (Oh.. something new and shiny!). We have been conditioned for that with our media – that is why we call it "news"…

The same happens with our relationship with God. The moments pass when we think about God (Christmas, Easter) and then what? God doesn't forget about us, just the opposite – we forget about Him. We need to anchor and continue to remember. Maybe seek out something or someone to help – even a stranger. Select a project, a tragedy that needs long term support. Place it in God's hands then yourself, time, talent, treasure as well... as His hands on earth to do something. The same with God... makes notes, keep it in the fore. He hasn't forgotten... we have... only you can change it.

Let us pray for each other. Know that you are in mine always.



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Born in Holland, St. Peter Canisius (May 8, 1521 – December 21, 1597) was a preacher, teacher, and writer throughout his whole life. At the age of 19, he received a master's degree from the university at Cologne. Soon afterwards, St. Peter met Peter Faber, the first disciple of Ignatius of Loyola, who influenced him so much that he eventually joined the Society of Jesus.

St. Peter Canisius founded colleges and seminaries, served as a missionary, cared for the sick or imprisoned, and wrote close to eight volumes of letters — many about St. Cyril of Alexandria and St. Leo the Great.

A man blessed with many talents, St. Peter Canisius is a wonderful example of a man who developed his talents to further God's work here on earth.


