Dear Folks,

We now enter the first Sunday of Lent, 2025. It is a time the Church calls us all to a retreat with many facets. The standards are to enhance our strength character in the life of the Faith by our prayers, penance, and almsgiving. Let is a time when there is a rise in numbers of people going to Mass during the week. In a week two we will find an increase of those going to Confession. With Confessions every night of the week we often meet the meek and mild souls who



frequent the box as well as the big fish. Big fish??? ... you know. And almsgiving with the Bishop's Lenten Appeal. Such a great idea indicating a concern for the poor souls none of us will ever meet. If we didn't have the BLA we would have to create one.

The Lenten Appeal is a trajectory to future embraces in the next world. People we never knew here but the same who will never forget us beyond the gates of Heaven. Of course that all assumes that we believe in the Gates of Heaven and a life beyond for the needy of this world. It reminds me a lovely old ditty about who we find beyond the gates, or look upon us with "Stunned Surprise."

On the positive side we have the actual virtues: Faith, Hope, Love, Prudence, Justice, Temperance, and Fortitude.

G.K. Chesterton, Catholic Convert and literary commentator once addressed the Church as a type of Green House with many different types of flowers with different colors and lovely scents of aroma. And so it is. Lent offers us time to wander through the stacks of stories of saints who can stir our hearts and affect our behaviors. #### NOTABLE KNIGHT - CORNELIUS ALEXANDER McGILLICUDDY -

Better known as Connie Mack, was born into a large Irish Catholic immigrant family in 1862. As we are now in major league baseball's spring training, it is only right to highlight one of the pioneers of our national pastime. He became the owner and manager of MLB's original "Bad News Bears" in 1901 by taking over the Philadelphia Athletics. Mack considered it a personal challenge and committed himself to making the team a winner. He had a reputation for treating everyone with fairness and respect and managed the team for an amazing fifty seasons and became the first manager to lead a team to three World Series titles. Mack was enshrined into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1937.
