

LIVING THE FAITH

WEEKLY REFLECTION

“Let the children come to me and do not hinder them, for to such belongs the kingdom of God.” (Luke 18:16)

Did you know that at the very beginning of the Catholic Church, children were welcomed to the Eucharistic altar to receive Holy Communion? Infants commonly received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist all at once.

While the Roman Catholic Church began emphasizing the importance of understanding the Transfiguration of Jesus and Transubstantiation in order to receive Holy Communion – thus reserving its reception to adults and teens – most Eastern Churches continued the earlier tradition of infants receiving Holy Communion.

It was St. Pius X who, reflecting upon Christ’s command to “Let the children come to me,” wrote his decree *Quam Singulari*, allowing children who have reached the age of reason (around seven years old) to receive the Holy Eucharist. If you have never read this decree, look it up. It is beautifully written. Reinforcing the reality of the children’s innocence and closeness to God, Pius X wrote:

“[T]he fact that in ancient times the remaining particles of the Sacred Species were even given to nursing infants [indicates] that no extraordinary preparation now be demanded of children who are in the happy state of innocence and purity of soul, and who, amidst so many dangers and seductions of the present time, have a special need of this heavenly food.”



Yes, that’s me!

By lowering the age of First Communion, the saintly pontiff hoped “that children even from their tender years may be united to Jesus Christ, may live His life, and obtain protection from all danger of corruption.” So welcome to the Table of the Lord, young people of our parish! This Catholic Community of St. Mary Parish rejoices with you and your families!

LITURGICAL QUESTION BOX: ARE CATHOLICS ALLOWED TO DONATE THEIR ORGANS?

Yes, Catholics are allowed to donate their organs. In fact, the Catechism of the Catholic Church praises this practice when it notes that, “Organ donation after death is a noble and meritorious act and is to be encouraged as an expression of generous solidarity” (no. 2296).

The Church has a series of guidelines for health care providers called The Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholic Health Services. This document helps us see organ donation as an act of charity, but it also reminds us that we have to be sure that donations of organs by living donors do not “sacrifice or seriously impair any essential bodily function and the anticipated benefit to the recipient is proportionate to the harm to the donor” (no. 30); trained medical professionals can help to make this assessment. In the case of organ donation at the end of life, we must be sure of the intentions of the donor or of their proxy are always respected, and that the dignity of the human body is always respected.

In the end, we can look to Pope Saint John Paul II and his encyclical *Evangelium Vitae*, where he noted that organ donation is a beautiful act of expressing the culture of life, when “performed in an ethically acceptable manner, with a view to offering a chance of health or even of life itself to the sick who sometimes have no other hope” (no. 86).



Dear Saint Mary Parish and School Community,

Over the past two years, we have educated through a pandemic that challenged all our families. Although we maintained an in-person learning environment at Saint Mary School, it has not come without its difficulties. We have tried various strategies to provide and maintain an exceptional Catholic education for our students. After consultation with parish leadership committees, the school advisory committee, and diocesan leadership, a decision has been made to rebrand Saint Mary School into a multi-age classroom school model.

This decision to rebrand was not taken lightly and considered from many perspectives. Rebranding is the most prudent and effective decision at this time for our school, especially when looking at long-term operation and continued growth.

Since the spring of 2020, Saint Mary Parish has seen a marked decline in offertory-giving and attendance, which directly impacts the finances of both the parish and the school. Although efforts have been made to bring the offertory collection back to pre-pandemic levels, it is still too low to sustain the current model of the school. The parish has, for some time, been paying a significant subsidiary cost for the normal operation of the school. The pandemic has exacerbated the situation further with the decrease in donations and tithing. The parish cannot continue to support the school at the current level without significantly impacting its overall financial well-being.

Additionally, student enrollment has been in a slow and steady decline for our school since 2014. Despite offering an in-classroom education during the pandemic, we lost more students than gained. This also impacts the funding the school receives in terms of student spending, operations, and salaries. Therefore, with careful consideration and consultation, we were led to this decision.

Rebranding to a multi-age classroom model is not a unique or new idea and brings with it the eventual possibility of future expansion to include a 7th and 8th grade. Saint Mary School will switch from a traditional grade-based classroom model to a multi-age classroom model for grades 1-6. Kindergarten will remain an independent group. Preschool will not be impacted by the rebrand and will continue as the 3-4 year-old model with enrichment opportunity. Grade classrooms will be formatted as: first and second, third and fourth, fifth and sixth. We will continue to offer our specials and focus on STEM programming and our Catholic identity.

Benefits will include:

- Two years with the same teacher: develop stronger relationships with peers and teachers.
- More focus on individualized, differentiated education.
- Foster a sense of community cooperation rather than competition. Strengthen family atmosphere within classes.
- Greater opportunities for advancing students in the classroom.
- Sense of “ownership” and self-direction is the foundation for lifelong learning. Multi-age classrooms invite students to take more agency in their learning through centers, project-based learning, and leadership opportunities.
- Students have peer role models for work and problem-solving. Older students can help model creative and more sophisticated methods of solving problems that younger students can learn from. Dynamic gives older students a chance to develop independence and leadership through helping teach younger students.

This new model gives our students an excellent opportunity to grow in their learning and in their ability to apply the STEM foundations of communication, collaboration, creativity, and critical thinking. As a school, we are in a great position to make this transition and provide quality professional development for our teachers to implement a multi-age classroom. With our Emergency Assistance for Non-Public Schools funding, we are able to provide quality professional development over the course of the next school year and into the following school year.

This model also allows us the flexibility and space for future growth. With current class sizes as the foundation, and continued support and commitment from our families, there is the possibility to expand into additional grades over the next couple of years.

We are excited to begin this new journey at Saint Mary School. Thank you and God Bless!




