Dear Parishioners,

This month of January is designated as Right to Life month. This coming Friday, January 21st will be the 49th anniversary of the landmark decision Roe vs. Wade. A decision that has in many ways, divided our nation, challenged our core belief of the dignity of every human person. Our Catholic Christian belief is clearly stated in #2270 of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a personamong which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life." Even more pointedly the prophet Jeremiah 1:5 "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you, and before you were born, I consecrated you."

While the Catechism is clear and scriptures bring spiritual insight to this core belief, we are challenged to recognize that the Right to Human life begins at conception, but it is does not stop at this point. Nor are we meant to be "one issue" people. The late Cardinal Joseph Bernadine used the image of a "seamless garment." Suggesting that the dignity of Human Life is from womb to tomb and at every point in between. The CCC and our scriptures imply a consistent ethic of human life which challenges all of us to look at the bigger of all of life's issues, from the care for the unborn, to the Vietnam Veteran, to the Afghan Refugee, even to the person on death row. This call to the dignity of Human Life might at times push our personal belief system when we want swift justice for what might well be an injustice, or what might not seem fair or equitable from our own personal perspective. It challenges us to pay attention to the vulnerable, the elderly and every person who has no voice. It requires that we stand up for and defend the rights of those who feel as though their human person has been violated.

While the month of January is designated as Right to Life month, our consciousness of the dignity of life is a 24/7 responsibility as disciples of Jesus the Christ. His life and pattern of living set forth an example for our living. In the power and mystery of the Resurrection, may every human heart find hope, consolation, dignity, and peace.



Dear Parishioners,

Pope Francis wants to hear from you! Yes . . .he has asked bishops around the world to organize listening sessions in their parishes to discern world-wide what it means to be Church today and where the Holy Spirit is calling us as we create our future.

Bishop Malesic formally began this process with an opening liturgy at St. John's Cathedral last October. The Diocesan Office of Parish Life developed a process for these listening sessions and made available training materials to all parishes and Catholic Institutions.

The Resurrection Parish staff has scheduled four opportunities the week of January 23rd for parishioners to participate in this process of sharing, listening, and visioning.

Saturday, January 22 from 9:30 – 10:45 a.m. (A good time for PSR parents!) Tuesday, January 25 from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m. (ZOOM - register to receive the Zoom link) Wednesday, January 26 from 9:00 – 10:30 a.m. Wednesday, January 26 from 7:00 - 8:30 p.m.

An additional session is scheduled for those who have stepped away from the Catholic faith for whatever reason. Pope Francis wants to hear from them and why they became disenfranchised. This session will be held on **Thursday, February 17 from 7:00 – 8:30 p.m.** We hope you will extend an invitation to someone you know who no longer finds a home in the Catholic Church.

Once these sessions are completed a summary synthesis will be sent to the Diocesan Office of Parish Life. That office will compile a summary synthesis from all parishes and Catholic Institutions and send it to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and who will send the summary synthesis to Pope Francis.

We hope you will think about joining us in this most important process. To help you prepare to participate, please give some thought to the following two questions.

What do you find life-giving in your Catholic faith today? What do you think are the pressing issues challenging the Church today?

It is our hope that many parishioners will invest some personal time to reflect on these questions and participate in the sharing and listening opportunities offered for the good of our entire world-wide church.

Use the sign-up genius on our parish website or email blast to join the session of your choice by January 20.
