



My last two columns have featured the children, families and those who have been part of the sacrament preparation over the past year and years. I hope you enjoyed seeing the pictures as we do.

These moments celebrating the reception of Jesus in the Eucharist and the Holy Spirit in Confirmation are a special time for the child and the families and for us as parishioners.

Now is the time to continue receiving the Eucharist with the family of St. Anselm on Sundays, holy days, any day as well. This is supported by our time for private prayer, community prayer, service to others realizing we are the hands, the feet, and the heart of Jesus as we live our lives.

This growth is needed not only for our children but for us as adults. Are we taking time for Scripture reading and reflection? Are we seeking out spiritual reading books that help us integrate our faith and our daily commitments?

Many have subscriptions to "Give Us This Day" or "Magnificat". Both of these publications provide us with Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer in a shortened form of the Divine Office that priests and religious communities pray each day. Both publications also provide Mass readings of the day as well as stories of the saints and holy ones who have lived in the distant or recent past. Their lives portray our Catholic heroes whose lives witnessed to Jesus in ordinary and extraordinary ways bringing the Gospel through words and actions to others.

Spiritual reading may include reflection on longer writings of the people of Scripture who once lived on this earth and lived the challenges of life with an awareness of God and His marvels. They looked for these marvels and for that reason became aware of them and changed by them. Some spiritual reading books may help us in healing, aging, deepening our understanding of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, holy parenting etc. Want to find a good book? Give me a call.


