

continue to support and provide needed items to this pantry as well as to the Geauga Food Pantry.





Dear St. Anselm Family,

In April of 2021, Pope Francis, invited Catholics from every Catholic Diocese around the world to participate in the "Synod on Synodality." This past winter, many St. Anselm parishioners took part in the synod process either individually or in small groups. These gatherings included praying together, listening to one another, sharing one's experiences, and visioning about what it means to be a Church that proclaims and lives the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In March, we summarized the input received from all in our parish who participated in the Synod sessions. This summary was sent to the Diocese of Cleveland, who received over 160 other reports representing the 8 counties of our Diocese. On Saturday, June 11<sup>th</sup>, representatives from Catholic parishes, schools, and organizations came together at the Cleveland Public Auditorium to review and dialogue about the top 10 priorities. We were then invited to discern how the Holy Spirit is calling us to respond to these priorities.

Lifelong Faith Formation, Inclusion, Mission and Outreach, Experiences of Prayer, Community and Fellowship, Authority and Governance, Participation in the Liturgy,

Teamwork and Co-responsibility, Listening, Vocations

These priorities also reflect the responses we received from St. Anselm Parish.

The diocese is keenly aware of moving towards actions that help each parish to get in touch with and involve these priorities. We spent time on Saturday discerning our path toward that end and this dialogue will continue throughout this year. We will continue to keep you informed and involved in this process.

On June 12<sup>th</sup>, our Diocese began a three-year period of Eucharistic Revival. The candle burning next to the tabernacle is a symbol for us of this movement toward renewing our hearts and minds and enlivening our spirits so that the very Body and Blood of Christ we receive Sunday after Sunday will live in us and through us in our world.

Let us continue to pray for one another and our world that our love for the Eucharist may lead us all toward the peace of God's Kingdom.
