

FROM OUR ADMINISTRATOR

A PROMISE MADE IS A **PROMISE KEPT**

One of the downsides of buying things online is that vendors generally will only sell us something if we supply them with our email address. This means that they have the ability to continually send us follow-up advertisements. Sure, we can opt out of them or may keep receiving them thinking that they might be interesting. When one of those ads pops up and we think it might be a good deal, it's very important that we read the fine print at the bottom of the page. Oftentimes, the fine print will tell us that by accepting an item on sale, we commit to a subscription or additional items for a stated period into the future. One purchase might lead to numerous purchases. Do we only want the sale item, or are we ready to make the commitment and fulfill the obligation?

This weekend in the Gospel, we hear Jesus ask His disciples who do people say that He is. Then, He asks them for their own opinion, to which Peter, in his own impetuous way, blurts out, "You are the Christ." (Mk 8:29) Jesus begins to wonder if Peter fully understands what this pronouncement means for his own life, and so Jesus tells Peter and the others the He will suffer and die because He is the Christ (the Messiah) - and will also rise after three days. Peter doesn't want Jesus to live out the implications of His role, to which Jesus tells Peter, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny

himself, take up his cross, and follow me." (Mk 8:34) Jesus tells Peter that if Peter wants to be a follower then there's a price to pay. The Letter of James reminds us that talk is cheap. If we claim to be people of faith, then we need to give evidence of it in the way we act - "So also faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." (Jas 2:17) However, in living out our commitment of faith, we are not alone or unsupported. The prophet Isaiah, in the midst of his own persecutions for the faith, announces, "See, the Lord God is my help; who will prove me wrong?" (Is 50:9) The Lord is already committed to us. Are we ready to make the commitment to the Lord?

In Baptism, WE are united with Christ and His Church. As adults, it's necessary that WE don't just roll along with this commitment made often for US in OUR infancy but that WE make and maintain this commitment for OURselves. Jesus reminds US that believing in Him means taking up the cross with Him, and only then do WE rise with Him. He challenges US and stretches US to grow, develop, and evolve in the faith. Changing and merging are not easy. They mean moving beyond the familiar and the comfortable. Jesus couldn't just enjoy the happiness of the home in Nazareth or the beauty of the Resurrection. To get from the one to the other, He had to commit Himself to the Father even if that meant the Via Dolorosa and the Crucifixion. The Lord is asking US to see things with His eyes not OURS, to

commit OURselves to His promise not OUR plan. If WE are truly people of Jesus and people of His Church, then WE will walk His way with conviction and with trust in His guidance and protection. When WE make that kind of promise, then WE keep it.

God Bless The Cities of God!





GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

We need to get our bearings straight and properly lay life's cornerstone. Otherwise, the rest of our journey will be skewed, and our judgment clouded. We can recall Jesus' famous rebuke of Peter, "You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." Even he, as one of Jesus' closest friends struggles with understanding things and grasping the big picture. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin (1881-1955) a renowned and learned French Jesuit priest often has these words attributed to him: "We are not human beings having a spiritual experience. We are spiritual beings having a human experience." Whether they were actually from his lips, they certainly mimic his thought. These wise words orient us and capture the essence of who we really are.

Many people consider spirituality an option. It is no wonder that they come to this conclusion when they predominantly define themselves using human terms and concepts. Immersed in this world view, they struggle finding any semblance of God because God does not work according to human expectations! This is especially true when suffering and death enter life's picture. If we are only human beings having a spiritual experience, then we wrongly expect our spirituality to serve us as we desire. The human expectation is that my spiritual life is something that is useful in avoiding pain, hardship, and death, not something that gives the courage to live through it!

So, when we protest and get upset with God because our journey is becoming difficult, painful, treacherous, disappointing, and even pointing us toward death, Jesus rebukes us as he did Peter and gently reminds us how to see. It is God who inspires and opens hearts to see truth and beauty. In God, the true meaning of things is understood, and we receive a depth of insight and understanding that is not found following purely human paths. It is not our task to understand God, as God is beyond human understanding. Ours is the joyful privilege of simply resting in God's presence simply because God is God and we are who we are. As spiritual beings having an exciting and adventurous human experience, it is in our DNA to do so. Through prayer we can let go and let be. This is how we lose our lives but then save them.
