





Baptism for Infants: By appointment. Please call the Parish Office at least two months in advance. A Baptism class is required for parents. Please call the Parish Office to register.



FROM OUR ADMINISTRATOR

(One) God, for Ever and Ever

Since Ash Wednesday, as you've participated in Mass, did you notice that something was missing, or did you just think that the priest kept



for getting to say something? Maybe you couldn't point it out exactly, but perhaps something just didn't seem right. Don't worry, though. Even we who are priests have also felt as if something were limping. It all has to do with the Collect (or Opening Prayer). This Prayer has generally concluded, "One God, for ever and ever." However, the word "one" is not in the original Latin text but was inserted in the translation for the sake of clarity. Recently, a decision was made to revise the English translation to follow the Latin more accurately and remove the word "one", effective this past Ash Wednesday. Nonetheless, the fact is that God, by definition, is "one", and so there's no need to say it. Shouldn't that apply to US as well?

In this weekend's first Reading, from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter enters the house of the Gentile Cornelius and says to him, "In truth, I see that God shows no partiality." (Acts 10:34 God makes no distinction between Jew or Gentile, or anyone for that matter. We are all one in His heart. If God is going to bestow His Spirit on whomever He wills, can we revoke His decision or see that person as separate from us? In the Gospel of John this weekend, Jesus puts it very clearly, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain." (Jn 15:16) It's God's will that we be one in His name because His name is the unifying power of Love – "God is love." (1 Jn 4:8)

OUR upcoming merger is a sign of OUR unity in the one God, who is Love. It is God Himself calling US in this way to bear great fruit. On Tuesday, 27 April 2021, I met with Dr. Linda Ritzer from the diocesan Parish Services Office to review the final stages of the merger process, beginning 2 June 2021.

There are outlined a series of meetings and communications that will bring US to OUR merge date of 3 January 2022. A lot of this work will be through the assistance of the combined Pastoral Council of OUR three parishes. I continue to meet regularly with all of OUR staff members, the Finance Councils of the three parishes, a Super Temporalities Committee of the three parishes, and a Staffing Committee comprised of members from the three parishes. Through all of these meetings, the goal is simple: that WE become one in the love of God and that this oneness goes without saying. Since God is "one", then WE as His followers can be that way too. Since WE are made in the image of God, then OUR unity should be implicit in OUR merger. May the unity of the Trinity be the unity of The Cities of God!!

You are invited to join this group in prayer. If you would like to join in praying, then just start saying Hail Marys for these souls. Or if you prefer to say an Our Father that is also great. Some people pray all Hail Marys; some pray all rosaries; some prefer to use spontaneous prayer and count the number of minutes they pray. Each and all of these are wonderful.

A rosary is 60 prayers; or say 10 Hail Marys' in the shower; or 10 Hail Marys' while vacuuming; or 5 Hail Marys' while you go out to get the mail; or 15 Hail Marys' driving to pick up your groceries; or 2 Hail Marys' on a break at work; etc.

Your email will then be added to the distribution list and you will receive total updates every 10-14 days via BCC.

St. Ferdinand Parish 2019-20 Annual Report and Outlook

Dear Fellow Parishioners,

We wish to share with you our financial results for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2020.

First off we would like to thank you for your continued generosity. It is only with your help that St. Ferdinand is in a position to continue offering to each of our Parishioners the spiritual programs which you have been accustomed to each and every year. The pandemic has forced us to think of alternative methods in which to deliver those programs.

With the idea of alternative methods in mind, we would like to suggest that each family consider automating their donation process. The easiest way to donate to St. Ferdinand is through **Faith Direct** online giving program. It is simple and flexible; there are no costs for envelopes or checks. Please contact our parish office for details.

While this financial report only captures the first 4-5 months of the pandemic, both St. Ferdinand finances and spiritual programs continue to be adversely affected as a result. The parish realized an operating deficit of \$97,008, but a bottom line surplus of \$394,937, thanks in large part to your generosity in Parish Share and a Paycheck Protection Program loan through the Small Business Administration.

Excess Parish Share funds of \$514,736 were used to make up the shortfall in our regular parish income and were also used to fund several projects. Long overdue heating, ventilation and air conditioning controls were repaired/upgraded throughout our campus. A defective portion of the parking lot across from the Annex was renovated with French drains, new binder and asphalt overlay at a cost of \$38,000. Although the Church Alive Campaign officially ended as of 6/30/19, parishioners who have outstanding pledges were able to continue to make contributions totaling \$89,810 to the campaign. If you have an outstanding pledge and wish to make payments, please contact the parish office.

Our fundraisers have been a big part of our income sources. Our 2019 festival generated a record profit of \$132,420, which includes the festival raffle profit of approximately \$35,300. Our car raffle generated the second highest profit in its history - \$52,400. Even though we had an abbreviated Fish Fry season last year, the Kitchen Ministry was able to generate a profit of more than \$23,000. With those funds we were able to upgrade our facilities and make equipment purchases.

The parish also received approximately \$19,000 in compensation for the sale of "rights of way" to enable the Rochester Road expansion to be achieved. In addition to this compensation, the township and their construction partner agreed to replace a defective section of storm water drain on parish property and will also be extending and covering the culvert on the west side of our west entrance. Lighting of votive candles generated about \$12,000 in revenue last year.

St. Ferdinand continues to generously support both worthy Diocesan collections as well as our local chapter of St. Vincent de Paul. Of course, Fr. Rudy and his Mexico Mission have a special place in our parishioners' hearts! Last year, even though Fr. Rudy was unable to visit St. Ferdinand because of the pandemic, you continued to financially support Fr. Rudy's work. Altogether, parishioners donated more than \$110,000 to all non-parish collections!
