#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

#### THE MAGI IN OUR HEARTS

Some of the most memorable, if not the strongest, friendships are those we forge during our years of school. As we progress to each new level – from Kindergarten to grade school to high school and to college - we answer a yearning deep within ourselves, and along the way we find others with a similar desire. Our common interest and our common goal unites us and strengthens us to pursue even further, enjoying the companionship of other like-minded individuals. We spur each other on to do better and encourage each other through setbacks. As we graduate and move to the next level or to our chosen profession, we may leave behind these fellow travelers, but not the lessons learned or the ties of the heart. Our time together forever shapes our lives and our context, and if our paths do cross, we readily pick up where we left off, even though years and geography may separate us. Our common pursuit is a perpetual bond.

This weekend, Luke tells us the story of the Magi. The Gospel itself shares very few details concerning them, and so popular tradition fills in the rest. Were they kings, were they wise men, were they astrologers? Since they were intrigued by the appearance of a star, they may have been the latter, but our Reading from the Prophet Isaiah and the Responsorial Psalm speak of the arrival of kings. How many were they? Since they brought three categories of gifts - gold, frankincense, and myrrh - we generally ascribe their number to be three. While the Gospel says they came "from the east" (Lk 2:1) and following their visit to the child Jesus "they departed for their country", our first two Readings and the Responsorial Psalm all speak of multiple nations coming to believe and worship the Lord. We have even traditionally identified them as belonging to different ages, races, and ethnicities and given them specific names – Caspar (or Gaspar), Melchior, and Balthasar. Nonetheless, despite the lack of details, we know that different individuals were drawn together in their pursuit of "the newborn king of the Jews" (Lk 2:2). This yearning formed them as one in our collective memory as together they sought the Lord and even thwarted earthly pride and violence in the process. One can only imagine that this pilgrimage sealed their unity and inspired them to share this Good News with others.

Their story is OUR story as well. Each of OUR three parishes is drawn ever more deeply into the life and love of Jesus Christ. Along the way, WE encounter each other

as fellow journeyers. WE may each be from different communities having differing lifestyles and stewarding different resources, but these are the different gifts that WE bring to God as WE offer them to each other. Travelling along the way, WE grow in understanding OURselves and each other as WE recognize that OUR real mission is to encourage and support each other in the joys and sorrows of knowing the Lord and living the faith in a world that is often adverse to the Truth. It is this passage together in the pursuit of Christ that makes us who WE are meant to be as WE take this newfound revelation and experience back to the communities from which WE originated. At heart, WE are the Magi in faith, hope, and love seeking the Lord, growing together in the Lord, and sharing the Lord in OUR community with one another.

### LETTER FROM DEACON JEFF

January 2, 2022 | 9

#### A Brief (sort of) message from the (relatively) new kid on the block, Deacon Jeff

My assignment to The Cities of God Grouping became effective a bit over 6 months ago, and I wanted to take a minute to reflect on some observations and experiences I have had over this short time with all of you. Firstly, I want to say THANK YOU ALL for the universally warm welcome I have received at all three of our parish sites. Your faithfulness and Christian charity have been quite overwhelming. I recognize that this is especially true given that my arrival wasn't during one of the easiest times in the lives of our parishes. COVID was (and still is) raging, and we were (and still are) in the midst of our parish merger. Neither of these situations make the continuing practice of our faith any easier, and I can tell you that is as true for us clergy as it is for all of you.

As for the merger, having just come from a new parish that recently completed the merger process, I fully understand how painful and difficult this process can be. Those churches, although geographically and demographically similar, had vastly different worship styles and spiritualities. Nonetheless, 6 months after that process was complete, I was pleased to see how well things had turned out. In our grouping, I have generally been impressed with how well most of our parishioners are adapting, but I also recognize that the changes necessitated by this process are difficult and will take time. Nonetheless all mergers require change, and these changes do require sacrifice and are inevitable.

Change is never easy, change in clergy, Mass times, ministries, staff alignments, and even change in who is sitting in the pew next to us at Mass. Some people have chosen another parish altogether because they find the change associated with the merger to be too painful, and that's Okay. I don't know of anyone who finds the merger process to be fun or enjoyable. It's hard for the parishioners, it's hard for the staff, and it is especially hard for the clergy, even though we recognize the essential nature of completing this process. We have not sought this change, it was not our choice, and we take no pleasure from the changes necessitated by the merger process. However, we recognize the realities that there are far fewer Catholics in our diocese than there were even just 10 years ago, that there are far fewer resources available to our parishes than there were just even 10 years ago, and most importantly, there are far fewer priests to serve our churches than there were just 10 years ago, and that number continues to decline. Unfortunately, unlike COVID, there is no treatment for these realities and there is no vaccine to prevent them from continuing into the future.

However, also unlike COVID, we can control how we react to the pain and hardship caused by these changes. We can choose to react either positively or negatively: So. it is ultimately up to us whether we:

- 1. Accept the change, which is inevitable and necessary, and
- 2. Embrace it and effectuate the change;

- 1. Defiantly reject and work to oppose the merger process and
- 2. Possibly find ourselves outside the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church of God. What a horrible shame that would be for those poor souls.

I have observed, and you all need to know, that **some** people have chosen to take the negative path. Some of the letters and emails related to the merger that our clergy and staff regularly receive are cruel, unfounded, personally insulting and frankly uncatholic. I don't want to dwell on the negative, but I strongly believe I need to address a few matters in this regard.

- 1. **Dealing in and spreading "rumors"**. Many of the uncharitable correspondence we receive includes statements that "we have heard". By definition, that is gossip. The Catechism expressly condemns gossip as a sin. An excellent article on this point can be found at: https://aleteia.org/2015/01/16/the-sin-of-gossip/ For example, recent letters have included the following frankly silly claims people have "heard":
- a. The bishop is trying to drive people out of the church so he can sell the church properties to pay off lawsuits (he's not).
- b. When we say we have no "present intention" to close any churches, that is code that we actually have an intention to close a church in the future (we don't); and c. It is the clergy team's idea to do the merger, and it is not necessary (no, it's not our idea and yes, it is necessary).

These kinds of accusations are quite honestly "tin foil hat" stuff folks. Please don't take these kinds of statements seriously and for goodness sakes, please don't spread them.

- 2. **Attacks on a person's reputation.** Calling someone evil or attaching evil motive to their action is a direct attack on that person's reputation. Calumny and Detraction are serious sins. Calumny is making a claim not known to be true about someone, almost always with malicious intent—to damage their reputation. Detraction, on the other hand, is the telling of the truth about someone to a third party, regardless of intent, which damages the person's reputation. Please think twice before engaging in this kind of talk.
- 3. **Anonymous Letters.** Please know that we are interested in everyone's perspective, but we will not read any anonymous correspondence. Simply venting in an unsigned letter is not productive, nor is our reading of it.
- 4. **Responding to legitimate concerns**. God Bless our Priests, but frankly they simply have far too much on their plates to respond to each and every letter and email we receive regarding the merger. HOWEVER, we do want to make sure that everyone is well informed of merger matters. Accordingly, there will be future assemblies scheduled before the merger to which all parishioners are invited and encouraged to attend. Additionally, I (Deacon Jeff) have volunteered to try my best to respond to individual correspondence on all legitimate merger questions. Please feel free to contact us either at thecitiesofgod.org or by letter to the St. Ferdinand parish center.

The very word "catholic" means "universal" and as Catholics we all belong to the same universal church, whether we attend Mass at Holy Redeemer, St. Ferdinand, or St. Gregory. We are all blessed to be able to continue to regularly receive Jesus in the Eucharist, to worship, to pray, and to grow spiritually, even if not on the same campus, at the same times which we are used to, even if not with the same priests we are used to, even if not in the worship style we are used to. If we hope to continue to do so, we all need to think about "church", and our relation to it, in a "universal" way.

I love being assigned to this grouping, working with the clergy team, the staff, and the parishioners here, and I would just like to exhort us all to work through the pain associated with change, and to accept, embrace and effectuate these necessary changes. There was a prayer I saw recently that I want to share.

Be with us in our work of building the earthly city, - that in building we may not labor in vain. Look kindly on your children, Lord. Be part of the change God wants of us. Help us build the church that God wants us to be.

May God Bless all the parishioners of The Cities of God.



ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON

#### ST. ELIZABETH ANN SETON | JANUARY 4

The patron saint of Catholic schools, St. Elizabeth Ann Seton (August 28, 1774 – January 4, 1821) was born in New York City to a prominent family of the Episcopal faith. When she turned 19, she married a wealthy businessman with whom she had five children. He later died of tuberculosis in 1803, leaving her a young widow. After discovering the Catholic faith in Italy, where her husband had died, she returned to New York and converted to Catholicism in 1805.

After several years struggling as a single mother, Elizabeth moved in 1809 to Emmitsburg, Maryland, where she founded the Sisters of Charity of St. Joseph, the first community for religious women established in the United States. She also began St. Joseph's Academy and Free School, which started a chain reaction of Catholic-based education in the United States that continues today.

St. Elizabeth Ann Seton was canonized September 14, 1975 in St. Peter's Square by Pope Paul VI and was the first citizen born in the United States to be given the title of "saint."




