

#### FROM THE ADINISTATOR'S DESK

#### THE POWER OF A MOTHER'S LOVE

While the Christmas Season formally ended last Sunday with the Baptism of the Lord, I have to admit that I still have some of my Christmas decorations and cards on display throughout the rectory. Yes, I'm a little tardy in moving things along, but, for a variety of reasons, this year Christmas touched me very deeply. I just couldn't seem to have enough of the Nativity scene. I was mesmerized in particular by a card I received from my younger brother and his family. The picture on the front is entitled "Kissing the Face of God", and it depicts the young mother Mary tenderly holding the infant Jesus and sweetly kissing Him on the cheek. There is just something about Mary's love for Jesus that captures my imagination. Of course, any mother's love for her children is for me one of the more perfect signs of God's love on this side of eternity. Even though my own mother is gone over twenty years now, I still treasure her care and would do anything for it.

In our Gospel passage from St. John this weekend, Mary and Jesus are attending a joyful wedding celebration. In the midst of the festivities, a major social mistake occurs - the family runs out of wine. Mary presents this conundrum to Jesus, Who seems to balk at the suggestion that He might be able to do anything about it. Without missing a beat, Mary then turns to the waitstaff and confidently tells them to follow whatever directions Jesus might give them. Who among us could deny the request of such a mother, surely not Jesus. Jesus acts because He knows His mother is correct. Mary evokes from Jesus the need to do the most loving thing, to bring the presence of God to others. As St. Paul says to the Corinthians this weekend, "To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit." (1 Cor 12:7)

The Church is often referred to as OUR Mother. She gives US life and nourishes US through the Sacraments. She cares for OUR spiritual, and occasionally OUR temporal, needs. At the great wedding feast of the Kingdom that even now breaks into OUR world, she calls US all to share around the table. She acknowledges OUR needs and challenges US to care for the needs of each other. Would any of US dare to deny such a mother's request? OUR Mother, the Church, comes to US now sharing with US a serious deficiency that must be addressed. In OUR part of the banquet, WE are experiencing a noticeable decline in

resources – people, priests, finances. The life of the Church is at risk because of this. OUR Mother instructs US just to do whatever needs to be done. Jesus did the unimaginable at His Mother's request; perhaps WE are being asked to do the same by OUR Mother. Jesus, through the power of the Spirit, changed six jars of common water into choice wine. WE, through the power of the Spirit, can change three good parishes into one extraordinarily faith-filled parish. WE have to trust in the loving invitation of OUR Mother to make this happen. Those are powerful words. They worked for Jesus, and they can work for US.

God Bless The Cities of God!

P.S. As we move forward and make progress toward our merger in July, I am pleased to announce a major new development. With the bulk of our business operations gradually being housed at the St. Ferdinand office, we have partially repurposed our activities and office space at the St. Gregory office.

Effective this past Monday, 10 January 2022, the St. Gregory office has been converted primarily into the Parish Data and Information Center. Here we will be housing our safe environment activities and most of our electronic and paper records and recordkeeping. The conversion will be done on a rolling basis and so will take several months for full implementation. At the same time, the St. Gregory office is still open for in-person and telephone activity, with new hours of business – Monday through Friday 9:00 am to 2:00 pm. To staff this operation, we have hired two new employees:

- · Christine Kunz She is our full-time Safe Environment/Parish Database Coordinator.
- Phyllis Wirth She is our part-time Administrative Assistant to this office, with the flexibility to assist in any of our other offices as needed.

I would ask that you please pray for these new employees and for the ongoing work of On Mission in our parish merger. Thank you!



## UPDATED DIOCESE OF PITTBSURGH COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS FOR CLERGY, PARISHES AND INSTITUTIONS

In a continuing commitment to care for the health, safety, and spiritual well-being of the faithful, in the Diocese of Pittsburgh, Bishop David Zubik announces the following updated COVID-19 Safety Protocols. **These practices are effective January 7, 2022, and are to be continued until further notice.** The updates are based on the dramatic surge in community spread of the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus, and will be re-evaluated on an ongoing basis as more information from the CDC and local healthcare officials becomes available.

#### Effective immediately and until further notice:

- \*As leaders in their parishes and in the community, unless extraordinary circumstances warrant otherwise, all priests and deacons must wear masks during the celebration of Mass at all times, including when preaching and at the altar.
- \*All clergy must submit vaccination status and proof of vaccination to our Clergy Office no later than January 18, 2022. All clergy who have not yet received a COVID vaccination are reminded of the guidance of Pope Francis on the matter and of their role in the community and are strongly urged to receive a COVID vaccination.
- \*Everyone entrusted with the distribution of Holy Communion must wear a mask, and must also sanitize their hands immediately prior to distribution. Care must be taken not to directly touch the communicant, especially if distributing on the tongue. If contact is made, the person distributing Holy Communion must re-sanitize their hands before continuing.
- \*Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, servers, greeters, ushers, lectors and cantors, must wear a mask. In addition, faith formation leaders, catechists, and those who visit the sick or homebound must wear a mask
- \*Choir members are to be masked at all times.
- \*The presentation of the gifts is suspended until further notice.
- \*As already directed, the practice of shaking hands to offer the Sign of Peace is suspended until further notice.
- \*As also previously directed, those attending Mass are urgently encouraged to wear masks, regardless of vaccination status. Based on their age, health history, and family considerations, parishioners must make prudent decisions regarding getting vaccinated, wearing a mask, and staying home if not feeling well. As a reminder, anyone who is sick, feels they are at risk, or is a primary caregiver, as well as those who have serious anxiety about being part of a large group at this time are excused from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass (CCC #2181)
- \*It is strongly recommended that any parish events outside of Holy Mass are to either be cancelled, rescheduled, or be held virtually.
- \*It is strongly recommended that where possible, parish staff work remotely. Those who do need to work on site must wear masks when in common spaces. Also, all meetings should be held virtually.
- \*Livestream Mass options are to continue so that we may serve those who are not able to come to Mass in-person.

#### **Diocesan Events**

Events are to be held virtually or re-scheduled. Events that must be held should follow the above mitigation protocols.

#### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, "spring would lose its loveliness."
Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.
But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question.




