

# FROM THE ADMINISTATOR'S DESK

#### **READY... OR NOT**

Throughout the many years of school, I worked very hard to do as well as I could. I studied (some might even say obsessed) to take in as much as possible and to understand clearly. I enjoyed seeing new things and making connections between various disciplines. After all of those years were completed, I assumed that I had it all figured out. At that point, I guess it seemed to me that I was set and good to go for my remaining years. What a shock it was, then, to find out that my education had not taught me what I needed to know but had actually prepared me to discover what I needed to know. My education wasn't final with the last school bell, but that bell was a wake-up call to start me on the journey of life. Being in control of the present didn't mean being in control of the future. I wasn't ready in the sense of being finished but ready in the sense of being predisposed for more.

Our Scripture passages this weekend warn us against being over-confident or self-assured. We need to be careful where we place our trust. If we think we have it all or have it all figured out, we will surely fall prey to the shifting sands of reality. Our future has got to be more solid than what we can provide for ourselves. Through the prophet Jeremiah this weekend, the Lord chastises those who feel that the only thing necessary for a good life is good connections. Unfortunately, if we place our hope for the future merely on our own skills or on what we can convince others to provide for us, we are ultimately doomed to failure since all of us are broken and incomplete in some sense. Paul, speaking from a Christian mindset, takes this notion one step further and makes one of the more startling statements in the New Testament: "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are the most pitiable people of all." (1Cor 15:19) In other words, how sad it is if we believe that the words and deeds of Christ have only gained for us a certain amount of happiness during our limited years with nothing beyond that. That's why we hear from Jesus in Luke's Gospel showering His blessing on those who honestly work through the struggles of daily living

with an awareness that they will never have life fully worked out but that the more they submit to the will of God the more they will have the capacity to welcome the fruits of Christ's life, death, and resurrection in this life and in eternity.

WE are being overly simplistic if WE think that the merger of OUR three parishes is strictly a matter of following a process. If WE follow all of the steps laid out for US by the Diocese, everything will be nicely tied up and functioning smoothly by July of this year. Right? All the work WE've gone through since October of 2018 will not make US a parish come July. It has only prepared US, made US ready to become a parish. Once WE have a new name and begin to share everything, WE need to go beyond the logistics and focus on the faith, the faith necessary to build a family. WE need to see this as a family brought together not by a human plan but by a plan of God Himself. It is important that WE ready OURselves for what God has in store for US, and not only in OUR lifetimes, but for generations to come, as a steppingstone that leads all of US to eternity. WE can choose to focus only on the work WE must do for today, or WE can stretch OUR imaginations to allow the Good Lord to do through US what is necessary for attaining the Kingdom. WE will never be fully ready, but WE can choose to be prepared.

God Bless the Cities of God!

# GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

#### February 13, 2022 6th Sunday in Ordinary Time

What has been the most difficult challenge you faced in your life? Many difficult human experiences can "turn up the heat" in our lives, causing us to question the why of things or even fall into despair. Some people just somewhat passively accept what life brings, even death, and chalk difficult experiences up to happening "because they do." They seemingly endure and move on. Taking life at face value, there really is no ultimate meaning to things. It's easier to ignore that inner prompting calling us to understand why. It's there whether we admit it or not. To question or not to question — that is the question! People sometimes give up the God search because it causes too many questions. Once we open the door to the possibility of God's existence, then all of the awkward, challenging, and tragic pieces of life have to find their place.

It gets messy. But the search is so important to living. We can easily dry up and become arid, abandoning any hope for purpose and meaning because it's too difficult and non-rational at times. In searching for answers to the how and why of life, human beings also embark on a search for God. When one finally stumbles upon the real living tangible presence of God, then that discovery allows life's ironies and tensions to be held side by side with the all-encompassing totally unconditional, unmerited love of God! Then when life's heat gets turned up, difficulties and challenges abound, dryness and heartache become the norm, the soul remains in joyful repose. There is no fear.


The beatitudes celebrate life's ironies and tensions, holding them all together in the Kingdom of God. Poverty, hunger, weeping, being insulted and hated are not things we would normally associate with being God's friends. But they are! In fact, those who experience these uncomfortable realities of life are actually better off than those who do not. This is what makes Jesus' message so intriguing! Don't give up questioning. Questioning the apparent inequities and polarities of human experience will certainly challenge one's faith.
