

From Our Administrator

FROM THE ADMINISTATOR'S DESK

ANTICIPATION

My old Italian father used to tell me that anticipation is far greater than fulfillment...and it's true. Think about it for a moment. Say there's an item we would like to possess. We dream about it. We yearn for it. We research it. We compare it with comparable items and search out the best price. Ultimately, with the click of a button or a signature on a line, it's ours. Then, we track it and count down the number of days until it arrives. Finally, the day comes when it's in our possession. We enjoy it for a brief moment, and generally tend to go off anticipating the next new possession. It's a vicious cycle. There's a deep desire in our lives for something more – something hard to describe – that could possibly fulfill us, but it always seems to be beyond our grasp. And so we anticipate it over and over again.

This weekend we hear how Abram wants assurance that he will take possession of the Promised Land. The Lord does this in a way that only He can do - by showing up personally and making a covenant with Abram. Abram's anticipation is now no longer about a physical place but about the fulfillment of God's word, which is eternally fulfilling. In the Gospel, at the conclusion of the Transfiguration account, Moses and Elijah are taken up into the cloud, and Jesus is left standing alone. Moses and Elijah, the human symbols for the Law and the Prophets from the old order, fade out as their task of anticipating fulfillment is complete. Now Jesus stands alone as the completion of God's plan, with the Father formally stating, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." (Lk 9:35) Jesus, with all of the hope for eternal life that He brings, is all we need to look forward to. It is a hope that has an eternity of fulfillment. That's why Paul can tell the Philippians that we do not belong to this world with it's limited hopes and dreams that never seem to satisfy. Instead, "Our citizenship is in heaven." (Phil 3:20) The only thing worth anticipating is our heavenly union with the Lord in eternity when our deepest desires are fulfilled more and more beyond our wildest imaginations. This is what we ultimately anticipate...nothing else.

A parish is an earthly location where WE gather to celebrate OUR heavenly citizenship in Word and Sacrament – especially the Eucharist – in anticipation of Jesus' return to fulfill His promise to all of US of a land flowing with milk and honey. OUR anticipation helps to grow OUR unity, and OUR unity helps to fuel OUR anticipation. OUR Church, the physical presence of Christ's heavenly Body on earth, has asked us to grow in faith through a merger of OUR three parishes. While there is most definitely a considerable amount of work involved, WE should look at it in terms of anticipation rather than in

terms of drudgery. WE all yearn for OUR heavenly home, but WE also desire to see a piece of it more and more visibly in OUR present life. It takes work – work of the heart – to accept and cooperate with God's plan for US. And, by the way, it doesn't end with a merger on July 1. As humans, WE are incomplete without OUR fullest participation in OUR heavenly citizenship with the Lord. The more WE seek the Lord with and through each other, the more WE become fully human. St. Augustine, in his Confessions, reminds us, "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you." May every day be for US a day of joyful anticipation that knows no end! God Bless The Cities of God!

PS. As I mentioned in last week's bulletin, Pope Francis has invited the Universal Church to participate in and prepare for a synod "For a Synodal Church" to be held in 2023. This anticipates engagement at all levels of the Church. Bishop Zubik has asked each Parish/Grouping to conduct their own synodal session to provide insights that will go through the various levels of the Church, up to the Vatican. Our Grouping synodal session is scheduled for Tuesday, 29 March 2022, at St. Gregory School Gym beginning at 7:00 P.M. There are a couple of things you will need to do before attending the session:

c. Click on the item called "Grouping Synod Registration" and complete the registration process.

d. OR, Call any of our parish offices.





ST. PATRICK | MARCH 17

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.


