


FROM THE ADMINISTRATOR'S DESK

OUR IDENTITY

If someone asks us "Who are you?", how do we answer? Perhaps we give our first name to show our individuality or our last name to show connections and ties. Maybe we speak of our profession, our pastimes, or our accomplishments. We might be inclined to talk about our hometown or current neighborhood. However, we've danced around the question and come up with a less than satisfactory answer. At the heart of this is not so much what we express but what underlies what we express. "Who" we are is a lot about "Why" we are – what makes us tick, what is our underlying motivation or theme. This can only be discovered at the place where our life intersects with the source of all being and all purpose – God.

As we hear and participate in the reading of the Passion this weekend, we are given an opportunity to enter into the very heart of Christ, the very identity of Christ. His is a heart of service. At the Last Supper, Jesus boldly reveals Himself to his Apostles, "I am among you as the one who serves". (Lk 22:27) In the giving of the Eucharist, He admits that it is offered "for you". (Lk:22 19, 20) In his agony in the garden, Jesus hands over His life to His Father - "not my will but yours be done". (Lk 22:42) As He hangs upon the cross, the soldiers and one of the thieves challenge Jesus to come off the cross and save Himself; instead, He stays on the cross and saves us. (Lk 23:36-39) Jesus shows Himself to be the Suffering Servant prophesied by Isaiah – "The Lord God has given me...and I have not rebelled, have not turned back" (Is 50:4-5) and "The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced" (Is 50:7). In his letter to the Philippians, St. Paul beautifully sings the praises of Jesus' service: "He emptied himself, taking the form of a slave...he humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross". (Phil 2: 7-8) Time and again, we encounter Jesus as the one Who comes to serve the Father and all of us.

As Christians, fashioned after the image of Christ through Baptism, which WE will renew at Easter, WE need to reclaim OUR identity with Jesus as servants, servants of God and servants of one another. As WE

try to put the finishing touches on OUR merger, it's time for US to turn the words written on the printed page into words written on OUR hearts. Regardless of the name WE are given by Bishop Zubik, at the end of the day, WE will only be known by who WE are. Are WE servants of Christ? Are WE servants with Christ? Lent has been the time for US to ponder those important questions. Easter, with it's renewal of OUR Baptismal promises, will be the time for US to return to OUR source and recommit OURSELVES to answer those important questions. The merger will be the time for US to live out those important questions. Who are WE? WE are fashioned in the image of God for Christ-like service. WE are called to go beyond OUR physical, mental, and spiritual boundaries to serve and minister to one another. WE are made to be the Suffering Servant voice and a helping hand that builds bridges and freely gives. WE are to be channels of Christ, pure and simple. This is OUR identity, and WE are proud to profess it in Christ Jesus OUR Lord!



PARISH REGISTRATION

Question:

Why is it important that we register in a parish? Isn't it good enough that we go to Mass?

Answer:

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Many people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. At times, young adults who have moved away for years think they are still signed up under their parents. But membership requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social, and ministerial activities of your parish. Your registration affects the parish in many ways. Census numbers can determine how many priests are assigned to a church, what benefits and obligations the community has to the diocese, and how Masses, Confessions, and devotions are planned and scheduled. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining sponsor certificates, and getting donation statements for taxes. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish.

ADVISORY COUNCILS FOR THE NEW PARISH (FROM FR. PHILIP)

As we move to become ONE parish united in the ONE Body of Christ, we are now working to align our organizational and financial processes. Part of this effort entails the creation of one, unified Parish Finance Council and one, unified Parish Pastoral Council. Since Canon Law requires that we must have a new Finance Council in place when we become one new parish on July 1, plans are being developed for the selection of new Finance Council members. A new Parish Pastoral Council will be established after the merger, and details regarding that process will be provided at a later date.

A joint meeting was held on April 5th with existing Pastoral and Finance Council members to communicate my gratitude for the many years of service and dedication each has offered to their respective current parishes. I also explained the need for new advisory councils and reviewed the selection process and timeline for appointing members to a new Finance Council Committee. The existing Finance Councils will continue to work throughout the end of June with our Business Manager to assist in creating a budget for the new parish. Existing Finance Council members may reapply for the new Finance Council at their own discernment.

The work of the Finance Council is to aid and advise the Pastor in the areas of financial planning and budgeting, accounting and transparency of reporting, oversight of proper controls, and education on stewardship and fundraising/development activities. The Finance Council is composed of between 3 and 9 members appointed by the Pastor, who is the Presider of the council.

An information sheet will be included in the bulletin next week and also posted on The Cities of God website to provide additional details on the role and responsibilities of the council, key skill sets required, as well as the recruitment and selection process of new members. All registered parishioners are invited to consider whether they might have the gifts of leadership ministry of the Parish Finance Council. Please watch the bulletin and website for additional news and information regarding this process.

Let us pray for the wisdom and guidance of the Holy Spirit as we begin the process of forming our new Finance Council to help us discern and fulfill the mission and vision of our new parish.


LIVING ROSARY DURING HOLY WEEK AT ST. FERDINAND CHURCH ON MONDAY, APRIL 11



GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

April 10, 2022 Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

Pope St. John Paul II rightly taught, "To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says, even when it runs contrary to what others are saying. It means rejecting the lure of sin, however attractive it may be, in order to set out on a difficult path of Gospel virtues." Acceptance, rejection, suffering, betrayal, fear, reluctance, persecution, and painful, undeserved and unjust death are all played out in dramatic fashion today. Jesus spoke of God's unconditional love, mercy, and forgiveness. Who doesn't like hearing about love, especially God's? Jesus did not have backs turned on him, face intense suffering, and succumb to a horrific death because he spoke of God's love. All of those things occurred because of the implications of actually believing in God's love.

God's love comes with an intimate and equal bond with love of neighbor. This moves the believer outward to truly see their brothers and sisters as equals and compels them to work for a world that mirrors God's kingdom: a world based on justice, peace, mercy, and forgiveness. Sometimes, people want to keep God's love to themselves and use it solely for their own benefit. When they only want to use God's love to justify their own intentions and for their own projects, problems occur.

Sin makes something hurtful, destructive, and self-serving look very attractive and justifiable. The lure of sin creates friends who begin to believe the lie that the sin expounds. This is what happened on Calvary. When you begin actually doing what Jesus is saying and translate love into action, it inevitably will upset popular and longstanding conventions and structures. Many of these serve to protect status, foster personal gain and success, and further divide those who have from those who do not. Most people who hear the Gospel are attracted to what they hear, at first. When they realize that it means standing apart from popular opinion, even if that opinion is against the Gospel and sinful, they cower back in fear and join the throngs shouting, "Crucify him!" There is an ambivalence found in many believers as they struggle with whether their belief is strong enough "to set out on the difficult path of Gospel virtues."

It takes a lot of courage to admit that the system is broken. It takes even more courage to point out the sin. And it takes an unbreakable love of God to then accept the consequences of doing so.







Children Art & Reflection 16 | April 10, 2022





ST. BERNADETTE SOUBIROUS | APRIL 16

At the age of 14 St. Bernadette (1844-1879) was living in abject poverty with her family in a one-room basement which had previously been used as a jail, in the town of Lourdes in southern France. She was a sickly child, having fallen victim to Cholera in 1854 and would battle asthma and tuberculosis for the rest of her short life. Bernadette was illiterate and is characterized in many accounts as slow or ignorant. It was in her 14th year that Bernadette was granted 18 visions of a 'Lady' at a grotto in Massabielle. The Lady instructed Bernadette to come daily to the grotto to receive the visions, eventually proclaiming 'I am the Immaculate Conception'. A spring at the grotto, which appeared where Bernadette was instructed to dig, has been a site of miraculous healing. The Lady also asked that a chapel be built in the grotto for pilgrims. Today the Marian shrine at Lourdes is one of the world's most popular. During and following the period of visions, the saint was examined rigorously by Church and local authorities. The popular excitement around the visions left her subject to persistent questioning and attention. Eventually she sought protection by retiring to a home for the poor in a nunnery. She took her vows in 1866 with the Sisters of Charity at Nevers. She worked as an infirmary assistant, and later a sacristan, but by the end of her life she was too sick to participate in convent life. She died at the age of 35, humble and penitent until the end.
