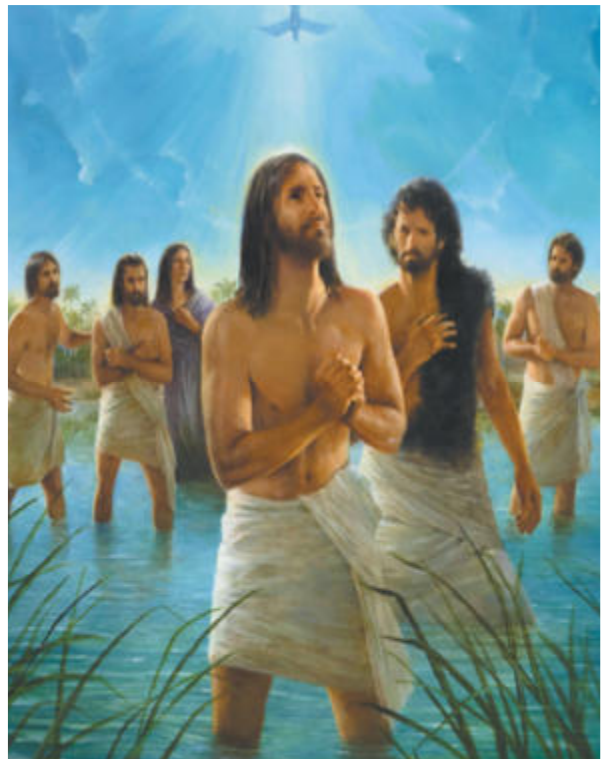

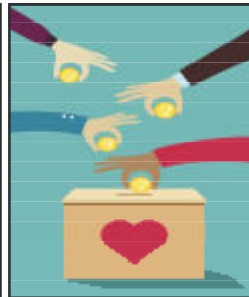

Feast – Baptism of the Lord

Last weekend the Church celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord. This celebration, which recalls the arrival of the three Magi, is the first public manifestation of the new-born Jesus – and to the Gentile world. This weekend the Church is commemorating the Baptism of the Lord in the Jordan by His cousin – John the Baptist. This, too, is a public manifestation or another Epiphany of the Lord. What's different about this revelation of Jesus from last week's is, at His Baptism, we have the first public revelation of all Three Persons in the Holy Trinity, as well as the official revelation of Jesus as the Son of God to the world by the Father. Thus, it is described by all four Gospels as the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.

When did Jesus know Who He really was? We can assume that He grew into that knowledge. As He grew from being a little boy to a man, He came to understand Who He was and the saving mission that His Father had sent Him to accomplish.

This is confirmed in the signs that occurred after Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River. The Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus like a dove and a voice from the heavens was heard saying: *"You are My Beloved Son with Whom I am well pleased."* After His baptism and the forty days that He spent fasting and praying in the desert, Jesus began His public ministry. He began teaching and doing the things necessary to reveal the depths of the Father's love for us, to reveal the Father's plan of salvation, to teach us how to live in order to enter eternal life. Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection would win our salvation and open the way to eternal life. When Jesus began this mission, He did so in firm resolve, with one hundred percent commitment, and in perfect fidelity to the will of His Father.

Similarly, for us to be successful in any endeavor, commitment is essential. Nothing of lasting value happens without commitment. And Commitment is not easy. Our culture sends us many differing messages that work against keeping our commitments.

The Baptism of Jesus should remind us of our own Baptism and the identity we received with that Baptism. We, like Jesus, are also children of the Father. And as with Jesus, the Father is also well-pleased with each of us. That should feel us with a certain sense of pride that we are considered so special by God. With that comes the promise that we, along with the Son, are heirs to the Kingdom and temples of the Holy Spirit. Unfortunately, not everyone knows of that specialness we have with God.

A story is told of a tiger cub that finds its identity. It's an old Hindu parable about a tiger cub being raised by goats. The cub learned to bleat and nibble grass and behave like a goat. One night a larger tiger attacked the goats, which scattered for their safety. But the tiger cub kept grazing and crying like a goat without getting frightened. The old tiger roared: "What are you doing here, living with these cowardly goats?" He grabbed the cub by the scruff, dragged him to a pond and said: "Look how our faces are reflected in water!

Now you know who you are and whose you are." The tiger took the cub home, taught him how to catch animals, eat their meat, roar and act like a tiger. The tiger cub thus discovered his true self. Today's celebration with its Gospel seems to suggest that Jesus received from Heaven a fresh flash of realization of Who, and Whose, He really was (His identity), and of what He was supposed to do (His mission), on the day of His Baptism in the river Jordan.

Journey back to your own Baptism. Open your ears. Hopefully you will hear the voice of God saying: "You are My beloved child. On you My Favor rests. And I will love you no matter what. God's love and mercy enable us to commit ourselves to living as a disciple of Jesus, and His love and mercy give us the grace and strength we need to live out this call of discipleship.

Every time we enter or leave a Catholic Church we have the opportunity to renew our own Baptism. As we dip our fingers into the Holy Water font, we are reminding ourselves of our own Baptism. As we make the sign of the cross on ourselves with this Holy Water we should be thinking of the fact that we are a child of God, that we have been redeemed by the Cross of Christ, that we have been made a member of God's family, and that we have been washed, forgiven, cleansed and purified at a tremendous price – by the Blood of the Lamb of God. Every time we bless ourselves with this Holy Water we should remind ourselves how special we are in the sight of God.

Let us pray for the Conversion of the World and for peace.

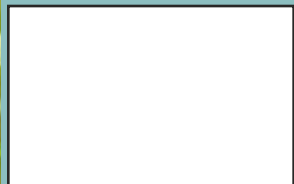
