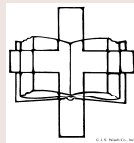

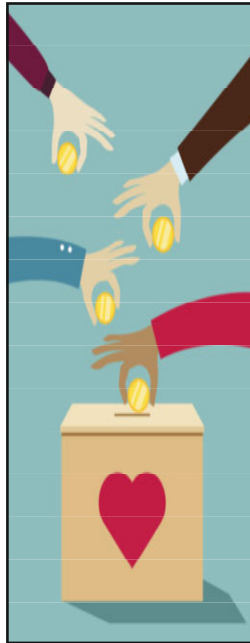

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's selections from Sacred Scripture tell us about the tender compassion of our God. And – in a sense – it is another Epiphany, in that the glory of Who Jesus is, is revealed at the wedding. In the first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, we hear language that is tender, passionate and definitive. The Lord says to the people of Israel – and to us – that we will not be called “forsaken.” Our land will not be called “desolate.” Rather, the Lord wants to call us “delightful” and “loved.”

The wedding celebration at Cana conveys an important truth about God's desire to be one with His people in a *new covenantal relationship*.

This was not a new message. The prophets had looked forward to a time when the Lord would pour out His Spirit upon humankind and write His law of Love upon their hearts. The prophet Isaiah in our first reading for this weekend describes how the Lord will “Wed” His faithful people, “like a young man marrying a virgin.” People did not expect such an event until the end of time, so it came as a surprise when Jesus announced that the reign of God was already arriving. It came as even more of a surprise that those invited to God's “wedding banquet” should include the kind of people not normally regarded as religious.

Those who were poor in Jesus' day did not expect to be so blessed. Many struggled to observe the law and felt cut off from the nation's worship life. A growing obsession with ritual washing left many commoners feeling “unclean.” When Mary observed that the wine had run out, it is as though she were lamenting a faith whose joy had run dry. She knew that faith is not about rules but about relationships. A relationship between us and God. A relationship between us and one another. A relationship built on unconditional LOVE. We hear how Mary longed for Jesus to reveal Himself and for lowly people to experience a return of hope. God had arrived among them.

The wedding at Cana is a kind of parable, showing how God longs to relate to us, not in harsh or exacting judgment, but in tender, faithful love. In the presence of Jesus those huge stone ceremonial vessels containing water for purifying began instead to overflow with wine for rejoicing. The new wine made by Jesus signifies the “new rich wine” of the Gospel and it points to the “wine of the New Covenant” and the “Bread of Life” which Jesus provides for his disciples in the Lord's Supper or Eucharist. The *wine* that Jesus had to offer; i.e., His words and works, was far superior to any other teaching or wisdom. His words and works are the fulfillment of what The Law was supposed to be all about – God's goodness to His people. LOVE. This first sign is the manifestation of the grace and truth that has come through Jesus Christ (Jn. 1:17), and serves as a summons to us all to join in the celebration. It also points to the Messianic banquet; which Jesus will provide at the end of the age when He comes again in glory.

The same change takes place within the believer's heart: The “best wine” has been saved until now, as the steward of the feast said; it has been saved for us.

Mary longs for us to see Christ's glory in our midst and for us to put our whole trust in Jesus. “Do whatever He tells you,” she says to us, just as she said at Cana. This is our chance to begin again, to accept Jesus' forgiveness and healing, and to allow God's Spirit to fill our hearts. Jesus did not say to the servants at Cana, “Store that good wine until the end of time.” He said, “Draw some out now.”

AND - Let us appreciate the miracle of the Real Presence of the Lord on the altar. The same Jesus, who transformed water into wine at Cana, transforms our gifts of bread and wine into his own Body and Blood in order to give us spiritual nourishment. If our families have lost the savor of mutual love, let us renew them at the altar with the invigorating power of the Holy Spirit.

Let us pray for the Conversion of the World and for peace.

Diocese of Greensburg Begins Listening Process for Synod on Synodality

The Diocese of Greensburg announces that the initial process of listening to the faith community as part of Pope Francis call for a "Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission" will begin. A Mass was celebrated by Bishop Kulick, JCL, on October 17, 2021, to solemnly open the Synod in the Diocese; the solemn opening took place in Rome on October 9 and 10 and will conclude in the Vatican in 2023 with the assembly of bishops around the world.

In April, 2021, Pope Francis initiated a synodal journey, a gathering of clergy and laity, to take place in individual Dioceses in 2022. This "Synod of Synodality" is intended to inspire the faithful to dream about the Church we are called to be, to make peoples hope flourish, to learn from one another, to enlighten minds, warm hearts and restore the strength through our common mission. The "Synod" calls for the work to begin at the Diocesan level by listening to the faithful by sharing this journey together. The Holy Father stressed that he wants to hear from everybody. It is very important that parishioners take advantage of the many ways to participate.

Next weekend, January 22 & 23, will be "Survey Sunday" across the Diocese. Parishioners will be asked to complete a short survey that will be included in the bulletin. Parishioners may also be able to take this survey online at www.dioceseofgreensburg.org/synod.

Beginning in February, Bishop Kulick is inviting the members of the community, including young people, to join him and participate in one of the seven Town Hall Listening Sessions in the Diocese of Greensburg or at one of the three online E-Synod meetings scheduled. The Town Hall Listening Sessions are not exclusively for members of the parish where they are being held. Parishioners and members of the community are invited to join Bishop Kulick at any of them, no matter the location. Each will begin with a short prayer service then move into small group break-out sessions in the social hall of each Parish.

Please look for the survey in the bulletin next weekend and a listing of the churches where the Town Hall Listening Sessions will be held.

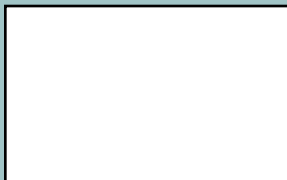
