For a Catholic to be a sponsor for the Sacraments of Baptism or Confirmation, one must be a practicing Catholic regularly attending Sunday Mass and receiving the Sacraments, a registered member of the Parish receiving contribution envelopes to support the Parish for a minimum of four months. 3rd Sunday Ordinary Time

Each one of us has experienced inviting or being invited - for example, to a wedding or birthday party. Some of us have also experienced inviting or being invited to join a group or activity. Our approach to inviting someone or responding to an invitation may vary. In today's Gospel, Jesus talks about inviting or calling His first FOUR DISCIPLES. He said to the first two brothers, Simon and Andrew, "Come, follow me, and I will teach you how to fish for people." We understand that our Lord Jesus wants help from others in spreading His message: "The time has come, the Kingdom of God is near! So, turn away from your sins and believe in the Good

News."

The question is: Why did Jesus' invite and ask for help in proclaiming the Kingdom of God? We can understand this if we look closely at the whole Gospel of St. Mark. In today's Gospel, it is mentioned that when John the Baptist was arrested, Jesus began to proclaim the Good News of then He called the first disciples God. What is the connection between John's arrest and the calling of the apostles? We know that John's life revealed what would also happen to Jesus. John was arrested and killed, and the same fate awaited Jesus (although it happened differently and on another occasion). John is like a preview or foreshadowing of what will happen to Jesus. Jesus knew this, and it was about to happen (when John was arrested). That's why He called people (the disciples) to continue His work or mission when He is no longer physically present. He called them to (1) continue His mission when He is gone and (2) keep His message about the Kingdom of God alive.

There are two elements we can learn from the Lord's call.

The first element: The call to follow the Lord is a call to transformation. The message "The Kingdom of God is near, so repent and believe in the Good News" is primarily for those who are being called, like the four disciples. Jesus calls His disciples to have a deep change of heart and mind before they can work with Him. The image of casting and mending nets symbolizes the disciples' concern about their source of income. Leaving their nets or even leaving their father doesn't mean rejecting their means of livelihood, but rather being willing to prioritize and commit themselves to spreading the Kingdom the mission of The second element: we are asked to be missionaries to others. Jesus invites us to join Him in proclaiming the Kingdom of God because He wants us to share His mission and message with as many people as possible. He wants others to experience the love, mercy, and salvation that God offers. By inviting others to be part of His mission, Jesus shows that He values teamwork and wants to involve His followers in the important work of spreading the Good News. Jesus invites and asks for help in proclaiming the Kingdom of God because He wants to transform the hearts and minds of His followers and involve them in sharing His message with others. This shows His love, inclusivity, and desire for all people to know and experience God's love. Let us regularly assess our response to God's calling of following Him, by faithfully checking our inner transformation and our sense of mission. If we do have these, let us ask God's grace to become consistent and constant. Amen.

Every Friday before the 8:00am Mass, please join us for the Exposition and Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Exposition is from 7:00am until 8:00am.


