Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord

Reading I **Acts 1:1-11**

In the first book, Theophilus, I dealt with all that Jesus did and taught until the day he was taken up, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. He presented himself alive to them by many proofs after he had suffered, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God. While meeting with them, he enjoined them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for “the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy spirit.” When they had gathered together they asked him, “Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?” He answered them, “It is not for you to know the times or seasons that the Father has established by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.” When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, “Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky? This Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven will return in the same way as you have seen him going into heaven.”

Hi Everyone,

Normally when I see an article this long I skim through it, or skip it all together. So please, if you have the time, take a gander.

My name is Joe Costello, but I usually go by Big Joe, Big Guy, or "Hey You"... it all usually gets my attention. As of June 1<sup>st</sup> I will be taking over youth ministry from Brandon. He and I have been working side by side these past few weeks, as he gets me up to speed on all that he has done. Brandon has certainly worked hard, and we pray for him and wish him the absolute best as he continues on in his ministry.

So, to get a few FAQ's out of the way, which you'll understand better when you meet me... Yes, I played football in high school, no I never played in college (because Borromeo Seminary didn't have a football team), yes I'm a little over 6'4, no the Browns have never offered me a position, yes I used to be a bouncer (extra cash in college just for being big was a great thing!), no I have never wrestled (though Andre the Giant is my personal hero - *if you don't get that reference ask your dad*), yes running into me feels like hitting a brick wall, and no I'm not as intimidating as I might look.

Joking aside, I'm very excited to be joining this community and wanted to give you a little background on myself. I was born and raised in Euclid, the oldest of five, attended VASJ, spent some time at Borromeo Seminary, but ultimately graduated from CSU. I still live on the east side, pretty close to most of my family. I have spent twelve years in youth ministry, the last four at Our Lady of Mount Carmel (OLMC) in Wickliffe, and the eight prior with a national Catholic organization named Families in Christ Jesus Community (FCJC). While with FCJC I also worked in social services for five years, primarily with the homeless population in downtown Cleveland. I have a great love and respect for our homeless and low income communities, and believe strongly in integrating service within parish youth programming.

Truth be told I loved my time at OLMC. While there I started a youth program from scratch, which upon my departure was reaching nearly one-hundred junior high and high school students per week. We grew by leaps and bounds, even during the pandemic, and it was set to expand even further as Covid waned. But, as the old saying goes, "If you want to make God laugh, tell him your plans." The pandemic has affected us all, and OLMC was no exception; the youth program was halted and I was laid off mid-November, 2020. The last few months have been filled with a lot of prayer and trusting that God would place me where I needed to be, and so I've landed here! I can't tell you how excited I am to have joined such a growing and vibrant parish, with a pastor who has a true love for youth ministry and a willingness to support it!

I look forward to meeting all of you and learning the ins and outs of this wonderful community. A great parish has a number of moving parts, youth ministry being one of the many. If you are a member/coordinator of any of the other ministries or programs within St. Luke's, I would especially love the opportunity to have a conversation with you. Sometimes youth ministry can be an island unto itself, but I think it is incredibly important for our teens to be fully engaged and connected within the parish, and I would welcome any opportunities to make that happen as our ministries slowly come back to life this year.

Lastly, schedules and plans going forward will be forthcoming as I begin to meet with our current youth group attendees and determine our best path forward. Be on the lookout for more info!




