When the time for Pentecost was fulfilled, they were all in one place together. I've always liked writing bulletin articles. Sometimes they're a page or two on the same subject, other times it can be a lot of info on the youth group, and sometimes it's a few quick disjointed thoughts on very different things. Today is the latter.

I owe an apology, although quite tongue-in-cheek, to Fr. Kevin and our 9:00am Mass goes last weekend. Apparently during my introduction, without even realizing it, I took it upon myself to rename Fr. Kevin, Fr. John. We all had a good laugh after, about what a "great" first impression that must have been! I have no clue where that name came from, except that my own pastor at my home parish is another Fr. John. Of course this is just some good hearted fun, but it did make me reflect on the small ways we're called to remain humble. It's been great so far being the new youth minister, and I've had a lot of fun getting to know the parish, the staff, the youth, volunteers, and all of our parishioners, but God used that small slip of the tongue to remind me that it's not about me in the slightest. Everything we do is for Him, and man do I need that reminder a lot! So a simple question... In what small way has God spoken to you this week?

On a very different note... I love Pentecost! The Church considers the day to be one of the biggest celebrations of the year, but since we don't wrap presents, color eggs, or decorate for it, the celebration passes by without much notice. I wonder sometimes if the lack of fanfare boils down to us just not being able to fully understand the Holy Spirit. We've learned about God the Father our entire lives, Jesus literally became one of us, but the Holy Spirit seems so much less tangible. Of course we all learned about the seven gifts, twelve charisms, tongues of fire descending upon the disciples, and maybe we even cut out and decorated a dove in grade school religion class, but I can tell you from personal experience (myself and thousands of teens over the years) that God wants so much more. He meant for those spiritual gifts we received at Baptism and reaffirmed at Confirmation to be active parts of our daily lives. There's so much the Spirit has to offer us, if only we're open to saying yes to what it has to give.




