

## UNDER THE PATRONAGE OF ST. JOHN HENRY NEWMAN



St. John Henry Newman, the 19th-century's most important English-speaking Catholic theologian, spent the first half of his life as an Anglican and the second half as a Roman Catholic. He was a priest, popular preacher, writer, and eminent theologian in both churches....When Newman was named a cardinal in 1879, he took as his motto "Cor ad cor loquitur"—"Heart speaks to heart." Three years after Newman died, a Newman Club for Catholic students began at the University of Pennsylvania in Philadelphia. In time, his name was linked to ministry centers at many public and private colleges and universities in the United States. His feast day is celebrated on October 9.

## From the Pastor's Desk

The month of January is devoted to the Holy Name of Jesus (the memorial of the Holy Name was on January 3<sup>rd</sup>). We so often forget about the power of invoking our Lord's name when in need (this is different from taking His name "in vain," which of course sins against the 2<sup>nd</sup> Commandment). Our society puts their trust in almost anything and everything other than the name of Jesus.

Our modern world is constantly on social media, whether it be Facebook, Instagram, or any other media platform. I find it disheartening that our country is becoming more and more divided over politics. This is seen in the amount of anger that is expressed over social media and news outlets. No longer are we able to have conversations about differences, but instead, the opposing side is immediately shut down or "unfriended." Many people clearly have put their trust in their political or world views and not in the name of Christ.

So where am I going with this? Well, I do think we could be at a turning point in our nation's history. Yet we, as Catholics, should be lights shining in the world. We are to be radiant lights as we stand beside Christ, the great Light, bathed in the glory of Him who is the light of heaven. In other words, we are not to let ourselves be caught up in this political antagonism, hatred, and malicious anger. Our hope should be in the name of Jesus, for through that name only can we find salvation.

Our allegiance is to Christ and His Church. Christ promised us that he would be present in His Church down through the ages. "I am with you always, until the end of the ages," our Lord told the first bishops, the Apostles. If by nothing else, we can see His presence in the Church simply by the fact that she has not fallen apart down through the ages, despite sin and scandal being present in her members.

If we remain true to Christ and His Church, we will not let hatred for our brother or sister of the opposite political view creep into our hearts. Further, if we have a relationship with Christ, we will desire peace and not division. Though we might have strong disagreements with others, we will still see the dignity of every human person, especially the one with whom we disagree. Further, if we align ourselves with Christ, we will align our views to Him and His Church because only in the Catholic Church is the fullness of truth found.

There are copious numbers of saints who lived during periods of unrest. Yet they shone like the stars to those around them because of their faith in Christ. They did not lose hope in humanity, nor did they lose hope in their God. They put their trust in His name alone. We must do the same. We must be shining beacons of holiness to those we encounter. Our relationship with Christ must come first in our lives. Otherwise, we will only be more and more disappointed with how unsatisfying this life is. We will also make other things our god – particularly our political views. Yet,

if we are rooted in Christ, we will not be bogged down by the depravity of this world, because we will know that we were created for another world.

I want to close with a quote from the late Jesuit theologian, Fr. John Hardon: "There is no other solution for the crisis of our age than for holy people to be channels of grace to a world that is starving for divine truth and dying out of thirst for the love of God...Ordinary bishops, ordinary priests, ordinary religious, ordinary fathers and mothers, ordinary Catholics will not even survive the massive revolution through which the Church is going in our day. We need heroic Catholics, sanctified by the Holy Spirit, to restore even sanity in the modern world."

Let us be those shining lights to those around us.



### Holiness and Happenings

This week marks the beginning of a new semester, a new bulletin, and a new project that I am incredibly pleased to announce to all of you. As of this week, we are in the process of renovating half of the chapel library back into a chapel to increase the amount of Adoration found here at St. John University Parish.

One of my first questions for Father Brian, when I came down to Morgantown, was where the closest Adoration chapel was. He informed me that the closest chapel for Adoration of our Lord was roughly 45 minutes away from Morgantown. I was surprised as I come from an area that is very blessed to have an Adoration chapel only ten minutes away from where I used to live. And thus, my goal was to work to increase the opportunity for Adoration and the Fruits that are associated with such a wonderful Catholic Tradition. When I was still learning my way around St. John's, I found myself in love with the space in the chapel library; that was when I realized that we could easily spruce up the space and maintain both a fully stocked library and study space, while also making a beautiful space to give to people to pray.

And so, I present the name of our project, St. Philomena Adoration Chapel. The space will be marked by a newly refurbished Altar and enough space for our students to both pray and study. The entire space is being freshened up with a fresh coat of paint, complete organization of the wonderful collection of our books, and a study nook.

The dedication of the chapel to St. Philomena fits in line with the mission of the Newman Center, as she is the patron saint of the youth. On top of her patronage being youth, she was also a special saint to one St. John Vianney, the patron saint of parish priests and confessors. And so, we seek her patronage to aid our mission of sanctification for our parishioners and students.

Adoration itself is an old Tradition, with one of the earliest references to it being from St. Basil in the mid-300s. Adoration is the practice of devotion to the Real Presence of our Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. For the faithful, Adoration serves as time for a personal relationship with our Lord and it gives the faithful the ability to increase their piety and Faith. Also attributed to Adoration is the faithful discernment of one's vocation. Where our Lord is, so are vocations, especially to that of the Sacred Priesthood.

In short, I pray that this new project leads to an increase in the Works of the Lord in our Parish. Please pray for those that are aiding in this project and, when St. Philomena Adoration Chapel is finished, I hope to see you there!

## UNDERSTANDING OUR CATHOLIC FAITH

**Catholic Traditions and Treasure by Dr. Helen Hoffner**  
Ordinary Time

Although every day has its special moments, the Catholic Church designates two periods each year as Ordinary Time. The first starts after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (usually celebrated in early January) and ends on the day before Ash Wednesday. The second period of Ordinary Times begins on the Monday after Pentecost Sunday (the last day of the Easter Season) and ends on the Saturday before the first Sunday of Advent (in late November or early December). It is called Ordinary Time because the weeks are ordered, or numbered.

Ordinary Time is a time for Catholics to grow in faith as they reflect on Christ's life, miracles, and teachings in the light of the Resurrection. (p. 22)

### 1. What is the plan of God for man?

God, infinitely perfect and blessed in himself, in a plan of sheer goodness freely created man to make him share in his own blessed life. In the fullness of time, God the Father sent his Son as the Redeemer and Savior of mankind, fallen into sin, thus calling all into his Church and, through the word of the Holy Spirit, making them adopted children and heirs of his eternal happiness.

### 2. Why does man have a desire for God?

God himself, in creating man in his own image, has written upon his heart the desire to see him. Even if this desire is often ignored, God never ceases to draw man to himself because only in God will he find and live the fullness of truth and happiness for which he never stops searching. By nature and by vocation, therefore, man is a religious being, capable of entering into communion with God. This intimate and vital bond with God confers on man his fundamental dignity.


January 17. Saint Anthony was a solitary ascetic who practiced great mortification yet drew many people to himself. He responded by founding an early form of monastic life. He lived until age 105.

January 18. Like many people, Saint Charles of Sezze thought he knew what God wanted, only to find out that he was mistaken. Instead of going to India as a missionary, Saint Charles settled in Rome where he cooked and cared for the friary and friary chapel. While being simple, Saint Charles was no simpleton as is obvious from his life story.



January 19. Be careful of birds landing on your head. That happened to Saint Fabian, and it was taken as a sign that he should be elected pope. So he was. And he served for 14 years until he was martyred in 250.

January 20. In art, Saint Sebastian is often depicted as standing near or strapped to a pole riddled with arrows. Indeed, he was executed by archers, but didn't actually die. Later he was beaten to death with clubs. Little else is known about this third century martyr.



January 21. Like other young martyrs, the death of Saint Agnes reminds us that length of years is not a requirement for a holy life. Little is known about Saint Agnes other than that she was a martyr.

January 22. Very little is known about Saint Vincent of Zaragoza other than some details about his martyrdom. We know that he was a deacon and that a large devoted following survived his death. Most of what we know comes from the "Acts" of Prudentius.



January 23. Born in Germany, Saint Marianne Cope's family soon moved to Utica, NY. In 1862 she entered the Sisters of the Third Order of Saint Francis where she served as superior for a number of years. In 1883, Saint Marianne went to Hawaii where she, and other members of her community, cared for women and girls with leprosy.


## FAITH FORMATION CORNER


